

From Father Steve's Desk

Scripture Reflection for Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

The passage from the Gospel of Luke presents the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. He is enabled by the Holy Spirit to undertake his mission of revealing to all people God's desire to be known and loved.

At a synagogue service Jesus stood up to do the reading. He read from Isaiah, "The spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord." Jesus is saying that what Isaiah spoke of is fulfilled in him. Jesus is truly our hope. The entirety of his public life will be marked by proclaiming God's mercy and compassion.

Are you interested in sponsoring an Afghan family? For the first time, the U.S. Department of State is allowing private citizens to sponsor and resettle refugees through a newly developed program called *The Sponsor Circle Program for Afghans*. This new community-led resettlement initiative enables everyday Americans to take on the responsibility of welcoming Afghan newcomers to their communities. Over 74,000 Afghans have been evacuated to the US since August 2021. Many of these individuals are currently at US military bases as they wait to be resettled into welcoming communities across the country. Nonprofit refugee resettlement agencies have done an amazing job resettling Afghan families, but they are maxed out.
