

Fr. Glenn's Pen

There are various options for today's readings. I have chosen to reflect on the 40th Chapter of Isaiah. Paul's letter to Titus and in Year C we focus on Luke's gospel for the year. We are celebrating the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This marks the transition from the Christmas season to Ordinary time. Ordinary does not mean "ordinary" in the common usage but simply implies the time in the Church year when we simply count the Sundays in "order" which has at least in some sense "following the normal course".

Isaiah is helping the people encounter God's plan for His people and His City Jerusalem. The Hebrew roots of this city are telling, many will simply suggest it literally means City of Peace. More literally it seems to imply "the flow or pointer", yeru, and "to completeness", shalayim. Isaiah boldly proclaims that Jerusalem's service is at an end, that her guilt is expiated and that she has received double for her sins. This is fulfilled in Christ. Jesus paid the price. John was the voice crying out in the wilderness and he prepared the way for Jesus to come into the world and save us. Jesus gathers us in, if we listen to our shepherd's voice. God's Holy City has a new role, it is now built from living stones and is manifest in the Mystical Body of Christ.

The Psalmist invites us to give glory and praise to God and to acknowledge God's greatness. We are called to put our total trust in God and His love and care for us. The ultimate destiny for all those who place their trust in God is heaven. We need to believe this if we are ever to make sense of the suffering that some are called to endure. These sufferings can be profound, maybe a loss of a loved one, or a cancer diagnosis, or a loss of a child! This list goes on! Without faith such trials often lead to despair. But faith in all that is true, good and beautiful will lead us to a supernatural endurance of the challenges in life.

Our core beliefs, I mean those things that we really believe, are manifest in our actions. If we believe a certain food will cause an allergic reaction, we will not eat that food. If we could see clearly how much sin damages us we would not do it. Fortunately God is very patient with our limited insight. When we begin to grasp the depth of God's love for us, we change! We strive for holiness and this is merely an expression of our gratitude to God for what God has done for us. Sadly many do not know what they do not know! The mass obligation stems from this understanding, we are called to say thanks to God!

Let us beg the Lord that we may respond to the grace God gives us through baptism and the other sacraments we receive. As we allow this grace into our hearts we not only will be on a journey of transformation, but those around us will be affected too! The Church is not here to change the world, for it is passing away, but rather to change us so that until our sun goes supernova, we will make it a better place to reveal God's love for us and His creation.


