

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



All over the world, this is a special weekend for the Catholic Church. We are celebrating **Laetare Sunday**. The weekend's celebration takes its name from the Latin

chant that normally would be sung at the beginning of the Mass (called "the introit"). It begins "*Laetare Jerusalem!*" which is rendered in English as "*Rejoice Jerusalem!*" You may ask, "Why rejoice during Lent?" That is precisely the point. As far as Lent goes, we've made it to the halfway point. So consider all the things you've given up this Lent, all the things you've gone without, all the extra time you have hopefully spent in prayer, and all the time you've spent either fasting or abstaining from meat. Celebrating Laetare Sunday is the Church's way of saying, "Hang in there! We're in the last stretch! Easter will be here soon."

One of the customs of Laetare Sunday is that on this weekend, priests have the option of wearing rose vestments for Mass, instead of the traditional purple vestments. And just to make something clear... the vestments are not pink. They're rose. Pink comes from lightening the color red. Rose comes is a lighter shade of purple.

It is believed that using the color rose for this weekend comes from a beauti-

ful tradition in Rome. Every year on this weekend, the Pope occasionally gives special gifts to heads of state. The gift is a golden rose. When this tradition began (somewhere around 1471), it was a simple rose, made out of pure gold, slightly tinted red, set on one stem. In later years, it was not tinted, but decorated with rubies. As the years went on, the single rose, became an arrangement of several thorny branches, with several golden roses blooming on the stems. In the center of the arrangement was a tiny cup, into which the Pope would pour a scented perfume, to give off the smell of roses.

The golden roses given by the Holy Father are a sign of friendship and gratitude, which also carries with it several aspects that symbolize Christ and the Church. The rose flower is found at the end of a thorny stem, symbolizing joy after pain, forgiveness after hurt, love after hate, peace after discord. In many ways, it is symbolic of Lent. We focus on Jesus way of the cross during Lent, but on this "Rose Sunday," we look beyond Christ's suffering toward his resurrection. A rose also gives off a beautiful aroma, reminding Catholics that we are to be the sweet aroma in society, bringing forth kindness, love, and joy.

Laetare Sunday is considered a day of relaxation from normal Lenten practices. It is a day of hope with Easter at

last within sight. Traditionally, weddings (otherwise banned during Lent) could be performed on this day. In the old days, servants were released from their service on Laetare Sunday so they could attend Mass at the Church where they were baptized.

Another custom celebrated on this fourth Sunday of Lent involves those who seek to enter the Church through the Easter Sacraments. There was a time in our history when those preparing for Baptism at Easter had to do some serious fasting during Lent. They would also spend countless hours in prayer. Lent was tough, really tough! To show them that Lent can never be entirely sad, the Church uses the fourth Sunday to let out the pent up joy we have toward the celebration of Christ's resurrection. And so, on this day, catechumens (those seeking baptism) traditionally would be given roses to keep, or exchange with others. Hopefully the message aimed at catechumens will be celebrated throughout our whole parish this year: **"Rejoice! The celebration of the Lord's resurrection is near!"**

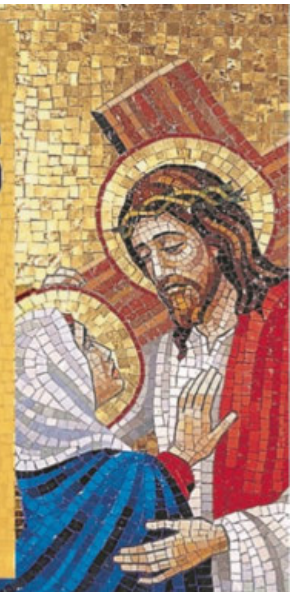

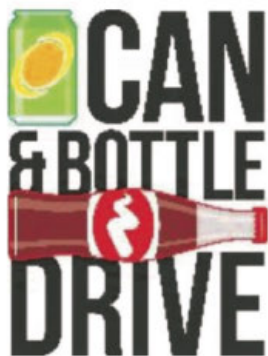
