

Over the last weeks we've had several of our parishioners whose family members have died. This is never an easy thing whether it was those who were older and passed after a long decline or others who passed suddenly. As I've talked with these parishioners, some have shared how their family members have been or not been prepared as far as funeral plans. There is certainly much to figure out at that time of a death but some of that is lessened if a person has preplanned.

As I was considering this, I started thinking even more about

the *real preplanning* that each of us needs to be focused on beyond the important funeral preplanning, which is certainly helpful. The *real preplanning* happens in our

relationship with others and with God. We will never know how or when God will call us to Himself in death. If He would call you to Himself today, would you feel like you had *preplanned* well? Would you feel like you had grown in virtue working on those areas of life where you knew you were weak or had continued to fall into sin? Could forgiveness and God's grace to heal and love better be better found in the sacrament of Reconciliation? Would you feel that you've been as generous to others as you'd like to be or was that always something for later? Could you give a little more time and financially to those who need it? Would you feel that the relationships you've had with others are where you'd like them to be? If not, what could you do on your side of things to help heal them? ...realizing of course that we can only do what we can from our side of the relationship. Would you feel that your relationship with God is where you'd like it to be? It's easy to put off praying or taking time with Him in the busyness of life...there's always other things that *just have to get done*. Are those things really the most important and will taking time for Him really take away from those others things? Or would prayer instead really help us with all of those other things we *just have to get done*?

My brothers and sisters as we start this new year, I'm sure you may have already fallen short of your New Year's resolutions. I'd like to suggest that maybe we need to look more closely at *preplanning*. Certainly funeral preplanning is a beautiful gift to give to family who will be in the midst of grief at the time of your death. But the more beautiful gift is *really preplanning* for our life of grace with God in eternity. Are we working towards those things in this life to truly be prepared for the eternal life God has *preplanned* for us? Let us turn to Him and find something greater than we might ever imagine...in the future but even in the here and now.
