



Brothers and sisters, our world is hurting. Between wars, civilian shootings, illness, conflict and division there is much to fill the news with stories of woe. Our own lives find this same conflict and division. Whether with family, friends, coworkers or even our own hearts which are divided. There is illness and pain from so many things. It is easy to feel separated, isolated and alone. We are all in need of healing in so many ways. Yet there are so many who are separated from the very source and summit of our lives as Catholics; the source of healing, unity and strength; the Eucharist; the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ; His very Real Presence. It is very easy for us to find many other things to be occupied with every day of the week. Saturday and Sunday are no exceptions. We occupy our lives with things that are less than what we have

before us every time we come to Mass; Jesus Christ who gives Himself to us completely.

We are starting a time of Eucharistic Renewal within our Diocese and the same is happening throughout the United States. The Bishops of the United States have invited us to this time of refocusing on what is most important...**WHO** is most important. This Sunday we begin our time of Eucharistic renewal as we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ known also by its Latin name Corpus Christi. I invite you to join us after Mass for a short time in church for adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, the Eucharist. We will have a public procession with the Eucharist showing our belief and worship of the one who loves us so much.

There will be many opportunities for us to grow in believing, worshipping, living and sharing Jesus in the Eucharist. Each week at the conclusion of Mass, I will give a short explanation of the importance of what we do during each part of the Mass and why we do it. I also invite you to a new prayer the Anima Christi (Soul of Christ) which can be found in the Breaking Bread missalette (2 pages from the back). It is a beautiful prayer that I encourage you to pray after receiving the Eucharist as Communion at Mass. Monthly we will have a bulletin insert about this Eucharistic Renewal to help share the wealth of what we **Believe**, how we **Worship**, how we **Live** and how we **Share** Jesus in the Eucharist.

These are just a couple of the opportunities before us. We will share more of them as the process of Eucharistic Renewal continues. In the meantime, let us make the time to take advantage of the opportunities to **Believe**, **Worship**, **Live** and **Share** Jesus even more in our lives.
