
Theology of the Body Conference at Holy Redeemer July 29th-31st

Between 1978 and 1984, Pope St. John Paul II delivered a series of Wednesday audiences that eventually became known as the Theology of the Body. This profound teaching offered what St. John Paul called an "adequate anthropology"—an examination of what it means to be human, made in God's image and likeness, and how that reality is made visible in our human bodies. The last Saturday of this month, July 30th, Jacob Gorman from our parish family will make his first profession of religious life with the Congregation of the Holy Cross. Jacob is the son of Jeff & Amy Gorman, older brother of Caroline & Allison and grandson of Carol Ann Gorman. He graduated from Mater Dei high school and Notre Dame where he was studying for the Congregation of the Holy Cross.

Jacob wrote a bulletin article for us back in the fall if you recall him sharing a little more about himself and the process of his novitiate year. He wrote: " On August 10th, seven of my seminary classmates and I will be entering into the Holy Cross Novitiate in Cascade, Colorado. This time in Colorado is a year-long process of prayer, silence, and discernment which is meant to prepare us to profess our first vows of chastity, poverty, and obedience. These vows are a way of responding to God's love for us and, in return, making ourselves more open to loving the people around us. Our community's Constitutions describe them in this way: "In consecrated celibacy we wish to love with the freedom, openness and availability that can be



recognized as a sign of the kingdom. In consecrated poverty we seek to share the lot of the poor and to unite in their cause, trusting in the Lord as provider. In consecrated obedience we join with our brothers in community and with the whole church in the search for God's will. We do not imagine that those who commit themselves in other ways to the following of Jesus are thereby hindered in their service of neighbor. On the contrary, we find in them willing and complementary partners in shared mission. We want our vows, faithfully lived, to be witness and call to them as their commitments, faithfully lived, are witness and call to us." To be joyful, clear witnesses of Christ's love--to be able to live our vows in a meaningful way--it's important that my classmates and I become men who are mature, balanced, loving, and rooted in prayer. One purpose of our time in seminary is to help us develop these virtues. The novitiate is the year where we focus most intentionally on developing a deeper prayer life and learning how to listen for God's voice."

He and the others are now finishing their novitiate year. During that time Jacob has discerned making his first profession as a religious brother. One other has discerned this call to be a religious brother and the others discerned the call to be religious priests all within the Congregation of the Holy Cross. After their first religious profession of vows, they will return to South Bend to continue their initial formation.

Jacob's family will be traveling to Colorado Springs for Jacob's first profession. I plan to join them after a retreat in the area. We wish to bring your support and love with us. Please see the spiritual bouquet insert in the bulletin, narthex or the parish website. This is a beautiful way to support our parish family member as he takes this next important step in his vocational journey. Please do return the spiritual bouquet form to the box in the narthex by Sunday, July 24th so that I may collect them to take with me. If you'd like to add a card with well wishes, you can place it there as well. Let us continue to pray for Jacob and those others making their first profession of vows. May God bless them and us too in following His will for us daily. God Bless
