Message from Father Millar,

I would like to begin by acknowledging how weird it is to be writing about the Epiphany before we have celebrated Christmas. The reason for this is that this year with Christmas on a Saturday we have the earliest possible dates for both the Feast of the Holy Family (the Sunday in the Octave of Christmas) and the Epiphany (the Sunday between Jan. 2 and Jan. 8). This has the effect of not only foreshortening the Christmas season, but also our bulletin schedule - hence writing this article before Christmas. When I first realized this, I was somewhat dismayed - Christmastide is already short, and Ordinary Time in winter is boring now that Epiphanytide doesn't extend until Candlemas (Feb. 2). But there is a blessing in the fact that Epiphany is the novena of Christmas: it reminds us that the Incarnation is something to be shared and boldly proclaimed to all.

The Feast of the Epiphany is a hybrid celebration; in addition to the Adoration of the Magi, it also commemorates the Baptism of the Lord, the Wedding Feast at Cana, and the Transfiguration. What is common to all these celebrations is that they reveal the divinity that is ordinarily hidden in the humanity of Christ, showing how Jesus is the light of Revelation to the Gentiles and the Salvation of His people. Each of these moments also mark turning points in Jesus' life: after the Adoration, the Holy Family flees to Egypt; after the Baptism and Wedding, Jesus begins His public ministry; and after the Transfiguration He ascends to Calvary. Each is intimately linked to the Paschal Mystery, and as a result, we announce the date of Easter on Epiphany.

But let us return to the fact that the closeness of Christmas and the Epiphany reminds us that the reality of the Incarnation is something to be proclaimed and shared. God became man because as the Nativity Proclamation says, He desired to consecrate the world by His most loving presence. Christmas is the bold proclamation of God's love for us, and the Epiphany is an invitation for us to respond. Love, by nature, wants to share itself – just ask anyone in the first stages of human love.

Will we traverse field and fountain, moor and mountain to encounter the love of Christ? Will we join Him to proclaim the Kingdom of God to others? Or, like Herod, Scribes, and Pharisees will we react to the disruption of God's presence with hatred and anger? This Epiphany, let us radiate anew the presence of the Incarnate God. Let us embrace the change that God's presence demands, abandoning the shadows of this world and embracing the light of the really real God.

BACKGROUND ON THE GOSPEL READING

The visit of the Magi occurs directly before the story of the Holy Family's flight into Egypt. Matthew's Gospel



tells a version of Jesus' birth that is different than the one in Luke. Of the actual birth of Jesus, Matthew tells us little more than, "When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, in the days of King Herod . . . " The story of the census is found only in Luke's Gospel, but we hear about the visit of the Magi only in Matthew's Gospel.

We know little about the Magi. They come from the East and journey to Bethlehem, following an astrological sign, so we believe them to be astrologers. We assume that there were three Magi based upon the naming of their three gifts. The Gospel does not say how many Magi paid homage to Jesus. In Matthew's Gospel, they represent the Gentiles' search for a savior. Because the Magi represent the entire world, they also represent our search for Jesus.

We have come to consider the gifts they bring as a foreshadowing of Jesus' role in salvation. We believe the meaning of the gifts to be Christological. Gold is presented as representative of Jesus' kingship. Frankincense is a symbol of his divinity because priests burned the substance in the Temple. Myrrh, which was used to prepare the dead for burial, is offered in anticipation of Jesus' death.

The word Epiphany means "manifestation" or "showing forth." Historically several moments in Christ's early life and ministry have been celebrated as "epiphanies," including his birth in Bethlehem, the visit of the Magi, his baptism by John, and his first miracle at Cana.
