MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS

FOR THE CELEBRATION OF THE 55th WORLD
DAY OF PEACE, JANUARY 1, 2022:
Dialogue Between Generations, Education and
Work: Tools for Building Lasting Peace

1. "How beautiful upon the mountains are the feet of the messenger who announces peace" (Isaiah 52:7).

The words of the prophet Isaiah speak of consolation; they voice the sigh of relief of a people in exile, weary of violence and oppression, exposed to indignity and death. The prophet Baruch had wondered: "Why is it, O Israel, why is it that you are in the land of your enemies, that you are growing old in a foreign country, that you are defiled with the dead, that you are counted among those in Hades?" (3:10-11). For the people of Israel, the coming of the messenger of peace meant the promise of a rebirth from the rubble of history, the beginning of a bright future.

Today the path of peace, which Saint Paul VI called by the new name of integral development, remains sadly distant from the real lives of many men and women and thus from our human family, which is now entirely interconnected. Despite numerous efforts aimed at constructive dialogue between nations, the deafening noise of war and conflict is intensifying. While diseases of pandemic proportions are spreading, the effects of climate change and environmental degradation are worsening, the tragedy of hunger and thirst is increasing, and an economic model based on individualism rather than on solidary sharing continues to prevail. As in the days of the prophets of old, so in our own day the cry of the poor and the cry of the earth constantly make themselves heard, pleading for justice and peace.

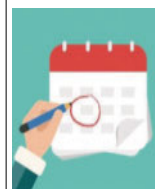

Baptism of the Lord: God's Beloved

It's intriguing to me that, St. Luke's account of the baptism of Jesus — well, it's hardly an *account*; it's more of a passing comment: "after all the people had been baptized and Jesus also had been baptized" — there is nothing really said about how or why it came to be that Jesus was baptized by John. It just says it as if it were the most ordinary of things — all the people were baptized, and Jesus was baptized, too. But what I find most interesting is the next part: after he was baptized, he was praying. Now it isn't unusual (in Luke's Gospel particularly) that Jesus should be praying before or after a significant event in his life. But when he prays, it is by himself, away from others, alone with the Father. So it is striking to realize that the conclusion of this gospel passage doesn't describe a *public* event:

"Heaven was opened and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased."

The descent of the Holy Spirit and the voice of the Father speaking to Jesus is an intimate event. The words are spoken to Jesus directly: it is not spoken to or for the benefit of any other witnesses — "*this* is my beloved Son" — but to Jesus personally — "*You* are my beloved Son...with *you* I am well pleased."

In this way Luke's telling of the baptism of the Lord magnifies the truth that Jesus, who is Son of Man and Son of God, is truly and completely one with us in our humanity. He is *baptized into our human life* — including our suffering and death. This act of God is the means of our salvation. Specifically, our suffering and death, in Christ, becomes the portal through which God restores us to the dignity of who we are created to be: God's beloved sons and daughters, created in his image and likeness. So in our baptism, we are *baptized into the Lord's death*, and thus we are also filled with his divine, eternal life, by the power of the Holy Spirit.

May each of us hear in our hearts, over and over again, in the intimate moments of our personal prayer as well as in our common prayer as Church:

*You are my beloved;
In you I am well pleased.*

Baptism of the Lord Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

After Jesus was baptized, the Holy Spirit came down in the form of a dove. A voice from Heaven said, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are each present for this important event at the beginning of Jesus' public ministry.



This Sunday's Gospel shows us that Jesus belongs to many groups. First, Jesus joins the crowds of people who listen to John the Baptist preach and decide to turn toward God. Jesus belongs with people who are seeking God and seeking to show justice and mercy toward each other. Second, the Gospel shows us that Jesus belongs to a divine community. God speaks from the cloud and affirms who Jesus is: "You are my beloved Son." The Holy Spirit comes upon Jesus, so Jesus is not alone when he begins his mission. Jesus' divine family is with him, this community that lives three in one love. Third, Jesus begins his work after his baptism and gathers together a community of followers. The Sacrament of Baptism welcomes each one of us into that community. We belong with Jesus, his Father, and the Holy Spirit. We belong to the community that continues Jesus' work of healing and teaching.

As you pray the sign of the cross that reminds you that you were baptized into God's family, imagine God's voice saying to you, "You are my beloved son/ daughter; with you I am well pleased."

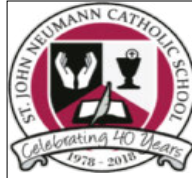

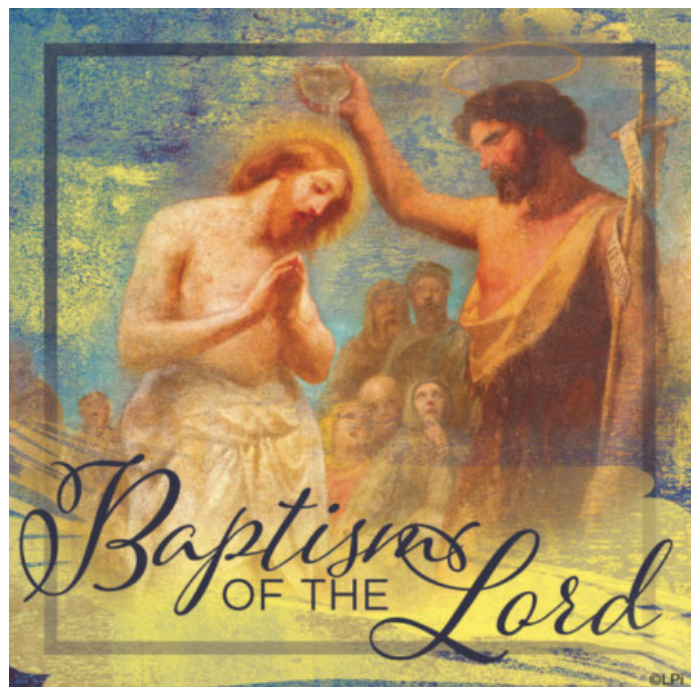

You may hear the phrase 777 about Laudato Si'. That phrase comes from the purpose to include all **7** sectors of the Catholic World to attain sustainability in the spirit of Integral Ecology as framed by the **7** Laudato Si' Goals in **7** years.

The 7 Sectors include:

- (1) Families,
- (2) Dioceses & Parishes,
- (3) Educational Institutions,
- (4) Hospitals & Healthcare Centers,
- (5) Organizations and Groups,
- (6) Economy (Businesses and Agriculture),
- (7) Religious Orders

The 7 LSAP goals are:

- (1) responding to the cry of the Earth,
- (2) responding to the cry of the poor,
- (3) ecological economics,
- (4) adoption of sustainable lifestyles,
- (5) ecological education,
- (6) ecological spirituality, and
- (7) community action.

The LSAP is a 7 year commitment to achieve sustainability, but it is meant to live long after 2028.

Baptisms ~ Please contact the Parish Office for registration information. Prior to baptism, parents are required to attend a baptism -preparation session. Parents may attend this before their child is born.

Penance ~ Saturdays at 1:00 p.m. at St. James and 2:30 p.m. at St. Jerome or by appointment. Communal services are celebrated during Advent and Lent.

Marriage ~ If you are considering marriage, a minimum of six months is required for preparation. A wedding date cannot be set until after the first meeting with the pastor. At that time, the diocesan and parish guidelines will be explained.
