The Power of Project-Based Learning

Project-based learning is gaining more attention in the field of education, and the teachers at Saint Zachary School have not ignored this trend. What is project-based learning, and how can it be used in the classroom? Project-based learning refers to educational experiences that take students beyond the lecture, notes, and reading of a normal day in the classroom, and allows

them to think critically, be creative, solve problems, work with different mediums, and demonstrate their learning. Recently, in 6th grade ELA students read the well-known novel, *Percy Jackson and the Lightning Thief. In place of a test or essay assignment on this book, students had the opportunity to create a three-dimensional diorama that depicted and explained one of their favorite scenes in the novel. In order to make this project work, students not only had to have a solid understanding of the story and the important aspects of the scene they chose, they also had to make a plan, draw their idea, make a list of needed materials, and determine how to make their vision a reality. Once completed, they also had to present their project to the class, and follow a detailed rubric for success.*


Recent studies have determined that project-based learning is an effective strategy for all students, and allows students to demonstrate their learning in ways beyond just a test, quiz or essay. While these are tried and true strategies, the trends in education show that students need choice in how they demonstrate their learning, and when they are able to think both critically and creatively, the outcomes are often better. Students who engage in many rigorous project-based learning experiences often go on to AP classes in high school. It also allows for the classroom to become far more student-centered, as opposed to a traditional teacher-centered approach. Students in junior high ELA are given many opportunities across grade levels and genres to participate in project-based learning. Students have not only built dioramas, but have made iMovies, produced posters, created gravestone epitaphs, and written and put on short classroom plays. The students enjoy these projects, and love the choice and creativity it affords them. This year we had amazing results that really showcased the imagination and cleverness of the sixth grade class!
