

From the Pastor's Desk


Fellow pilgrims, with the celebration of Palm Sunday this weekend, we enter the Holy Week. Since the beginning of Lent, we have made personal sacrifices, mortified ourselves and struggled to fulfill our spiritual exercises and discipline of Lent through our intense prayers, almsgiving, community penance services and the Lenten Soup and Stations at St. John Bosco and Immaculate Conception. And it has been a great and wonderful time of spiritual and personal growth in our faith and fellowship. We thank all the groups, families and individuals, who provided the Soups at both parishes. Now, as we enter the Holy Week, we look at the mysteries we celebrate within the week, especially aS they are events we celebrate only once a year.


The Holy Week, the week preceding Easter, is the most solemn week of the Church's liturgical cycle. In the Vatican Council II liturgy, Palm Sunday is also known as Passion Sunday, not only because this week the Passion of Christ is read in full two times, on Pam Sunday and on Good Friday; but more so because in the liturgies of Holy Week, God's saving action through Christ's passion and resurrection is celebrated in a special way. Its effects are made present to the believing community who through baptism, renewal of baptismal commitment, personal conversion, and penance are joined to the passion of Jesus the Christ. Now, the Passion of Christ is a traditional designation for the last events of Jesus' life. It refers to the suffering, torture and death of Jesus Christ, the humble suffering servant of God that offered his life on the cross (Is 50:4-7; Phil 2:6-11; Lk 22:14-23), as also seen in the gospels and readings of the Masses this week. Also, the liturgical ceremonies of the week represent in many cases the preservation of earlier liturgical rites dating back to the early Christian communities. The intents of these Rites are to provide commemoration of and participation in the events of the last days of the life of Christ and an opportunity to relive the paschal mystery by which Christ reconciled the world to his Father. Hence we can say that Holy Week is the week of salvation.

On Palm Sunday, we remember that it was during the annual Jewish Passover that Jesus passed through suffering and death into new life. This was a divine act that saved all of humanity and creation from final damnation or death; just as the Jewish Passover commemorates the liberation of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. Palms to be used I the next Ash Wednesday are blessed at a suitable site and carried in procession into the church, depicting Christ's triumphant entry from Bethany into Jerusalem as the Messiah and the Savior of the world (Lk 19:28-40). Monday to Wednesday of Holy Week is regarded as preparation days (spiritually and otherwise), for the holy days of *Triduum* — the name given to the three most important days in Holy Week — *Maundy Thursday* (after the last supper arrest of Jesus), *Good Friday*, and *Holy Saturday*, meaning the sacred three days, since in them we commemorate the suffering and death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Now, before the Triduum, there is an important celebration: the Chrism Mass.

At the Chrism Mass, the bishop, together with his clergy and laity, consecrate three types of oil used sacramentally for anointing: thus they are called Holy Oils (*Olea Santa*). The parishes and institutions take the new oils to replace the oils of the previous year, and are again used for the ministry for the next one year. Only pure olive oil was used, but after 2nd Vatican Council, pure vegetable oil can now be used. The Chrism Mass, where the oils are consecrated, could be done on any day prior to the evening of Thursday of Holy Week, and it usually takes place in the Cathedral church or any church the bishop deems suitable. At this liturgy, the fullness of the church is realized, since the bishop, the clergy and the laity gathered together as the whole people of God (the Church), celebrating the holy liturgy which is "the action of the whole Church —Head and Members." Priests renew their obedient (continued next column)

commitment to the bishop and faithfulness to their call. The faithful are asked to pray for the priests' steadfastness and pledge to support them.

About the oils, in the Old Testament time, oil was a sign of abundance and joy; an agent of healing, strengthening and beautifying. Kings, priest, and prophets were anointed with oil. It symbolized the anointed person's goodness and healing presence in the community. Its Christian usage symbolizes spiritual strengthening, through sanctification and the imparting of the special grace of the Holy Spirit. Oil of the Catechumens signifies cleansing and strengthening. Oil of the Sick brings healing and comfort; the Sacred Chrism (a mixture of pure olive oil and balm or balsam; balsam is a thick aromatic tree resin that was prized for both its pleasant smell and its assumed medicinal properties) is used in the administration of baptism, confirmation, holy orders and at the consecration of bishops. It is also used in the consecration of churches, altar stones, chalices, patens, the solemn blessing of bells and the blessing of baptismal fonts. The oil and balsam mixed together signify a "fullness of grace."

Now, regarding the Triduum, in the evening of Holy Thursday or Maundy Thursday, the Mass of the Last Supper is celebrated in different parishes. There is only one Mass in a canonical parish. In the Cathedral parish, the bishop presides over the liturgy, while in the parishes, the pastors preside over he Mass as the heads and leaders of the people of the local parishes. There is the washing of the feet symbolizing the love and service left to us by Christ and the Eucharistic Adoration that follows the end of the liturgy, to pray and watch with our Savior in the garden of Gethsemane. And on Good Friday, the passion of the Christ is reenacted, with the veneration of the Cross and great intercessions, ending with the prayerful mood that continues after the liturgy as we await the resurrection of Christ in the early Easter morning. Good Friday and Holy Saturday are the only two days the Catholic world does not celebrate Mass. Holy Communion reserved after Holy Thursday celebration is received on Good Friday. One can receive Holy Communion on Holy Saturday before the Vigil, only as Viaticum. Now, Easter which begins with the Holy Saturday vigil will be discussed next week. May God be with us as we make a conscious effort to attend these ceremonies of our salvation. Fr. Francis




