# A Mother's Flowers

We are very blessed here in our parish. We are given new opportunities to participate in and show our love, care, and support for those around us. The other week, Parish Council had a presentation from A Mother's Hope. A Mother's Hope is a new organization that is serving expectant mother's and their children right here in our diocese. They are Catholic and work closely with Women's Care Center. They operate a house which allows for eight women to stay while they are expecting the birth of their child through the first year of the child's life. The mother and baby are cared for and given the appropriate medical attention and assistance that they need while equipping the mother with life skills that she will need to not only raise and care for her newborn child, but also to find and hold a job to ensure a continued source of income. Since they are new, they are small and do not have the resources to serve all who come to their door and usually have a wait list. Thus, after hearing about this organization, the members of our Parish Council voted, unanimously, to begin a regular second collection for A Mother's Hope in order to help cover the costs that they incur by serving moms and babies. This second collection should not take away from your normal offertory/Sunday giving envelope. But instead, this extra giving is done above and beyond what we already give as away to stretch our generosity and support. We will probably never know, in this life, whose lives we have touched, changed, and impacted in order to make a difference and provide two people, the mom and the baby, an opportunity at a better life and an encounter with Christ. Thus we are all asked to go beyond what we are accustomed to giving and sacrifice a little in order to have some money to provide for the needs of otheers. Imagine if you gave up going out to eat once per month and put that \$20 into the collection to allow a mother and a child to receive medical care, food, clothes, and training for a job? What a difference a small sacrifice can make!

Speaking of sacrifice, you may have noticed that the flowers around the altar have disappeared. We realized that we were spending a large amount of money every month for just a few flowers. Thus, we have temporarily stopped purchasing flowers for the altar. However, this is another new opportunity for our parish. Envelopes will be available in church for parishioners to sponsor weekly flowers for the church. Flowers will be placed in the sanctuary during the year, except for Lent. Thus, if you would like to donate money for the altar flowers, you may simply place your gift into the envelope and place it into the collection basket on Sunday or drop it off to the parish office. There is a suggested dollar amount which will allow us to purchase a large amount of decorative flowers. The altar flowers can be purchased in memory of your loved one or in anticipation of a special celebration. The reason why we use real flowers instead of fake ones in the church is because they symbolize the life of Christ who was cut from this world, sacrificed, and gave His life so others may look upon Him and see His beauty. Thus, items used on the altar, including candles, should be those things which are consumed and give their life as a resemblance of Christ. So, if you would like to help us decorate the sanctuary with beautiful, live flowers, you will be appreciated as the beauty of the flowers helps to draw one into the mystery of Christ.


