Praying for Our Government

"First of all, I urge that petitions, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgiving be offered for all men, especially for kings and those in authority, that we may be able to lead undisturbed and tranquil lives in perfect piety and dignity. Prayer of this kind is good, and God our savior is pleased with it" (1 Tim 2:1 – 4).

Election day is on Tuesday November 5. It is important for us to participate in our government by casting our votes to decide who will be the elected officials to lead our nation. Since the beginning, God has asked for a leader of His people to be an upright leader – one who is solid with faith and morals, and supports God's plan for humanity. We see this constantly throughout the history of Israel that, when they had leaders who placed God and His will first and foremost in their life, then blessing flowed out to the people. Whereas when Israel had a leader who desired to turn away from God and pursue sinful desires, then Israel was struck by war, famine, plague, and fracturing of the nation. Thus, the phrase came into being: "as goes the leader, so goes the people" meaning that the leader of a nation has great influence over how people live their lives. Thus, if a leader promotes and defends actions that are contrary to God's plan, then the people will be more inclined to accept those ideas as they are promoted by a leader who is supposed to care about the citizens and point them to heaven.

Therefore, as we prepare to vote for the next President of our nation, I urge two things:

- 1. As St. Paul said in his letter to Timothy above pray. Always pray for our government leaders who are tasked with caring for the people of our nation. God can go where we cannot into the depths of their hearts to have them have a conversion of heart to Him and His divine will.
- 2. To examine your values and beliefs and decide which candidate will best support them. And to examine our values and beliefs against our Faith to see if we are following what the Church teaches and also God's Will because sometimes, we need to change. Sometimes, our values and beliefs need to be altered in order to coincide with God's plan for us and humanity.
