

### Did You Know? – The Symbolism of Candles

As we've been having our Sunday evening "Candlelight Adoration" for our parishes, it's been such a blessing to hear the positive feedback—the

comments of how peaceful the time of prayer has been, how blessed we are to have such beautiful practices in our faith, and how some have felt transported back in time by the solemnity they encounter with Jesus exposed on the altar, lit only by the light of 100 or so candles. It's gotten me thinking about candlelight, about the symbolism of candles in our faith, and how we look to Christ's light in this season of darkness. The other day, I ran across this post on Facebook from the Cathedral Parish of Toledo, Ohio. The post read:

*Did you know that all candles in Catholic churches are made out of beeswax? And not on accident. Beeswax is made by virgin worker bees. These bees dedicate their lives to the creation of the wax and the nourishment of the hive, and have come to represent Our Lady, the Virgin mother who gave birth to the pure flesh of Christ, with Christ's pure flesh being symbolized by the pure beeswax. What a detailed, beautiful symbol of this reality!*

Things like this are why I absolutely love our Catholic faith—we have so many rich and beautiful traditions, and there's a reason for everything that we do, especially when it regards the liturgy! Most of us are probably familiar with the idea that the flame represents the Light of Christ, but even the very substance of the wax points to the reality that Christ's flesh was completely pure, taken from the flesh of the Virgin Mary, who so tirelessly devoted herself to the plans of God for the nourishment of the world (literally—since Christ's Body and Blood become our very sustenance).

As well, the numbers of the candles at the altar are representative of something. If you notice, whenever the Eucharist is exposed in the monstrance for Adoration, there are always at least four candles burning (or there should be!).

This is to visually signify that Christ is exposed for us to adore—to draw our eyes to the One for whom we look for salvation. Similarly, we try to practice what we call progressive solemnity in the Church—so, often, you will see two candles at the altar for ferial days ("normal" weekdays/memorials of saints), four candles at the altar on special Feast days (when we add a Gloria), and six on Sundays and Solemnities. Currently, we are a little impeded from doing this, as neither of our parishes possess six altar candles. (I'm hoping to save our pennies to be able to make this purchase sometime in the future, but the precious things we use for liturgy often take quite a few pennies!)

The other place we often see a candle symbolize the Light of Christ is in the Paschal Candle, which stands near our baptismal font and is renewed each year at the Easter Vigil. The Exultet (sung every Easter Vigil) reminds us of the great victory of that night so long ago when "with a pillar of fire," Christ "banished the darkness of sin." It's that same pillar of fire that led the Israelites through the desert and gave them their rest in the promised land of Canaan. And now that same pillar of fire, symbolized to us by the Paschal candle which remains lit throughout the Easter season, conquers the darkness of our death and sin and brings us His light and life in the hope of our own resurrection. The Paschal candle is lit at every Baptism to remind us that each of us is entrusted with that Light of Christ, to be kept burning brightly until the day of our birth into eternal life. For the same reason, then, it is lit again at the Christian funeral, forming a sort of inclusion in the life of grace here on this side of heaven.

In a special way this Advent, we look to the flames of the candles in our Advent wreaths at Church and in our homes. With each week, a new candle is lit, and we're reminded that the light of Christ's coming approaches ever nearer—not only in our proximity to Christmas, but in our wait for Christ to come again. As St. Paul tells us in Romans, "The night is far spent; the day draws near. Let us cast off deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light." Keep watch with your candles burning, friends, and may His light and warmth shine brightly in your hearts in these holy days!

Keep spreading joy!

## TIME Talent TREASURE

As a new pastor, I'm learning a lot about a lot of things—one of which is how each parish participates in our annual diocesan assessment. For many years, you've probably heard Fr. Rick explain the Annual Catholic Services Appeal (ACSA). This year, things are a little different!

Our Diocese has changed from "ACSA" to a tithing model, which assesses each parish 10% of its parish revenues to help support the Diocese. This program is intended to help us move in the direction of the Biblical ideal of tithing, which asks each of us to strive toward giving 10% back to God. Just as we are all called to support our parish, we as a parish hope to also be good stewards of our Diocese.

By now, all of you have likely received your letter from Bishop Paprocki asking you to

consider an additional donation to help pay our parish's assessment. Our assessment for the 2020-2021 fiscal year is **\$109,385**. This number reflects the fruits of your generous donations prior to COVID-19, and though this pandemic has affected all of us in different ways, I am confident that together we can conquer this goal. In the future, the hope is that our tithing goal will be an assessment in real time, allowing us to budget this assessment monthly. For now, though, I pray that each of you will prayerfully consider a donation to help us make our goal!

Please feel free to reach out to me if you have questions regarding the Season of Stewardship program or our assessment. Let us all respond to God and to our local Church with a spirit of generosity, grateful for our call to be God's stewards!

## INVEST IN KIDS

In 2017, bipartisan lawmakers passed the Invest in Kids Act. This historic law – the first of its kind in Illinois — transforms lives by providing up to \$100 million in scholarships for children from low-income and working-class families in Illinois, while also providing landmark funding for public schools. Empower Illinois' scholarships provide parents with a way to help their children find success!

\$100,000,000 in K-12 scholarships  
Scholarships are funded through private donations to scholarship granting organizations (SGOs), like Empower Illinois, who then administer the application and scholarship process. Donations to the scholarship program are eligible for a 75% State Tax Credit.

#### *Reserve your tax credit*


*Beginning January 1, donors may reserve their tax credit on a first-come, first served basis. Once you reserve your credit, you have 60 days, or by December 31, whichever comes first, to make a donation to Empower Illinois.*

### INCREASE YOUR IMPACT

Donors who give to Empower Illinois receive a 75% tax credit for the amount of their gift, up to \$1 million. In addition, any portion of the tax credit may be carried forward for up to five years. Therefore, the tax credit is incentive for a donor to increase the amount they donate in tuition assistance. Donors can QUADRUPLE their impact with no extra money out-of-pocket.



**Question: Are Catholics obligated to attend Mass each Sunday, or receive Communion each Sunday?**

#### **Answer:**

The questions about Mass attendance and the reception of Holy Communion are clearly outlined in what are traditionally called the “Precepts” of the Church. These specific teachings are intended to stand alongside the Ten Commandments as fundamental practices for Catholics and are outlined in the Code of Canon Law. The obligations related to Mass attendance and receiving Communion are outlined in the first and third precepts, which we find quoted in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (no. 2042):

The first precept (“You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor”) requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts honoring the mysteries of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the saints; in the first place, by participating in the Eucharistic celebration, in which the Christian community is gathered, and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days.

The third precept (“You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season”) guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord’s Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy.

Rather than seeing these as obligations that are simply to be fulfilled out of a sense of duty, Pope Saint John Paul II reminds us of the grace that is made available to us when we gather for Sunday celebrations of the Eucharist: “Sunday is the day which is at the very heart of the Christian life... Time given to Christ is never time lost, but is rather time gained, so that our relationships and indeed our whole life may become more profoundly human” (Dies Domini, no. 7). ©LPi
