

## The Power of a Single “Yes” to the Lord

This weekend, the Church gives us to contemplate the familiar tale of the Annunciation—so appropriate for us to reflect upon in these last sacred days before we enter the mysteries of the Lord’s Incarnation (literally, His en-flesh-ment) at Christmas. Just days before He is born among us again, we pause to think about that moment when, with bated breath, all of humanity waits for Mary’s “yes,” her fiat: “Let it be done to me according to your word.”

I want to share with you one of my most favorite readings in the Liturgy of the Hours (the prayers that priests and religious worldwide promise to pray for the Church). It’s from a homily “In Praise of the Virgin Mother” by St. Bernard, and we as priests get to pray it every year on December 20. It’s one of the many truly great treasures of the Church, so I offer it to you for your prayer:

*You have heard, O Virgin, that you will conceive and bear a son; you have heard that it will not be by man but by the Holy Spirit. The angel awaits an answer; it is time for him to return to God who sent him. We too are waiting, O Lady, for your word of compassion; the sentence of condemnation weighs heavily upon us. The price of our salvation is offered to you. We shall be set free at once if you consent. In the eternal Word of God we all came to be, and behold, we die. In your brief response we are*

*to be remade in order to be recalled to life. Tearful Adam with his sorrowing family begs this of you, O loving Virgin, in their exile from Paradise. Abraham begs it, David begs it. All the other holy patriarchs, your ancestors, ask it of you, as they dwell in the country of the shadow of death. This is what the whole earth waits for, prostrate at your feet. It is right in doing so, for on your word depends comfort for the wretched, ransom for the captive, freedom for the condemned, indeed, salvation for all the sons of Adam, the whole of your race.*

*Answer quickly, O Virgin. Reply in haste to the angel, or rather through the angel to the Lord. Answer with a word, receive the Word of God. Speak your own word, conceive the divine Word. Breathe a passing word, embrace the eternal Word.*

*Why do you delay, why are you afraid? Believe, give praise, and receive. Let humility be bold, let modesty be confident. This is no time for virginal simplicity to forget prudence. In this matter alone, O prudent Virgin, do not fear to be presumptuous. Though modest silence is pleasing, dutiful speech is now more necessary. Open your heart to faith, O blessed Virgin, your lips to praise, your womb to the Creator. See, the desired of all nations is at your door, knocking to enter. If he should pass by because of your delay, in sorrow you would begin to seek him afresh, the One whom your soul loves. Arise, hasten, open. Arise in faith, hasten in devotion, open in praise and thanksgiving. Behold the handmaid of the Lord, she says, be it done to me according to your word.*

What a beautiful reminder to us of the power of a single “yes,” given to God in love. Indeed, the desired of all nations stands knocking at the door of our hearts. May these final days of preparation for Christ’s coming find you whispering your fiat to Him, and receiving Christ in new and profound ways this Christmas.

## TIME Talent TREASURE

As a new pastor, I'm learning a lot about a lot of things—one of which is how each parish participates in our annual diocesan assessment. For many years, you've probably heard Fr. Rick explain the Annual Catholic Services Appeal (ACSA). This year, things are a little different!

Our Diocese has changed from "ACSA" to a tithing model, which assesses each parish 10% of its parish revenues to help support the Diocese. This program is intended to help us move in the direction of the Biblical ideal of tithing, which asks each of us to strive toward giving 10% back to God. Just as we are all called to support our parish, we as a parish hope to also be good stewards of our Diocese.

By now, all of you have likely received your letter from Bishop Paprocki asking you to

consider an additional donation to help pay our parish's assessment. Our assessment for the 2020-2021 fiscal year is **\$109,385**. This number reflects the fruits of your generous donations prior to COVID-19, and though this pandemic has affected all of us in different ways, I am confident that together we can conquer this goal. In the future, the hope is that our tithing goal will be an assessment in real time, allowing us to budget this assessment monthly. For now, though, I pray that each of you will prayerfully consider a donation to help us make our goal!

Please feel free to reach out to me if you have questions regarding the Season of Stewardship program or our assessment. Let us all respond to God and to our local Church with a spirit of generosity, grateful for our call to be God's stewards!

After receiving Communion, please say a silent prayer in your car for a few moments before driving off.

### **WEAR YOUR MASKS**



*In Blaise Pascal's work, Pensees, he says: "What else does this craving, and this helplessness, proclaim but that there was once in*

*man a true happiness, of which all that now remains is the empty print and trace? This he tries in vain to fill with everything around him, seeking in things that are not there the help he cannot find in those that are, though none can help, since this infinite abyss can be filled only with an infinite and immutable object; in other words by God himself."*

*We have a difficult time accepting that fulfillment and happiness are not achieved by our own merits but through a relationship with God. We are hardwired for this relationship and it is in our DNA. The simple fact is that we come from God and are designed to return to God. If our beginning and our end define who we are, why would we not want to seek the One who can truly satisfy? The world does not realize that it is waiting. It is waiting for the birth of God in time, within one's soul and in eternity. We get so confused by seeking other momentary satisfactions that we misinterpret the hunger within. We crave God.*

*The union of God and humanity, revealed in Jesus Christ, is precisely what sets us on a straight path, orders our relationships, establishes proper focus and goals and tells us whose kingdom we really are meant to serve. We are so lost. God is with us. The prophet Nathan told this to King David, the angel said this to Mary and the birth of Christ brings this Good News to us. We do not need to be busily looking for more things but must learn to find contentment and blessing in the One Presence. This is the beautiful simple message of Advent!*

*If you are feeling unsettled, anxious, angry, disgruntled, disconnected, unhappy, worried, fearful, off center, becoming overly self-indulgent, unable to spend time alone and without distraction, then there's a good chance you are lost. Now is the time to allow God to find you! Ponder the holy simplicity of Mary's call to be the Mother of God. "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." When we are helpless and at home with our emptiness, God will fill us. Our Savior has come.*

## INVEST IN KIDS

In 2017, bipartisan lawmakers passed the Invest in Kids Act. This historic law – the first of its kind in Illinois — transforms lives by providing up to \$100 million in scholarships for children from low-income and working-class families in Illinois, while also providing landmark funding for public schools. Empower Illinois' scholarships provide parents with a way to help their children find success!

\$100,000,000 in K-12 scholarships  
Scholarships are funded through private donations to scholarship granting organizations (SGOs), like Empower Illinois, who then administer the application and scholarship process. Donations to the scholarship program are eligible for a 75% State Tax Credit.

#### *Request a Letter ID*

*Donors can begin the process by registering with mytax.illinois.gov. Approximately 10 business days later, you should receive your Letter ID in the mail.*

#### *Activate your account*

*Once you have your Letter ID, return to mytax.illinois.gov and activate your account.*

#### *Reserve your tax credit*

*Beginning January 1, donors may reserve their tax credit on a first-come, first served basis. Once you reserve your credit, you have 60 days, or by December 31, whichever comes first, to make a donation to Empower Illinois.*

Visit [empowerillinois.org/donate](http://empowerillinois.org/donate) to complete your donation. Individual donors may designate his or her donation to a favorite school or network of schools. Corporate donors may designate **their donation to a region of the state.**

### INCREASE YOUR IMPACT

Donors who give to Empower Illinois receive a 75% tax credit for the amount of their gift, up to \$1 million. In addition, any portion of the tax credit may be carried forward for up to five years. Therefore, the tax credit is incentive for a donor to increase the amount they donate in tuition assistance. Donors can QUADRUPLE their impact with no extra money out-of-pocket.



**Question: Are Catholics obligated to attend Mass each Sunday, or receive Communion each Sunday?**

#### **Answer:**

The questions about Mass attendance and the reception of Holy Communion are clearly outlined in what are traditionally called the “Precepts” of the Church. These specific teachings are intended to stand alongside the Ten Commandments as fundamental practices for Catholics and are outlined in the Code of Canon Law. The obligations related to Mass attendance and receiving Communion are outlined in the first and third precepts, which we find quoted in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (no. 2042):

The first precept (“You shall attend Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor”) requires the faithful to sanctify the day commemorating the Resurrection of the Lord as well as the principal liturgical feasts honoring the mysteries of the Lord, the Blessed Virgin Mary, and the saints; in the first place, by participating in the Eucharistic celebration, in which the Christian community is gathered, and by resting from those works and activities which could impede such a sanctification of these days.

The third precept (“You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season”) guarantees as a minimum the reception of the Lord’s Body and Blood in connection with the Paschal feasts, the origin and center of the Christian liturgy.

Rather than seeing these as obligations that are simply to be fulfilled out of a sense of duty, Pope Saint John Paul II reminds us of the grace that is made available to us when we gather for Sunday celebrations of the Eucharist: “Sunday is the day which is at the very heart of the Christian life... Time given to Christ is never time lost, but is rather time gained, so that our relationships and indeed our whole life may become more profoundly human” (Dies Domini, no. 7). ©LPi




