

## Around the Parish

As we commence the new year, I wanted to give an update on a few things that are occurring around our parishes.

First, both parishes had a little “heating” incident around the holidays (funny how that always seems to happen, right?). St. Thomas saw a new heating and air conditioning unit installed, at a cost of around \$10,000. One of the three units that operates in the Church went out, and instead of making an expensive repair to the old unit, we opted to install a newer, more efficient unit. Hopefully we will see some of the added expense come back to us by way of energy savings! At Our Lady of Lourdes, you may have noticed the vestibule and Church were a little cold. Fortunately, the repairs were minor, but we should be up and running. Thanks be to God!

Additionally, I want to inform all of you that Joe Snow has decided to accept a position at Farm Credit Services; as a result, while he will retain his duties at St. Thomas, he will conclude his time with us at Our Lady of Lourdes. I am extremely grateful for all that Joe has done for our parishes! He so consistently puts his heart and soul into his work here, and his attention, passion, and expertise will be sorely missed. I am sad to see him go, but I am confident as always that the Lord will provide for us, as He always does!

In that vein, our parishes find themselves in an active hiring process. Firstly, we are looking for someone to assume the maintenance position, which has been open at OLOL for a month or

so. We are looking into the possibility of having that position also help with maintenance at St. Thomas, provide Vern Wilson with some assistance as he so graciously continues to volunteer his time as plant manager.

Our Lady of Lourdes will also be searching for someone to assume the position of business manager. As we have been operating without a parish secretary since the end of June, I am also asking that we incorporate a new position, which will oversee parish communications (social media, website, parish email, phones, etc.).

Details for the above positions are still being worked out, as are the job descriptions and various responsibilities. I am also seeking the input of our finance councils, so should you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact me (always!) or them. As well, if you know any qualified individuals for any of the positions, please direct them our way! Lastly, albeit brief, I wanted to give an update on the status of our ACSA contributions (“Parish Tithe,” but apparently no one likes a name-change). Both parishes, coincidentally, have reached about 27% of our goal (just shy of \$30K at OLOL and approximately \$8.5K at St. Thomas). So far, 8% of OLOL families have pledged support and 9% of St. Thomas families. As we continue to strive to be stewards of God’s many gifts, if you are able, please consider making your contributions now. I cannot tell you (well, maybe I will someday when I have more room in my bulletin article!) how immensely the Diocese has helped me individually as a new pastor, not to mention the money they spent on my priestly education. That support is made possible only because of our parishes’ generous support of our collective mission as a local Church. As always, thank you for your generosity, and for how blessed you’ve all made my short time here so far. I am earnestly grateful to be your pastor.

## TIME *Talent* TREASURE

As a new pastor, I'm learning a lot about a lot of things—one of which is how each parish participates in our annual diocesan assessment. For many years, you've probably heard Fr. Rick explain the Annual Catholic Services Appeal (ACSA). This year, things are a little different!

Our Diocese has changed from "ACSA" to a tithing model, which assesses each parish 10% of its parish revenues to help support the Diocese. This program is intended to help us move in the direction of the Biblical ideal of tithing, which asks each of us to strive toward giving 10% back to God. Just as we are all called to support our parish, we as a parish hope to also be good stewards of our Diocese.

By now, all of you have likely received your letter from Bishop Paprocki asking you to

consider an additional donation to help pay our parish's assessment. Our assessment for the 2020-2021 fiscal year is **\$109,385**. This number reflects the fruits of your generous donations prior to COVID-19, and though this pandemic has affected all of us in different ways, I am confident that together we can conquer this goal. In the future, the hope is that our tithing goal will be an assessment in real time, allowing us to budget this assessment monthly. For now, though, I pray that each of you will prayerfully consider a donation to help us make our goal!

Please feel free to reach out to me if you have questions regarding the Season of Stewardship program or our assessment. Let us all respond to God and to our local Church with a spirit of generosity, grateful for our call to be God's stewards!

You must receive Communion in your hand; receiving on the tongue is not permitted in this situation.

After receiving Communion, please say a silent prayer in your car for a few moments before driving off.

**The Baptism of the Lord**

We need history. We need it in order to understand ourselves, personally and collectively. The pieces of our histories may not have always been the most positive, honest,

exemplary, dignified, proud and best moments of our lives, but they are ours. We have to acknowledge, remember, accept, and often heal them. We cannot forget them or pretend that they never existed. As horrible as the atrocities of events like Auschwitz, brutal injustices committed throughout the

human journey, or personal painful experiences in our own stories, we need to remember. These times when humanity in general or people in particular have lost their way are times that need to be reconciled and redeemed.

If we lose the memories, we will make the same mistakes again. The human soul needs a strong sense of affirmation, direction, and clear purpose. Without these essentials, we will easily run amuck and repeat the sins of our past. God's voice throughout history has spoken precisely about this! We are reminded through the voices and example of many prophets and witnesses not to make the same mistakes again, come back to center, discover the purpose given to us by God, maintain a sense of proper direction, seek healing for wounds and be reconciled to our Creator.

Baptism is so incredibly important for the salvation of humankind, not only eternally but here and now. Our existence depends upon it. It gives us the affirmation we need from God by gifting us with the same intimate relationship Jesus had with the Father. We are blessed with the direction and clear purpose we need in order to be productive stewards and faithful Christians. Baptism calls us to remember, accept, and deal with the sins and inequities of our past regardless of how hurtful and serious. We consciously choose to turn away from them and put on the new life of Christ. To do this well, we must look hard and long at our sins and failings, listen to what they are saying and learn from them. If we ignore the past, collectively or personally, or pretend that it never happened, we will never grow. We will surely die.

People need to hear the message, lived and spoken, delivered by the baptized members of the Body of Christ. It is an essential message of hope that is layered with visions of justice, peace, reconciliation, redemption, blessing, and healing. It is a message that helps us remember what has gone before, the graces and the sins, and bring ourselves by God's help where we need to be. We are called to do much more than sit home behind our closed doors. We have a message to deliver. Are we ready to do so?

**SOCIAL JUSTICE NEWS*****Flowing from the teaching of the Catholic Church***

Social Justice Committee: At the beginning of the New Year, the pope sent a homily focused on God's blessings and on sharing those blessings with others. He urged us to "create a culture of care." What a great message to begin the New Year as we begin to see an end to this terrible Pandemic; a pandemic that has torn away the veneer of our culture and exposed weaknesses that were always there but not brought to light until it hit home to many, especially poor, low income and minorities. Lack of health care and poverty as millions who were already poor were joined by millions thrown out of work. These are only two of the problems that existed before the Pandemic but were brought so harshly to light by Covid. So if ever there was a time to "create a culture of care" now is the time. The Pope continues, "This year, while we hope for new beginnings and new cures, let us not neglect care. Together with a vaccine for our bodies, we need a vaccine for our hearts. That vaccine is care. This will be a good year if we take care of others, as Our Lady does with us." The Pope ends his message with this, "Time is a treasure that all of us possess, yet we guard it jealously, since we want to use it only for ourselves," he wrote. "Let us ask for the grace to find time for God and for our neighbor—for those who are alone or suffering, for those who need someone to listen and show concern for them."

Empower Illinois’ scholarships provide parents with a way to help their children find success!

\$100,000,000 in K-12 scholarships  
Scholarships are funded through private donations to scholarship granting organizations (SGOs), like Empower Illinois, who then administer the application and scholarship process. Donations to the scholarship program are eligible for a 75% State Tax Credit.

#### ***Reserve your tax credit***

***Beginning January 1, donors may reserve their tax credit on a first-come, first served basis. Once you reserve your credit, you have 60 days, or by December 31, whichever comes first, to make a donation to Empower Illinois.***

**Question: Why do we hold hands during the Our Father?**

**Answer:**

The practice of members of the assembly holding hands while praying the Lord’s Prayer during the Mass is a custom that developed organically in the 1970s and 1980s. While some commentators acknowledge that the practice varies from place to place, it is a fairly universal reality in parishes across the United States. For some, this action symbolizes the communion of Christians praying together as one family of believers honoring the Father of All. Critics of the practice sometimes express concern that holding hands can be a distraction from the more significant unity that is experienced when we process to the altar to receive sacramental communion.

And so, we’re left to ask, what is the answer?

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (the document that offers specific instructions for the celebration of the Mass) is silent on the practice, saying only that “all the faithful say the prayer” with the priest. The website of the US Bishops simply observes that “No position is prescribed in the Roman Missal for an assembly gesture during the Lord’s Prayer.” And so, we’re left to discern within ourselves and within our parish and religious communities what is an authentic gesture of praise during this important point of the Mass. For some, this means continuing to hold hands, while for others, this may mean adopting another posture of prayer. ©LP



## EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

### When God Whispers

“You don’t need to shout. My hearing works just fine.”

Are you a parent that has used that one on your kids? I’m not sure at what age they realize that the volume of their voice doesn’t correlate to the likelihood of receiving a favorable reply — it might be sometime in the teenage years, when the talking slows down altogether.

But I’ve got to admit, it would be nice if God always gave us a loud and dramatic sign when He wanted something — the booming voice and the torn-open heavens (“This is my beloved Son!”) really get the message across. Sometimes I find myself envious of the Apostles, who were able to witness such things in person.

The fact of the matter is, in the year 2021, God is more likely to speak in a whisper than in a shout. The prophet Isaiah forewarns that Christ himself will not be a noisemaker — for all his preaching, he will not cry out or shout to bring forth justice to the nations. His way is altogether different than that.

We are not the Apostles, and we do not have the privilege of seeing the Holy Spirit descend on Christ like a dove. But here’s the good news: God doesn’t need to shout. Our spiritual hearing works just fine. We just have to be listening.

Let’s wake up each morning ready to hear God’s whispers throughout the day. Let’s make a conscious effort to invite those whispers into our hearts, where they can become a catalyst for grace in this world.
