Why We Kneel



One of my “New Year’s Resolutions” this year is to read more (which, naturally, I’ve already “restarted” once in hopes that I can make it longer than two weeks—that happens to everyone, right?). In that vein, I was spinning through *The Spirit of the Liturgy* by Joseph Cardinal Ratzinger (Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI) recently and came across some interesting information that I thought I would share with all of you.

Cardinal Ratzinger wrote about the origin of the Catholic practice of kneeling. As it turns out, the dominant cultures leading up to Christ, the Romans and the Greeks, detested the practice of kneeling, finding it both undignified and superstitious. Their practice, then, was not to kneel to the gods at all. St. Augustine, defending the practice of kneeling among Christians, pointed out that they, in a sense, were right; their gods were not God, and thus to kneel to them would have been nothing other than “servile.” But the humility of Christ on the cross freed us from slavishness to the gods—and it is to that humility and love that we now kneel. Kneeling, then, isn’t one of those things that we appropriated as Christians from other cultures. It is an authentic expression of the Christian culture which came about through our knowledge of the one true God.

The act of kneeling is also present many times throughout the Scriptures, sometimes as prostration, sometimes as the act of falling to one’s knees, and sometimes as the “kneeling” that perhaps we think of today. Jesus Himself falls to the ground to pray in the agony in the garden, symbolizing the surrender of His human will to the divine will and the depths to which He will go to redeem fallen mankind. The leper in Mk 1 comes to Jesus for healing and fall to his knees, not so much in adoration, but as a bodily sign of his desperation and trust. Peter and the disciples in Mt 14 fall at Jesus’

feet (sometimes translated “worshipped”), here as an acknowledgement that Jesus is truly the Son of God and is thus deserving of our worship.

Our act of kneeling incorporates all these aspects: submission of our will to God’s, trust, desperation, adoration, true worship. As Catholics, we recognize that what we speak with our souls we also represent with our bodies, because we are a body-soul composite. It’s one of the treasures of our Catholic faith, to see such union between the “physical” aspects of our worship and the dispositions of our heart. The two—physical and spiritual—are never completely separate. So when it comes to kneeling, Pope Emeritus Benedict says: “When kneeling becomes merely external, a merely physical act, it becomes meaningless. On the other hand, when someone tries to take worship back into the purely spiritual realm and refuses to give it embodied form, the act of worship evaporates, for what is purely spiritual is inappropriate to the nature of man. Worship is one of those fundamental acts that affect the whole man. That is why bending the knee before the presence of the living God is something we cannot abandon” (p.190-191, emphases added).

The knee, to the Hebrew mind, symbolized strength. Kneeling, therefore, was a surrender of our strength before the God who created us, acknowledging that everything we have comes from Him. Truly, to kneel is to humble ourselves before the God who made us, to acknowledge His sovereignty and power, and to worship Him for who He is. It’s why we genuflect to the tabernacle every time we enter a Church—in recognition of the dwelling of Jesus Christ, our God.

As Catholics, we believe that worship involves both body and soul. What we speak with our bodies, we speak with our hearts, and vice-versa. May we see our kneeling as an expression of what our hearts yearn for: union with God, and salvation by our Lord Jesus Christ.


PRE-PLANNING YOUR FUNERAL

Most of us are quiet people who desire to live a good and holy life, promote the values and mission of the Gospel as best we can and

desire to one day inherit the surprise of life eternal God promises to us. We are not trail blazers. We are simple people who want to do the simple things of life well. But there are others who left a more profound impact along the way of the paths they walked. Folks like Dorothy Day, Martin Luther King, Thomas Merton, Gandhi, St. Teresa of Calcutta, and many others left lasting impacts and legacies. Like Moses, they show us by word and deed who God is and what integrity and a purpose driven life look like. They show us how to be holy. We need Moses people like these to give us inspiration, hope and an example of holy living.

We do not need to do what they did or even mirror their relationship with God. Each one of us is God's special creation, with a purpose and soul known only to us. We need to learn how to open up and bring, without compromise, our soul-ness to life. We know when someone is authentic and centered because they always point to truth, even though they struggle and sin themselves, and they embody an unspoken timeless wisdom that just sounds and feels right. Jesus taught with this same type of authority and it astonished many who listened. We do not need to move mountains, advance a cause, write books or become notable. All we have to do is become credible witnesses of the faith we profess. Moses people can teach us how to do this.

St. Oscar Romero was an amazing man and a Moses figure for sure. He saw God in the burning bush and brought the flame of Gospel faith to the poorest of the poor, challenging the evils of the society in which he lived. He was tireless and persistent. He must have gotten very close to the problem because it cost him his life. He suspected it would. St. Romero said, "When we leave Mass, we ought to go out the way Moses descended Mt Sinai: with his face shining, with his heart brave and strong to face the world's difficulties." We can learn from this wisdom. If we allow the power of the Mass to truly transform us, we will leave that holy encounter changed. Our face will shine, and we will have courage. We can then bring what we have received to life's challenges. That sounds doable, doesn't it? Because of the example of our simple holiness, people will be amazed.©LP

SOCIAL JUSTICE NEWS

Flowing from the teaching of the Catholic Church | Last week the Illinois Legislature passed the Predatory Loan Prevention Act (SB 1792) that caps All consumer loans at or below 36% APR. This bill finally takes care of predatory car title and payday loans in Illinois that for so many years had interest rates above 250%. Payday and car title "loans" victimized tens of thousands of working families with high coast, long term debt every year. The bill was part of the Illinois Black Caucus omnibus economic package. One Springfield resident had a car title "loan " which was over 300% APR on a \$500 loan that resulted in a payback of over \$3,000. Over 60,000 working families every year fell victim to car title loans and over 200,000 to payday loans. Using "People Power," the Illinois Peoples Action organization has fought against predatory lending since the year, 2000, with countless direct actions on loan shark storefronts in Peoria, Springfield, Decatur, Bloomington and Champaign. The Decatur Chapter of Illinois Peoples Action includes several OLOL/St. Thomas Social Justice Committee members who were active in lobbying their legislators in Springfield to pass the 36% Cap on all loans. They also protested at several payday lending and car title loan stores in Decatur; helped pass restrictive zoning laws and city council resolutions to limit the number of loan stores. It took 20 yrs. of work by Illinois Peoples Action and other organizations to get this accomplished. The results: Justice for many in the future.

Beginning January 1, donors may reserve their tax credit on a first-come, first served basis. Once you reserve your credit, you have 60 days, or by December 31, whichever comes first, to make a donation to Empower Illinois.


INCREASE YOUR IMPACT

Donors who give to Empower Illinois receive a 75% tax credit for the amount of their gift, up to \$1 million. In addition, any portion of the tax credit may be carried forward for up to five years. Therefore, the tax credit is incentive for a donor to increase the amount they donate in tuition assistance. Donors can QUADRUPLE their impact with no extra money out-of-pocket.

Question: I get annoyed with myself when I am distracted while I pray. Is it a sin? How can I be more attentive?

Answer:

The mind is a marvelous and complex thing, producing amazing thoughts, images, wisdom and inspiration. Yet at times it is like a two-year-old: it does not follow directions, does what it wants and loves to tell us "no!" This is probably the oldest and most common problem in the spiritual life-dealing with distraction. It comes in all forms: good intentions forgotten, wandering thoughts at Mass, daydreaming, etc. A little poem says it all: When the soul begins to pray, the brain always wants to play!

There are many ways to handle distractions. If we are distracted by thoughts about our families or friends, we should pray for them. If we lose our focus, we need just "re-collect" ourselves. If some worry or concern just won't leave our mind, then we deal with it and come back to prayer or make it part of our prayer. And when words just won't come, the only prayer we might offer is our presence, our suffering, and our desire to be close to the Lord. Most importantly, we need to be patient with ourselves. These things are not sinful, but reminders of our human frailty. Our weaknesses and good efforts are all acceptable to God, who reads the love in our hearts and the good intentions of our minds.©LP
