

### The Rosary

In a homily a couple weeks ago, I talked about the importance of balance. I discussed how Catholics in the past century had a reputation for being strict, rigid, and serious. As time has gone on, we have seen many Catholics find more of a balance, where we focus more on God's mercy and the joy of the Gospel, which is great! However, the pendulum has perhaps swung too far. Today, there is a lost sense of sin as Pope Pius XII. We don't treat sin as seriously. We think the rules are something for the past. The practice of Confession has greatly decreased.

The same has happened with devotion. Today, there is often an emphasis on conversational prayer, our personal relationship with God, talking with God in a sincere way. All of this is great! However, I know I have seen the tendency for us today to look at the devotional practices or piety of the past with disdain. Traditional prayers, novenas, the Stations of the Cross, the rosary, and other Catholic devotions are treated like relics or artifacts from the past. Ideally, we would have personal, intimate, and sincere prayer with God, as well as keeping some of the more traditional Catholic devotions.

One particular practice I would like to focus on is the Rosary. October is the month of the Rosary, since the feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary is celebrated on October 7th. John Paul II said the Rosary was his favorite prayer. He also said, "How beautiful is the family that recites the Rosary every evening!" Pope Saint Pius X said, "The Rosary is the most beautiful and the most rich in graces of all prayers; it is the prayer that touches most the Heart of the Mother of God...and if you wish peace to reign in your homes, recite the family Rosary." In a world with so many broken families, the Rosary

is so important. Even if our family is not broken, the Rosary is immensely important. Looking back at my own life, I think the Rosary really helped our family. For a long time, we would say the Rosary together on Sunday evenings. When I was younger, there was definitely part of me that resisted that, but deep down I knew it was the right thing to do. Even if our children were distracted or bored, there was still value to it. I couldn't articulate it at the time, but it brought a greater peace to me and my family. There was a peace in taking extra time to pray on Sunday. It is the Lord's Day, right? Left to my own decision, I wouldn't have gone to Mass or prayed a Rosary, but I'm glad my parents were committed enough to my spiritual well-being and were responsible to make both the Mass and a Rosary a regular practice for our family.

Do you desire more peace in your life and your family? I encourage you to pray the Rosary. Do you find it difficult? Start small. If you can't pray a Rosary with regularity, can you pray it once a week? Even if your family can't pray a Rosary every Sunday, can you pray for at least one Decade? A decade only takes ~3 minutes. Can we as a Church spend a little less time watching TV, sports, browsing the Web, online shopping, going out to eat, and leave at least a little bit of time for prayer? Even if you have a hard time focusing during the Rosary, there is still value to the prayer. There is a value to relying on God's help and on Mary's intercession. Praying is the way you can most powerfully impact the world. Visible action is important, but it is secondary. Ideally, it is easiest to focus on the Rosary when we aren't multitasking, but there is a value to doing it even if we are multitasking, such as driving, going for a walk, getting ready for the day, cooking, etc. Regardless of when you do it, find time to regularly pray the Rosary or at least a decade or two. You won't regret it!

Have you ever prayed for wisdom? It probably is not the first thing you think to ask for when you go to pray, but we know from scripture that it is a gift that God loves to give. In the first reading this Sunday (which happens to be from

the book of the Old Testament called "Wisdom"), we hear from Solomon, the king of Israel, who prayed for and received wisdom from God.

I think the entire reading is absolutely beautiful, but one line that encapsulates the idea of the whole is, "I preferred [wisdom] to scepter and throne, and deemed riches nothing in comparison with her." For the king, this wisdom is the most desirable possession.

Why is wisdom desirable? Wisdom allows us to see all things in their rightful places. The person who has the gift of wisdom from God understands that God is greater than anything else. The wise person understands that all other things are created by God. I want to be able to see reality in this way so that I can set my priorities in their proper order. This is a necessary part of life for a Christian disciple.

In the Gospel reading this weekend, we hear an example of a person who did not follow the path shown by wisdom. Jesus, who is "the wisdom of God" (1 Cor. 1:24), tells the rich young man, "Go, sell what you have, and give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me." The voice of Wisdom was calling this particular man to give away everything to follow Jesus. The young man, however, was attached to his wealth. He did not "[deem] riches nothing in comparison with [wisdom]." May God give us the wisdom to hear and obey His voice, and to make following His will our greatest priority.

Are you or anyone you know interested in becoming Catholic? This fall, Our Lady of Lourdes is hosting classes for those who are interested in becoming Catholic and who are already baptized Christians themselves. Normally, we believe that to become Catholic you have to do the full RCIA process, which is certainly valuable and informative, but it is a fairly long process, normally taking several months. **If one has been raised and baptized as a practicing Christian, they can become Catholic in a much shorter time frame.** Instead of several months, we are offering seven weekly classes for those interested in becoming Catholic. The last date for this class will be **October 14th**. It will be held in the Enrichment Center at Our Lady of Lourdes on Thursdays, 6:45-8:00pm. As in RCIA, those entering the Catholic Church will need a practicing Catholic to be their Confirmation sponsor. Attending the classes at Our Lady of Lourdes does not mean you have to belong to the parish; instead, you can still be confirmed and belong to another parish of your choice. The date of confirmation would be decided between you and your respective pastor.

If you or someone else you know is Catholic and baptized, but has never been confirmed, this would also be an opportunity to receive the necessary instruction to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

If you know someone who has been interested in becoming Catholic, but has not been able to complete the longer RCIA schedule, then please let them know about this great opportunity! If there are any questions, please email Fr. Trummer.



If we are truly in love with God, then the basics are not going to be enough. That love is going to want to be expressed in going

above and beyond, in leaving the comfortable and familiar, in stretching and growing, and in following a voice other than our own. St. Teresa of Calcutta rightly instructs us that for “love to be real, it must cost, it must hurt, it must empty us of self.” Being in love with God requires more than just checking the boxes of the commandments. It requires a sincere and unconditional self-investment. Desiring God with our whole heart, mind, and soul means that I must also desire a relationship with my neighbor with that same degree of fervor.

Biases and prejudices usually occur when people are kept at a distance and treated as objects. We cannot truly know our neighbors, especially if they are different than us, if we keep them in boxes and do not listen to their stories. When we open ourselves to listen to another person’s story, we begin to realize more how similar we are than dissimilar. Being overly attached to our possessions, ideologies, agendas, lifestyles, and personal needs are absolute barriers to achieving the type of personal investment love demands. This is why following Christ can be difficult. It is less a matter of intellect and more a matter of heart and soul. It requires that we transfer our treasure from an investment in tangible secular things and move it into the Kingdom of God. It is only the gift of wisdom and discernment that can help us decide what to do and how to do it.

Contemporaries of Jesus would know that a camel could not enter through the portal of a city weighed down with the baggage it was carrying. In order to enter, the baggage must be removed so that the animal could fit through the entry way. The same is true for us. We carry a lot of excessive baggage around with us that keeps us tethered to our past histories, wounds, myopic world views, prejudices, fears, and suspicions. To invest ourselves in the Kingdom of God, do God’s work and live out our love relationship with God, we need to shed the extra weight. While it may seem that a lot of that stuff is necessary, it really is not. We are much more than the things that we think define us and more secure than we think. The more there is to hold on to and the more that we carry with us, the harder it will be to leave it all behind. Many choose not to and walk away sad because they are not ready to trust.

Recently, we have shared about Pope Francis’s new Encyclical letters: “Laudato Si” about Caring for Our Common Home (the Earth) and “Fratelli Tutti” about Loving and Caring for Our Brothers and Sisters which means opening our hearts, minds and awareness to all people. It’s never too late to make an earnest and tender start. May we remove from our pockets the stones we intended to throw and cement them together to build a home that welcomes all. May we repent of our indifferences and move into genuine encounter. Instead of drawing battle lines, may we draw our chairs up to a communal table, where we can feast in the knowledge of our shared dignity. May God grant us the holy vision to see in every human being a sacred mystery, and may we love each mystery not abstractly, but concretely. Just as Thomas touched the wounds of Jesus, may we be unafraid to touch the wounds of our suffering neighbor. May we lay down our arms and offer our outstretched hands, until there is no “them” but only “us,” until we are, at last, sisters and brothers, all. Amen.
