FROM THE SEMINARIAN'S DESK



Happy Lent!

Happy first Sunday of Lent!
I hope you have been
enjoying some of the more
Spring-like weather we've
been having over the last
week. Despite the fact

that it is still Winter, with the sun shining and birds singing, you'd think it was already Easter. Thank God for the natural beauty around us as we enter into the desert with Jesus this Lent!

Our world, particularly Ukraine, has been experiencing a deep amount of affliction during the last two weeks. My heart, and the hearts of many people I have talked to, have been saddened, upon hearing reports of escalating violence and aggression, and the real affliction of many thousands of people in eastern Europe. In this experience of evil, we hear the echo of the petition of the Psalm, "Give us joy to balance our affliction!"

There is a line in Psalm 90 that always sticks out to me when I pray it. We pray, "Give us joy to balance our affliction." I think that this petition not only reflects our expectant attitude during the season of Lent, but also reflects the sentiment in the hearts of people all around the world right now.

Lent is a time of entering into planned, personal "affliction" that we call penance. This penance leads us to recognize our dependence on God both by the deprivation of common pleasures through fasting and by deepening our discipleship through prayer and almsgiving.

We see how Jesus deprives himself of earthly food: "He ate nothing during those days [in the desert]." And we see how he is propelled by the Holy Spirit from fasting to proclaiming the good news of the Kingdom of God for the salvation of our souls. He later dies on the cross, and in his resurrection, he is given joy to balance his affliction.

Christ suffers in his people. When Saul was persecuting the early church, Jesus called out to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me!" Paul later writes, "if one member [of the body] suffers, all suffer together" (1 Cor. 12:26). Jesus is not distant to or uninterested in the sufferings of his people. Nor are we unaffected; as members of the body of Christ, we suffer as one. As we enter into Lent, we can spiritually unite ourselves to our suffering brothers and sisters in Europe, begging God to bring them peace, and offering our penance for them.

May we, through our prayer, fasting, and almsgiving, be ever more deeply united to the afflicted and suffering heart of Christ this lent, so that upon our entry into the Easter season after these forty days, we may be given abundant joy to balance our affliction.

"...through him all things were made."

One of my favorite scenes from the live-action series on the lives of the followers of Jesus, The Chosen, is in the first episode of the second season. Jesus is asking John the apostle to help him choose

a scripture passage to read in the synagogue. John suggests the very beginning of the book of Genesis, when God creates the heavens and the earth. Jesus is pleased with the recommendation and replies, "It is a favorite memory." I really enjoyed watching that scene.

Now, this is an imaginative portrayal of Jesus, for this scene is nowhere in the Gospels. What it displays for us, however, is very true. We believe that all things were created through the Word of God, who Jesus is. As we read in the first verses of John's Gospel, "All things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made."

While we generally attribute the creation of the world to God the Father, it would be a mistake to think that the Son and Spirit had nothing to do with it. The Persons of the Trinity do not act alone. Thus, we see in Genesis "the Spirit of God... hovering over the face of the waters." And we read in Psalm 33, also referenced in the scene in The Chosen, "By the word of the LORD the heavens were made, and by the breath of his mouth all their host." So we see that even in the scriptures of the Old Testament, there are signs of the work of all three persons of the Trinity in creation.

All things were made through The Word: the sun and stars, the sky, air, and wind, the dry land, the oceans, all plants and animals, and even all human beings. In a very personal way, even you and I were created by Him. I don't think we often think about it, but he made you. You were made by Him and you are held in being by him.

The same God who made you and holds you in existence is the one who you receive into yourself whenever you receive Holy Communion. He sees you, knows you, and loves you. "Through him all things were made."

Retreat

Retreat for Inner Healing - March 11-13th

During this retreat, we will look at what in our souls and stories prevent us from experiencing the full peace, freedom, joy, and happiness that Jesus offers us. We may have been Catholic Christians our entire lives, but not experience the abundant life that Jesus promises us. This retreat will facilitate an encounter with God's transformative and healing love.

If possible, bring a Bible for the retreat. Non-Catholics are welcome, although there will be Catholic elements such as Mass, Adoration, and Confession. One is not required to attend the entire retreat, although one may miss important information/meditations, as each part of the retreat is part of an integrated whole. Minimum age to be part of the retreat is 18. We plan on using the church building and the school gym (at Lourdes) for our retreat space. Please try to show up ~10min before the start of each day. We will start each day in the gym.

The retreat will span the weekend although it is not an overnight retreat. This schedule gives you a rough idea of how time will be spent. Light breakfast and snacks will be served Saturday and Sunday. Dinner will be provided on Saturday. To sign up you can call 217-877-4404 or email communications@ololchurch.com. 1st Sunday of Lent

One of the greatest temptations human beings face is leaving the truth of who they are, where they came from and who created them in pursuit of more personal satisfactions. When we consider all that desires our attention in a given day, there are many lures that attract us to illusions about ourselves. We can easily find ourselves distracted or tired, preoccupied with preserving our status in life, social relationships, current trends, and corporate demands, and intrigued by pursuing what we perceive to be the "path of least resistance." The daily concerns of life can quickly take our eyes off of our truth, making the empty promises of worldly accomplishments and ideologies seem so attractive. What is at risk in giving into this temptation?

We cease giving thanks to and worshipping our Creator as we pursue our own self-sufficiency, power, and prestige. We replace the true God with a "pet" one. While many do not totally dismiss the idea of God and pretend to remain at least remotely connected, they do not invest themselves heart, mind, and soul in the relationship either. That is why we are so easily swayed. If something attractive comes along, we lunge for it. After all, having a position above and over everyone else is a good thing, isn't it? In more honest moments, many have to admit that they believe this to be true. The Evil One is very convincing. But he can only gain control if we allow him to.

About temptation, St. Basil remarks, "As the pilot of a vessel is tried in the storm, as the wrestler is tried in the ring, the soldier in the battle and the hero in adversity, so is the Christian tried in temptation." And here is found the reason for Lent. It is a wonderful opportunity to get a handle on the attractive lures of illusion that easily captivate us and bring us off track. It is also a time for some honest reflection rooted in prayer, fasting, and selfless giving that can bring us to temptation's remedy: love. Love of his Father gave Jesus resistance. It can do the same for us.






