Getting the Most out of Lent

I don't know about you, but I sometimes find it difficult to keep my spiritual energies up during the season of Lent. Advent seems to be no problem, as it's usually only a few weeks long. The season of Christmas is the same—you blink twice and it's gone. But during the season of Lent, spread out over six weeks, it can be difficult to "keep your head in the game," so to speak.

So how might we get the most out of Lent? How can we apply ourselves to this season of penitence, so that when Easter comes, we can rejoice with full joy at the Resurrection? I can think of a few things...

First, **keep up those Lenten penances!** I think we all struggle sometimes with falling flat on our faces when it comes to whatever act of kindness, extra prayers, or small fasting that we've chosen to practice during Lent. But failing at it *sometimes* probably just means you chose something that stretches you—and the way to continue letting it stretch you is not to give it up at the first signs of failure! Now, don't get me wrong, if you've chosen something extreme and cannot do it, maybe you've chosen poorly and need to regroup and choose another penance. But short of that, just keep at the one you've chosen! A day or two missed doesn't mean that you should just throw in the towel for the rest of Lent. The devil would love nothing more than to make you give it up altogether—don't let him win!

Second, **go to an extra daily Mass every week or try reading the daily Mass readings.** Did you know that the daily Mass readings are available online via the USCCB website (bible.usccb.org)?

Immersing yourself in the prayer of the Church during these "strong" seasons is a great way to enter into the spirit of the season. You could do that by praying with the readings each day or choosing a day or two every week to go to Mass when maybe you wouldn't otherwise go—we have daily Mass at OLOL at 6:30 am (except Thursdays when school is in session, when the Mass is at 2 pm) or at St. Thomas (M-Th) at 5:15 pm. Now *that's* the kind of penance I think the Lord delights to see us try.

Third, try doing something out of the norm to make Lent *different* than every other time of the year. Maybe that means picking a devotion to pray together with your family—or praying before your meal, even when you're in public (I don't know when making the sign of the cross in public became such a thing to be hidden!). Maybe it looks like turning off the TV and getting out the board games or dusting off that book you've been wanting to read for three months, but never seem to find the time. Or almsgiving is that ever-neglected third aspect of our Lenten call to conversion...what would it look like if you chose somewhere to volunteer on a Saturday morning? Or researched a charity that's active in something you're passionate about and gave them your fast-food budget for the week? The Lord, I think, would want us to be creative in making Lent what it is meant to be: a privileged time of turning our minds and lives back to the Lord, "re-orienting" ourselves to the God who made us for communion with Him and with each other.

And hey, if you get any really good ideas, send them my way! I'd love to hear what the Holy Spirit has inspired in you or your family.

"...and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man."

When I was in high school, one of the classes I had to take was a world religions course. Flipping through the textbook offered me a chance to read ancient stories and to see lots of pictures of different gods, goddesses, spirits, ritual practices, and clothing - most of which seemed pretty exotic.

An activity I found to be helpful when reading this book, and even when simply reflecting on the religions of the world, was to pretend that I had never heard anything about the specific religion we were going over. That way, everything I heard was "new" and I think I got a good impression of what an outsider would think of the religion. What surprised me about this process was that of all the religions of the world, Christianity ended up seeming the strangest.

In no other religion is God one, yet three persons. In no other religion did this God who created all things actually become a part of creation by taking on a human nature. In no other religion did God choose to be born of a human woman.

In no other religion did God become the sacrifice for the sake of his people. In no other religion does God continually change bread into himself in order to feed his people. In fact, without the eyes of faith, much of this doesn't even make sense.

Take, for example, this line of the Nicene Creed, "[Jesus] by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man." One of the persons of the Trinity took on human flesh and was born of a Virgin named Mary. Who could have imagined this, or even would have dared to? What was not humanly possible or even imaginable, God did. And he did it in order to free humanity from sin and lead our human nature into his divine life.

Reflecting deeply on the creativity and providence of God in this act of redemption leads the human mind to wonder at God's goodness and power. Our God is a God who created you and would stop at nothing to save you from death, to the point of becoming like you and experiencing death himself. We realize that of all the religions of the world, Christianity possesses the fullness of the Truth, and this reality is more amazing and incredible than anyone could ever have imagined.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Pope Francis has encouraged bishops around the world to engage a process of "synodality", characterized by dialogue, accompaniment, and collaboration among the diocesan leadership, ordained clergy, religious, and lay faithful. In our diocese, we have fully embraced this approach, having completed our Fourth Diocesan Synod of 2017, which involved a comprehensive process of dialogue and discussion, and produced great insights and goals for our diocese to become a community of missionary disciples.

While our official synod process has been completed, we continue to sustain dialogue, listening, and collaboration through avenues such as our Diocesan Pastoral Council, Diocesan Presbyteral Council, Parish Pastoral Visits, and Canonical Visitations. After a pause due to COVID-related restrictions, I recently revived parish pastoral visits and intend to visit all 129 parishes over the next few years.

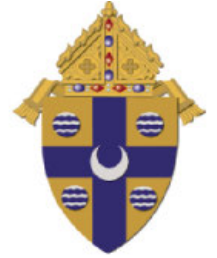
In addition to these important means of sustained dialogue and collaboration, I also intend to host a diocese-wide listening session on **Sunday, March 27th at 2:00pm at Holy Family Catholic Church's Parish Center**. Groups will gather locally in the deaneries and connect together with me and across the deaneries by video. In this session, we will discuss three topics:

1. Five-year reflection of the Fourth Diocesan Synod
2. Reflection on synodality and evangelization
3. Reflection on Challenges to Authentic Discipleship

I look forward to the ongoing dialog across our diocese and the insights we will share in this upcoming listening session.

3rd Sunday of Lent

Deserts can be lonely, isolated, and treacherous places. When a person wanders in a desert, they can easily get disoriented, dehydrated, confused, lost, and vulnerable. Temptation is at its peak, especially when confronted with something that may offer some respite or relief, even a mirage. Deserts can bring us to our weakest moment and tempt our faith. The Christian journey can be described as a desert experience as we vacillate back and forth, falling victim to the mirages of our lives versus the true, life-giving water offered by God. We need a burning bush experience in our lives that convinces us of the power of God and reveals Him as the “I am” of all existence.

Moses was leading his flock across the desert when he found himself at Mount Horeb. Mountains give us a fuller perspective of life, a panoramic view of what would otherwise be hidden from the limitations of our sight. That’s when Moses met God. We have to find our way to a mountain experience where our vantage point can take on a wider view of life. Many things can do this for us: the birth of a child, the death of someone we love, the joy that comes from marveling at the beauty of God’s work, the pondering of life’s mysteries, and the ache of longing found deep within our souls. There are many things in life that can wake us up, give us a clearer, better view of things and become occasions where a bush may burn and God’s presence as the eternal uncreated One is revealed.

God is very patient and gives us the time and space we need to figure things out and bear some good fruit. He doesn’t rush to cut us down or get frustrated with our barrenness. But we have to remember that the desert journeys of our lives come with some risks. The major risk is that we will mistakenly believe that the mirages are real. Thus, we fall victim to thinking that the respite and refreshment we seek is discovered in a place other than where it actually is. Our faith and the life of the Church are the safeguards we need to keep us properly orientated so that we don’t get lost or confused and stay on course.

Flowing from the teaching of the Catholic Church

At this time most people are very concerned about the Ukrainian people, wanting Russia to stop their attacks, and praying for peace in the Ukraine and among all nations. I received the following statement from the Springfield Dominican Sisters. It is from Father Petro S. Balog, Dominican Friar, Associate Director of Thomas Aquinas Institute, Kyiv, Ukraine. “We urge the world to support Ukraine in all possible ways to defend sovereignty and territorial integrity, peace and security.” He continues: “We, citizens of Ukraine of various ethnic identities and citizens of other counties, who live in Ukraine, united in valuing freedom and peace, declare our solidarity and support for Ukraine and condemn the new attempts of the external aggressor to disrupt our peace.”

I encourage us to also pray the 2nd verse of Pope Francis’s prayer, A PRAYER TO OUR CREATOR for the Ukraine people, for their country and for Russia to stop the attacks. May our hearts be open to all the peoples and nations of the earth (esp. the Ukraine people). May we recognize the goodness and beauty that you, God, have sown in each of us, and thus forge bonds of unity, common projects and shared dreams. Amen (Let’s consider what those common projects and shared dreams can be for the Ukraine and for us.)
