FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Upcoming Events

There are a couple of things that I'd like to make you aware of as they unfold in the world around us. I usually leave Church news to the these "touch home" a little, I

think it's good for us all to be informed.

Firstly, you may have heard that the global Church has undertaken, under the leadership of Pope Francis, a global "synod"—as a matter of fact, it's a "synod on synodality." Essentially, what the Pope is asking is that people throughout the world would take part in a process of "synodality" (which comes from the Greek word for "gathering" or "assembly"), which includes dialogue, accompaniment, and collaboration among the diocesan leadership, ordained clergy, religious, and lay faithful. I would like to officially invite anyone who desires to participate in the synod to a listening session to be conducted at Holy Family Parish in Decatur at 2:00 pm this Sunday, March 27.

At this listening session, the Bishop will address all present (virtually, as there are various locations throughout the diocese where these sessions are being held), before those present break out into groups to discuss three key questions, as outlined by the Bishop.

1. We will reflect on the progress we have made in the five years that have passed since we held our Fourth Diocesan Synod in 2017: In what ways are we seeing the fruits of discipleship unfold in our local communities? What essential work remains to be done? What are the challenges and opportunities we see to evangelize and form missionary disciples of Christ?

We will reflect on synodality and 2. evangelization: A synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, 'journeys together.' How is this 'journeying together' happening today in your particular Church? What steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow in our 'journeying together'? What steps does the Spirit invite us to Church news websites, but as take to spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ?

> 3. We will also reflect on challenges to authentic discipleship: Given our negative experience with the loss of Catholic Charities foster care and adoption services 10 years ago due to government mandates contrary to our Catholic faith, how do we prepare for such mandates possibly being imposed on our Catholic schools?

The session will conclude with a group discussion and presentation to the Bishop on the nature of the conversation among those present.

Finally, on a different note, please keep up your prayers for the people of Ukraine! As some of you may have heard, Pope Francis consecrated Russia and the Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary on the afternoon of Friday, March 25-the Solemnity of the Annunciation. The Pope has encouraged bishops, priests, and laity to join their prayers to his, and although the consecration has already taken place—it's never too late to add our prayers to the Holy Father's!

In addition to your prayers (which are extremely necessary!), for those of you who desire to support the people of Ukraine financially, please see the infographic ("How to Support Ukraine") contained in the bulletin for approved Catholic organizations who are supporting the humanitarian and refugee situation as it unfolds in Ukraine.

"My concept of Jesus was no different than my concept of a cartoon character."

A friend of mine once described growing up knowing Jesus like this. When he said it, I thought it was well-put. I thought, for example, of a character like Batman. I can know

so many things about Batman: his real name, how big the Bat-cave is, what kind of car he drives, the names of his different gadgets, and the people he fights. In the end, however, none of this really affects me because I'll never really meet Batman. He is real, in a way, insofar as he is a character with true things about him and false things about him, that someone created. But he never really existed, except on paper, though a child might believe he existed in the real world.

Our experience of Jesus can be much the same. We can know about him: where he came from, that he is the son of God, that he rose from the dead, the names of his friends on earth, what happened to those people, and all the many facts that can be gleaned from the bible. Even so, what makes this different than knowing a list of facts about a cartoon character like Batman? In short, Jesus actually exists - he lived on earth and still lives in heaven, in our hearts, and in every tabernacle on earth.

The Fathers of the Church who wrote the creed did not want Christians to simply know facts about a man named Jesus; they wanted to make sure they knew that he really existed in a particular moment in time. He isn't just the main character in a cool story – he is the main character in world history. For those who wrote the gospels, it was the same. Jesus was not just a character in a fictional story; he was their friend and master who they heard, saw, and touched (1 John 1:1).

Thus, it makes sense that the name of Pontius Pilate is inserted into the creed. The mention of this nonreligious, governmental figure concretizes the incarnation into a moment of time. Jesus existed, and not only did he exist, but we can point to other historical figures who were around at the same time. The story of Jesus is not fiction, but reality. He was truly crucified under Pontius Pilate, the governor of Judea.

4th Sunday of Lent

God's love story reveals itself in our stories, experiences, and aspirations. We are all

prodigal sons and daughters. There are many times in our lives when we would "sell our souls" in order to pursue our passions. We pursued what we wanted without regard for others or God. We have sowed our oats, thrown ourselves into careless pleasures, spent what we know we ought to have saved, turned our backs on those we love and abused gifts we have been given. We even hit bottom and realized the silliness and self-destruction of it all. We needed to come

home. We knew we erred and needed a gentle presence to show us God's unconditional love. This wayward journey home changed us.

As much as we need to be welcomed, we are also the one who needs to do the welcoming and mercy giving. Those we love need our guidance, but they don't always take it. We know that what they are doing is off the mark, self-destructive and wrong. We have to let them go and let it happen, even though they might get hurt. As we wait and hope, they choose to make their way back to us. They don't need us to judge them. They have done enough of that to themselves. We immediately embrace them and are just happy they're home. God uses us to help heal them. Knowing how much we craved understanding and forgiveness ourselves, we can now freely give it away. God uses what he has taught us to teach others.

We are also the entitled ones. At least we "think" we are entitled. After all, we work hard for what we have. We cannot get our heads around the idea that someone can get something that I really deserve! If I do what I'm supposed to do, I ought to be rewarded for that, right? If I do something wrong, I ought to pay the consequences. This is justice, isn't it? This is not God's justice. God is all about love, mercy, compassion, and forgiveness. God's justice is love freely given without merit. We carry the stories of the prodigal son, the unconditional forgiving father, and the entitled angry brother with us. Flowing from the teaching of the Catholic Church

"Texas is Set to Execute Melissa Lucio Despite Credible Claims of Innocence" - This is a recent headline in Texas sent via email by the Death Penalty Action organization whose members are in Texas protesting the execution and promoting Melissa Lucio's innocence.

Melissa Lucio is set to be executed on April 27, 2022. Melissa's defense team is fighting to have her execution withdrawn -but had Texas's social service system done is job, this tragic story might have had a different ending.

Melissa Lucio was convicted of murder in 2008 for the death of her 2-yr-old daughter, Mariah, which she and her family claim was instead a tragic accident. The child fell down some stairs at home and died. Her defense team has filed motions to withdraw Melissa's execution date based on claims of innocence as well as other grounds, including the prosecution's use of a false confession made the night her daughter died. Her attorneys claim this could have been a tragic accident and not a crime. Instead, investigators brought Lucio in for questioning just hours after her daughter's death, despite the already traumatizing events of the day. After hours of maintaining her innocence in the face of aggressive and leading questioning, she finally acquiesced and said, among other ambiguous statements, "I'm responsible for it." Her statement was said to have been made under duress and was the result of her extensive prior history of Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV) having been sexually abused by family members and two husbands. Her case is the subject of a 2020 Hulu documentary, "The State of Texas vs. Melissa." The state prosecutors provided no physical evidence, evewitnesses or prior history of violence. The Child Protective Services records show that Lucio was not violent but struggling to provide for her children. Let's do our part to bring justice for Melissa.

We can pray for justice for Melissa Lucio that her execution be withdrawn, we can watch the documentary - "The State of Texas vs. Melissa" on Hulu to learn more about her case and we can sign the petition to stop Melissa Lucio's execution by going to "Death Penalty Action" website.
