Upcoming Changes

Around this time of year, new priesthood assignments are announced. Many priests stay where they are, but it is also not uncommon for changes to happen. In case you haven't heard, I announced this past weekend that I am receiving

a change of assignment. Starting July 1st, I am going to St. Boniface in Edwardsville. I will be the Parochial Vicar (Assistant Priest), serving with Fr. Jeff Goeckner, the pastor. I will also be assistant chaplain at Fr. McGivney Catholic High School. As I mentioned in my announcement, I am familiar with St. Boniface because I was assigned there as a deacon. Fr. Wayne Stock will be officially assigned here July 1st to take my place, although you will see him serving here with us all now, as he is currently in residence at Our Lady of Lourdes.

With changes of assignment there is a mixture of emotions. There is sadness about leaving a community you have come to know, love, and serve, but also excitement about what the future holds. I want to thank everyone for their love and support. I have always felt welcomed and appreciated in my almost two years here at Our Lady of Lourdes and St. Thomas. You have supported me in so many ways, whether that be affirmations and conversations after Mass, or heartfelt Christmas and birthday cards. Thank you so much!

At this time of the year, there can be maybe some questions, curiosity, or even frustration about changes of assignments. "Why do changes happen?" The personnel board, composed of the Bishop, some priests, and laypeople, all work together to determine where priests should be assigned. As priests retire or move to other parishes, there is a need to rearrange priests according to the needs of the Diocese. There are certainly advantages for a priest to be at a place a long time so that he can come to know people and settle in to where he is assigned. The advantages to moving a priest is to allow for parishes to get to experience a variety of priests, and sometimes moving can give a priest a fresh new start so that he does not become stagnant. Some

priests have certain gifts and personalities that make them a better fit for certain parishes. For newer priests, there is the hope they can get experiences at a variety of parishes to help prepare them to be a pastor. I have mentioned some, but the list is not exhaustive. Some people like assignments changes that happen, while others might find them confusing. Regardless of what one experiences, the personnel board is composed of many people who truly try to make assignment changes for the best of our Diocese.

Although the overall number of priests is not decreasing at Our Lady of Lourdes and St. Thomas, this time of the year is a good reminder of the importance of praying for vocations to the priesthood. Prayer really makes a difference. It is not a vague wish or mustering up a feeling of hopefulness; prayer is powerful. Jesus says in Matthew 9:37-38, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest." God wants us to have an abundance of holy priests, but mysteriously enough, it is something he makes conditioned on our prayer. Whenever I say the meal prayer, I add extra prayers after the normal food blessing. It is a great time to add on little intentions and petitions. The vocation prayer that I seriously encourage you and your families to pray after the meal prayer is this, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few-Master, send laborers for your harvest." The underlined first half can be done by the leader, while anyone else present can do the response in bold, or the entire prayer can be prayed together. It takes literally less than 5 seconds, making it a total of 10-15 seconds a day.

In reality, we ought to pray constantly for a renewal in marriages and families. Good and holy priests come from good and holy families. What does it mean to promote vocations to priesthood or religious life, when many families hardly come to Mass? For that reason, I also pray for a renewal in the life of the families (also done after my meal prayer). I do not say this to be negative, but simply to rally us and encourage us to take our prayer efforts seriously! Remember, Jesus has already won the victory!

"He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead"

Our Lord has ascended to the Father, and we believe that he remains there, close to his Father and close to the hearts

of those who love him. In the end, every Christian looks forward also to the second coming of Jesus. He came once in humility, mostly unseen and unknown. He will come again in glory, and all people will see him. He will come to judge the world. While this teaching has been a part of Christian doctrine from the beginning, the idea of a coming judgment still strikes fear in the hearts of many, even believing Christians.

The twenty-fifth chapter of the Gospel of Matthew provides us with a very colorful portrayal of the judgment of the world. In the final parable, all of humanity is divided like sheep and goats, to the right of the Father and to the left. They are judged by the extent of their love towards the small and weak of the

world. Jesus repeats over and over again that our good actions towards these people are good actions toward him, and our evil actions toward these people are evil actions toward them. This is a loud call to all Christians to examine how we love those around us, particularly the weak and the poor.

If there is anything I am extremely thankful for about the prospect of my death, it is the fact that Jesus will be my judge in the end. He is perfect in every way, peaceful, merciful, loving, just, and true. He is the true judge of men, and his judgments are always right. He knows all things, all thoughts, all desires, and all actions. Everything I have ever done will be known, fully and completely, by this just judge. For the believer, who has persevered in doing good throughout this life, fear has no place here. Let us entrust ourselves to God's never-failing mercy, and grow in grace and in good works. Join us for a photographic exhibition of some of the ancient and modern day Eucharist Miracles, recognized by our Church, that have occurred around the world.

Could it be that God's image has become so soiled and distorted that it is hard for

us to see it? Our self-serving agendas have done a great job twisting God's image into what profits us. We want our agenda to be God's agenda and use prayer as the convincing leverage we need. Worse still, our success and egocentric agenda often erases God's image completely, replacing it with our own. St. Oscar Romero instructs us that the Son of Man "dies on the cross to cleanse God's image, which is soiled in today's humanity, a humanity so enslaved, so selfish, so sinful." Striving to preserve control of our destinies at all costs, we fail to see the risen suffering servant, the Christ, standing right beside us.

Jesus, who suffered and died on a cross and was raised from the dead, corrects our soiled image of God. He shows us God as God is, not who we want to make God to be. God is the God of the poor, the weak, and the marginalized. He is the God who tenderly caresses us when we are suffering and hurting, assuring us that all will be safe and well. He is the God of equity, peace, justice, and compassion who wants happiness for each of His children, desiring their wellbeing and success. God goes where men and women are afraid to go, sitting with the lost, the broken, and the sorrowing. St. Oscar Romero challenges us to illuminate with "Christ's light ... even the most hideous caverns of the human person: torture, jail, plunder, want, chronic illness. The oppressed must be saved." The resurrection calls us to be God's microphone, a messenger, and a prophet (St. Oscar Romero).

Using eyes that see beyond the limited constructs and desires of our world, we can see the true and real Jesus standing before us, calling us to transformation and change.

Asking us more than once, "do you love me?" We are beckoned to give an answer. Answering in the affirmative, it is now our task to feed the sheep and the lambs who belong to God. In short, equipped with the power of the resurrection and a corrected image of God our task is to make things better, brighter, holier, more life-giving, and just for all of God's children. Considering our choices, our interactions, our philosophies, and aspirations, how can we do this?

SOCIAL JUSTICE COMMITTEE NEWS

Flowing from the teaching of the Catholic Church

Melissa Lucio, who was scheduled to be executed Wed., April 27, 2022 in Texas, was granted a stay of execution by the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals. This allows her case to be sent back to the trial court to review new evidence. Advocates throughout the United States and the world led by organizations as the "Death Penalty Action Group", the "Equal Justice USA" and the "Innocence Project" had been asking people to contact the Texas Governor and the Texas Board of Pardons and Paroles to grant her clemency. If you recall, I have shared in the past that Melissa was convicted of murder in 2008 for the death of her 2 yr. old daughter, Mariah, which she had her family claim was instead a tragic accident. The child had fallen down a staircase outside the family's second-floor apartment two days prior to her death.

Melissa will remain on death row despite the stay of her execution according to her legal team. The trial court in Brownsville, TX will hold proceedings to hear the evidence of Melissa Lucio's innocence. The court will then make a recommendation to the Texas Court of Ciminal Appeals, which will decide whether Lucio should receive a new trial. There's still a long way to go in her case and for her to receive an exoneration according to the Innocence Project attorneys. However, a bipartisan majority of the Texas legislature as well as several big name celebrities has called for mercy. Five members of Melissa's jury have come forward recently to say she should get a new trial based on evidence they did not hear at her trial. Let's thank God for all who worked to get this stay of execution for her and continue to pray that she will soon be free. She stated: "I thank God for my life. I have always trusted in Him."


