### **Greetings!**

I have been here for nearly two months now but I know that there are so many of

you that I have not met yet. I hope to tell you a little about myself so that maybe we can find some common connections!

I was born and raised in a small town outside of Vandalia, IL. My parents still live in my childhood home. My oldest sister, Andrea, has twins (6 years old),, a boy and a girl, and she lives with her husband in St Louis, MO. My middle sister, Kim, has a daughter (4 years old) and a son (2 years old). She lives with her husband in Mt Vernon, IL.

After I graduated High School I studied music for one year at a community college before I entered seminary my sophomore year in 2011. I studied Philosophy at Marian University while living at Bishop Simon Brute College Seminary in Indianapolis until 2013. I then studied Theology at St Mary of the Lake University, better known as Mundelein Seminary, being located in Mundelein, IL.

Upon Ordination on May 27, 2017, I was assigned as an assistant (parochial vicar) at the Cathedral in Springfield, IL and chaplain at Sacred Heart Griffin Catholic High School. In 2019 I was named pastor of St Fidelis, St Luke, and St Alexius parishes in Cass County Illinois. I was there for two years until I requested a leave of absence to address depression and anxiety. For six months I have been participating in treatment and I feel that I am ready to minister full time again although I would like to be an assistant again.

Thanks be to God and the graciousness of Fr Friedel and the Diocese for allowing me to begin ministry again here at Our Lady of Lourdes, St Thomas, Millikin University, and St Theresa's. I am very excited about these assignments. I have missed being in parish ministry and beginning July 1 I will be officially assigned here with all of you. Until that time it is likely that you will see me around doing various ministries. Do not hesitate to introduce yourself because I am excited to be here and have had good experiences so far.

#### **4th Sunday of Easter**

"Human beings, while capable of the worst, are also capable of rising above

themselves, choosing again what is good, and making a new start." (Pope Francis) We have a difficult time figuring out what is true and best for us. There are many voices talking and so many trying to get our attention. We wrongly convince ourselves that the true voice is the voice of progress, the one that speaks of contemporary wants and desires, enticing us with the latest trends and causes. We are taught, by listening to the voices around us, that truth is found in feelings and thought, and ideals must match current and popular human wants. Because we feel a particular way it must be true. Then, we find a shepherd who empathizes with us and affirms us. We follow that voice even though listening to that voice will render us powerless and lead us to harm. There are many with me in this procession to this pasture. I must be on the

right path and listening to the right voice.

We are very confused. What can keep us safe and from harm? Where do we go to find life, love, and happiness? Jesus tells us that he is the way, the truth, and the life. The only way to get to Truth, who is God, is through him. There is no other way. The Church, the gate around God's pasture of life, is charged with the mission of directing us where God desires that we go. In the midst of all of the conflicting voices around us, the voice of truth is often muffled in all of the noise, but it beckons us to a life of virtue and grace. Helping us understand who we are and where we have to be, it discerns the voice of God, providing us with the safety net we need to stay straight on our path to life eternal.

We have to trust the voice of God, the true Shepherd, even when it does not mirror what we want and what others may believe. Faith goes way beyond feeling and involves a radical trust in Someone who can lead us and form us. At day's end, if we do not know to find our way home, we will be truly lost.

### Flowing from the teaching of the Catholic Church

Melissa Lucio, who was scheduled to be executed Wed., April 27, 2022 in Texas, was granted a stay of execution by the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals. This allows her case to be sent back to the trial court to review new evidence. Advocates throughout the United States and the world led by organizations as the "Death Penalty Action Group", the "Equal Justice USA" and the "Innocence Project" had been asking people to contact the Texas Governor and the Texas Board of Pardons and Paroles to grant her clemency. If you recall, I have shared in the past that Melissa was convicted of murder in 2008 for the death of her 2 yr. old daughter, Mariah, which she and her family claim was instead a tragic accident. The child had fallen down a staircase outside the family's second-floor apartment two days prior to her death.

Melissa will remain on death row despite the stay of her execution according to her legal team. The trial court in Brownsville, TX will hold proceedings to hear the evidence of Melissa Lucio's innocence. The court will then make a recommendation to the Texas Court of Ciminal Appeals, which will decide whether Lucio should receive a new trial. There's still a long way to go in her case and for her to receive an exoneration according to the Innocence Project attorneys. However, a bipartisan majority of the Texas legislature as well as several big name celebrities have called for mercy. Five members of Melissa's jury have come forward recently to say she should get a new trial based on evidence they did not hear at her trial. Let's thank God for all who worked to get this stay of execution for her and continue to pray that she will soon be free. She stated: "I thank God for my life. I have always trusted in Him."

### PARISH COMMUNITY



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This May, our diocese will take up a collection for the Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC). Please prayerfully consider supporting the collection this year. Fifty percent of collected funds stay in the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois and the other 50 percent support communications projects in the United States and around the world. Let me share with you some examples that show the impact of your generosity to the CCC.

The past couple of years, we have had several major announcements that were critical for the people of our diocese. This included information about how our parishes and schools would operate during the pandemic. There were also exciting announcements about The Evermode Institute coming to Springfield, the Norbertine Fathers from Orange California coming to staff The Evermode Institute and having all Confirmations and First Holy Communions at the Cathedral, among other positive announcements. We also hosted a diocesan wide listening session via livestream in March in response to Pope Francis' upcoming Synod on Syondality. Catholic Times put together a special edition dedicated solely to the sacrament of confession in hopes of encouraging people to go receive forgiveness from God, helping them face their fear, providing a step-by-step instruction, and printing confession times in our diocese.

Over the past year, our diocese has been able to build upon several popular media endeavors and create new video series that are helping people better connect with our faith. Things like Hey, Father!, 73 Questions, The Benuh; Series, and Dive Deep, the official podcast of the Diocese of Springfield in Illinois, continue to grow and we have received many comments from lay Catholics about them learning something new or helping them grow in their relationship with Christ. Videos were also created to help children and parents prepare for coming to the Cathedral for Confirmation and First Holy Communion. We are also livestreaming Masses from the Cathedral every Sunday and for each Confirmation Mass.

Followers on the diocesan social media channels continue to grow. Our channels have far more followers than most dioceses our size, and several that are two to three times as big as our diocese. That shows that the communications content our curia team is producing is engaging, inspirational, and educational, and people want to consume it because it is helping them. With your generosity, we can continue these popular initiatives and bring people closer to our faith or even back to our faith.
