Gospel Reflections... ORDINARY TIME IN THE CHURCH

Ordinary does not mean unimportant, bland, bland, colorless. Simply, with this name you want to distinguish it from the "strong times", which are the Easter and Christmas cycles with their preparation and their prolongation.

It is the oldest time in the organization of the Christian year. And also, it occupies most of the year: 33 or 34 weeks, of the 52 there are.

Ordinary Time has its particular grace that we must ask of God and seek it with all the illusion of our life: just as in this Ordinary Time we see an already mature Christ, responsible for the mission entrusted to him by his Father, we see him grow in age, wisdom and grace before God his Father and men, we see him come and go, go out of his way to fulfill the Will of his Father, offer himself to men ... so also we in Ordinary Time must seek to grow and mature our faith, our hope and our love, and above all, to fulfill with joy the Most Holy Will of God. This is the grace that we must seek and implore from God during these 33 weeks of Ordinary Time.

Grow up. Grow up. Grow up. He who does not grow, stagnates, becomes ill and dies. We must grow in our ordinary tasks: marriage, in spiritual life, in professional life, at work, in study, in human relationships. We must also grow in the midst of our sufferings, successes, failures. How many virtues can we exercise in all this! Ordinary Time thus becomes an authentic gymnasium to meet God in daily events, exercise ourselves in virtues, grow in holiness ... and everything becomes a time of salvation, a time of God's grace. Everything is grace for those who are attentive and have faith and love!

The spirit of Ordinary Time is well described in the Sunday preface VI of the mass: "In you we live, move and exist; and still pilgrims in this world, we not only experience the daily tests of your love, but we already have the future life as a pledge, because we hope to enjoy the eternal Passover, because we have the firstfruits of the Spirit by which you raised Jesus from among the dead".

This Ordinary Time is divided into two "tandas". A first, from after the Epiphany and the baptism of the Lord until the beginning of Lent. And the second, from after Pentecost to Advent.

I invite you to take advantage of this Ordinary Time with great fervor, with hope, growing in the theological virtues. It is a time of grace and salvation. We will meet God in every corner of our day. It is enough to have eyes of faith to discover it, not to live short-sighted and locked in our egoism and problems. God is going to pass our way. And during this time we look at that apostle Christ, who prays to his Father from early on, and later during the day he goes out of his way bringing salvation to all, ending the day surrendered at the feet of his Father, who comforts him and fills him with his infinite love, of that love that the next day will communicate in abundance. If we are not enthusiastic about the apostle Christ, full of strength, love and vigor... who will we be enthusiastic with?

Christ, let us accompany you during this Ordinary Time, so that we can learn from you how to behave with your Father, with others, with the prosperous or adverse events of life. Come with you, who will we fear? We want to be holy to sanctify and uplift our world.
