

Gospel Reflections... Dear friends,

Recently, we celebrated the Epiphany of the Lord. Although it was just a few weeks back, it seems so long ago. In the Gospel from Matthew we heard about how the magi traveled a great distance from the East in search of the newborn king. The magi show us that God took on flesh for not a select few, but the entire world. They highlight God's invitation to all humanity in a new covenant through the Incarnation. This past Tuesday, January 18th, we began the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. It concludes on Tuesday, January 25th. Although the Roman Catholic Church, Orthodox, and Protestant churches may differ on various theological topics, there is indeed a common ground in which we can come together in prayer. Certainly, the pandemic is one cross that we've all carried for some time now. Beyond this cross, there are extremely difficult and disastrous situations throughout the world that call us to a unity as the Body of Christ. Through the power of prayer we can demonstrate the Christian unity to which Christ calls us and remain in solidarity with those who carry heavy burdens in places of violence, famine, and disaster. Though many parts, we are one body. As one body, may we be more focused on Christ, our Head.

Closer to home, we remember every January 22nd, a Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children. Since the U.S. Supreme Court's 1973 decision in Roe v. Wade, over 60 million children have been robbed of the gift and right to life. Disguised as beneficial, this disgraceful legislation allowing legal abortion has cast a dark shadow over our nation and the entire world. The Holy Father has stated that these children bear the face of Jesus Christ. To secure peace and security in our world, we must see the face of Christ in each other which calls us to a deeper honor and respect for the sacredness of all human life. I would like to take a moment to offer my appreciation for the Pregnancy Support Center of Dodge County located in Beaver Dam. In their commitment to upholding the dignity and value of the unborn, men and women from the area go to great lengths to support mothers and their babies in times of distress. I encourage everyone to get to know this organization and the wonderful work that they quietly perform on a daily basis.
