

You Are Cordially Invited...

Most wedding banquets require an invitation. The Wedding Feast of the Lamb of God is no different (see Matthew 22:1-14). As Jesus said, "The kingdom of heaven may be likened to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son." Who wouldn't love to attend the joyful celebration that lasts forever? It would be, but sadly it turns out that very few people respond to God's invitation.

Some outright refuse. Others ignore God and go their own way. The rest of the crowd actually beat up and kill the inviters who are the servants of the Lord. So the king takes a second try, inviting a whole new crowd to fill the hall with his guests. Is it a happy ending now? Not quite.

When the king came in to meet the guests he saw a man there not dressed in a wedding garment. He said to him, 'My friend, how is it that you came in here without a wedding garment?' But he was reduced to silence. Then the king said to his attendants, 'Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the darkness outside, where there will be wailing and grinding of teeth.' Many are invited, but few are chosen.

You see, it's not enough to be invited to the wedding banquet. It's not enough to accept the invitation. It's not even enough to show up. Christ is reminding us that we must be prepared to meet him and celebrate his wedding. He is ready and willing to help us, but still, we must be prepared. Where do we get our wedding garment? How do we prepare?

It starts in Baptism, where our robes are washed clean in the Blood of the Lamb and we are clothed in the stunning, spotless grace of God (Rev 7:13-14). Since this happens in our sacraments, our church law says that "Any baptized person not prohibited by law can and must be admitted to holy communion." (Canon 912) Baptism is the start and then we train our baptized children to understand the mystery of Christ as best as they can. This is so that they can receive Jesus' Body with faith and devotion (Canon 913). Parents and pastors work together in this preparation, and when they do they fulfill a duty entrusted to them by God. This preparation also includes first receiving the mercy of Jesus in the sacrament of Confession (Canon 914).

What are some of the other preparations we need to receive Christ in the Supper of the Lamb? Every time we receive Holy Communion we need to abstain for at least one hour from any food and drink, except for water and medicine. If we are sick or elderly, we can receive the Most Holy Eucharist even if we have eaten something within the preceding hour. Even those who care for the sick and the elderly can dispense with the hour of fasting (Canon 919).

These practices prepare us for when we grow older and if we should fall into a serious or mortal sin. As Canon 916 says:

A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to celebrate Mass or receive the body of the Lord without previous sacramental confession unless there is a grave reason and there is no opportunity to confess; in this case the person is to remember the obligation to make an act of perfect contrition which includes the resolution of confessing as soon as possible.

Sometimes people have no spirit of repentance and stubbornly stick to grave sins that everyone knows about. Canon 915 says, those who "obstinately [are] persevering in manifest grave sin are not to be admitted to holy communion."

People argue about Communion and who should receive it. There arguments are really with our Lord. When we go to the Scriptures and accept all the words of Christ as he teaches us in his Church, we are letting Christ prepare us for Holy Communion. Our church law is an application of the teaching of Christ. Our Communion preparation is an expression of the inspired words of St. Paul who says we must not profane the Body and Blood of our Lord by receiving him unworthily (1Cor11:26-32). Instead, we should examine ourselves, then prepare ourselves to receive Jesus worthily. "Many are invited but few are chosen." So let us accept the invitation of the Lord and then let us prepare ourselves by his grace to receive him. You are cordially invited to the Wedding Feast of Christ and his Bride the Church! Blessed are those who are called to the Supper of the Lamb. Even more blessed are those who have prepared themselves to receive Him worthily.






