



Dear Parishioners,

What the heck is a Mission? What a great question. Come next week and find out. Our Mission Leader will be preaching at the Masses and then leading us Sunday, Monday, and Tuesday nights from 6:15 to 7:30 pm.

But what the heck is a Mission? We have our "Mission" statement: God calls us to be disciples and forms us by our Catholic faith to Encounter Christ, Embrace deeper faith, and Empower Christian action. We have restructured our office and committee to reflect our Mission statement and we are asking ourselves how does our "Mission" empower you to act. The word "mission" is to give us a purpose, a shared way to go forward to do something in the world.

But where do you go on Mission? The word "mission" typically causes us to think about going off to some foreign country or "mission trip" for the youth. This past week, our Empowering Christian Action Committee looked into this very question and we invited Fr. Tom Aschemann and Fr. Long Phi Nguyen from the Divine Word Seminary in Epworth to help us reflect upon what "mission" looks like today. Divine Word Seminary is a seminary dedicated to forming "missionary" priests and sisters and they have been thinking seriously about the modern context of mission. Here is a summary of what they shared with us.

They no longer associate "mission" with geography. The word "mission" indicates a way of living—a going out to our neighbor, especially those different from ourselves, with the goal of building a friendship. They held up Jesus as the model of encounter. In keeping it simple, they said Jesus built friendships and we are called to do the same.

They would say we are sent on a mission in our daily lives: to visit the lonely in a nursing home, to address needs in the workplace, to reach out to those in the local community we do not know, and to recognize the importance of friendship in our lives.

It is a different understanding of friendship for me. Typically, friendship connotes those I know, I share a history, and they make me comfortable. Their understanding struck the whole committee as a challenge and yet, a more meaningful understanding of mission. It is not a one time trip somewhere or trying to fix someplace by our gifts; it is a willingness to possibly form a friendship with a stranger.

The image they left us with was Jesus and the Samaritan woman (John 4). Jesus encountered her as a stranger and formed a transformative friendship. Does this help us think about "mission" and our Mission coming up? We gather and encounter hope together and we are empowered to go out and share that hope with any person we meet. Our mission is to be ambassadors of hope to those around us and to those who we would currently think of as strangers.

I look forward to seeing how all this talk of mission bears fruit.


