

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

I am delighted to share with you that St. Jerome will continue to be a teaching parish for our seminarians at St. Francis de Sales Seminary in Milwaukee. Over the years we have had a number of seminarians with us, and I am eager to continue this strong tradition. We will be joined by Julian Druffner, a seminarian for the Diocese of Superior, WI, who is studying at St. Francis de Sales Seminary in Milwaukee. You will get an opportunity to meet Julian in the weeks ahead, and keep an eye out for biographical information on Julian in the bulletin.

We must continue to support vocations to the priesthood — beginning with a strong Catholic foundation set in the home, and reinforced by prayers and encouragement of religious vocations in the pew. Our Lord Himself said, "The harvest is abundant, but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest" (Luke 10:2). It is imperative that we continue to pray in supplication to our Lord for vocations to the priesthood and religious life!

The statistics show that over 80% of men who enter seminary were asked by a trusted individual, such as a parish priest or a family member: "Have you ever considered a call to the priesthood?" That was certainly true in my life. The first time I began thinking about the priesthood was when my pastor asked me that very question, and I am forever grateful that he did! If there's someone you think could be called to the priesthood, ask him if he has ever considered it. It certainly won't hurt! I am a strong believer that every young man should consider the priesthood in their prayerful discernment of what vocation God might be calling them to. Even if they aren't called to the priesthood, perhaps their friend will be, or their son, or grandson — and having discerned themselves, they will be more understanding and supportive of the call.

On top of all that, the single greatest mission of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee is our seminary — St. Francis de Sales Seminary. Before we can have the sacraments, before we can have parishes, we must have priests — and it is the seminary that forms men into suitable priests to serve our parishes. Our seminary is doing a fantastic job! The men who are being admitted and ordained are exceptional in character, highly gifted, and eager to serve the faithful of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee.

The seminary needs your support to continue its vital mission! I mentioned this past weekend that the Annual Seminary Dinner is scheduled for September 24th. I would love to have strong representation from St. Jerome. The seminary should know that we want to be directly involved in the quality formation that our men receive, so that we will have solid priests for years to come! If you are interested in financially supporting the seminary by attending the annual dinner, please contact the parish office. It would be great to have a number of St. Jerome tables fill the ballroom! In any event, please continue to pray for vocations and for our seminarians, and let's continue to make St. Jerome a strong support of priestly vocations in the Archdiocese of Milwaukee!



Our St. Jerome Maintenance Ministry volunteer group has been operating now for about three months. Most of what has been done is outside the church in the landscape area. The teakwood benches have been sealed, dead trees removed, trees trimmed, stone edging installed around flower beds on the north and east side of church, and new mulch spread on all flower beds.

We are working on clearing out the plot between the driveway and the parking lot and planting grass in its place. We will also be adding water distribution pipes to select rain gutter downspouts to keep the mulch from being washed away, and we will put a 12" wide gravel shoulder along each side of the driveway and replant grass next to it.

The group meets Wednesday mornings following the 8:00 a.m. Mass (approx. 8:30 a.m.) at the canopy entrance for a short social time and discussion of work to be completed on that day. We then work on job assignments and complete our work by noon.

Bring your own hand tools for the job you will be doing — hammer, screwdriver, etc. We will provide any necessary specialty tools.

Meeting dates include: August 25, September 1, 8, 15, 22 & 29 — meet at the church canopy entrance at 8:30 a.m. We look forward to welcoming you to our ministry. ALL ARE WELCOME. Traveling Crucifix

Safeguarding All God's Family

Per the Archdiocesan Safe Environment Office, all persons requiring training (teachers, catechists, teacher aides, health room, playground, school parents and school volunteers) should register for one of the virtual training sessions until in-person training can be safely resumed. This is a mandatory one-time training for EVERYONE over 18 years of age



— including moms AND dads — who works/volunteers in any capacity with minors in Catholic schools or parishes. *NOTE: All school parents are required to take this training.

To register for an upcoming virtual training session (available in English or Spanish), go to http://Milwaukee.CMGconnect.org

You will need to register for a new account with your name, a username and password; then on the next page under "Initial Live Training Only — Safe Environment Curriculum" click on "Start Curriculum" to register for the online training session of your choice. (Note: At this time there are nine virtual sessions to choose from scheduled in August.)

This training must be completed PRIOR to volunteering in any way with our St. Jerome school or faith formation children.

As of June 1, 2020, all safe environment education training sessions will be conducted virtually in accordance with the guidelines laid out in the Catholic Comeback matrix. Participants will register for a session using the same process as an in-person session, and will be emailed the session log-in information 48 hours prior to the session. (There is no fee associated with this one-time training.)


