



It is no secret that familiarity with Scripture is something that is notoriously lost among Catholics, at least with respect to Christians of other denominations. Perhaps this is because, unlike Christians of other denominations, the Catholic Church sees Divine Revelation as both Scripture AND Tradition. We hold the sacred texts of Scripture to be divinely inspired, but that is not the sole font of Divine Revelation. We also hold Tradition as another means by which the Holy Spirit inspires the church. Nevertheless, there is no excuse for any Catholic to be unfamiliar with Scripture. As I'm sure you've heard our patron, St. Jerome, quoted: "ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ."

How often we lament that we do not hear God speaking to us, especially in time of suffering. "Where are you, Lord!?" is a question that often arises in the human heart. And yet, we have God's literal Word given to us in Sacred Scripture. If ever you want to know what God has to say, open the Bible! The Word is living, and therefore, it speaks to our heart.

Perhaps it is true that many individuals feel a bit daunted when praying with Scripture. They don't know where to begin. *Lectio Divina* is an ancient practice in the Church that helps us to pray with Scripture. In short, *lectio divina* (or "divine reading") involves four easy steps. First, read the Scriptures. The New Testament, especially the Gospels, is a good place to start for those who are newer to praying with Scripture. Read it very slowly, a few times over. Second, take some time to reflect on the meaning of the passage — what was the author intending to say? As Catholics, we read Scripture under the umbrella of the Tradition of the Church. It is not up to any one individual to make conclusions, but to do so obediently through the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Third, respond to the text personally. Ask yourself, "What does this passage mean to me?" Here is where the text becomes pertinent to the individual. As I mentioned, the Word is alive, so it speaks to us each in different ways and at different times. Once you have done that, the final step is to rest in contemplation with God. Allow all that you have read and thought to be a catalyst for a conversation with God. Don't forget to allow Him to speak to your heart as well! It's not a monologue, but a conversation. Allow some time for silence and rest with the Word.

Above all, we owe it to ourselves to spend time with Scripture. This month of the Holy Rosary is a reminder that our Traditions and prayers are very Scriptural in nature. The Rosary is comprised of prayers that are taken from Scripture. The Our Father, "Hail Mary full of grace," "Blessed are you among women," are all taken directly from Scripture. Our Lady is the one who leads us to her Son, and there is no more direct place to encounter the Lord than in His Word.

"Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." If you seek the Lord, you can find Him in His Word. Let us not be ignorant of Scripture, so as not to be ignorant of Christ.






