

PASTORAL MESSAGE FROM FR. SUBI THOMAS



God made us to share the Gospel of love and compassion with a world in need. Last weekend and this weekend are what we call: "Mission Appeal Weekend" in our Parishes. These weekends not only offer the opportunity for a better awareness of our struggling brothers and sisters worldwide, but it also gives us a chance to partner with a mission. This year we are partnering with the MCBS Mission Team in ministering to our brothers and sisters in Tanzania, Africa.

As with the Apostles, the first missionaries of Christ's message of hope, we are called to proclaim that "He is not here but has risen" (Luke 24:6). Pope Francis in his World Mission Day 2021 message reminds us of our call to proclaim the love of Christ. Even in times of persecution and hardship, the

Apostles and first Christians fervently declared Christ's hope. We can look to these brave and faithful men and women as examples.

Missionaries provide hope and care to people experiencing Christ for the first time and to Christians who may be isolated or facing great challenges. Responding to the Mission Appeal is an opportunity for reaffirming that our prayer and material donations are, as Pope Francis says, ways "to show compassion, the 'sacramental' of God's closeness to us, a closeness that abandons no one along the side of the road."

"To be on mission is to be willing to think as Christ does, to believe with him that those around us are also my brothers and sisters," Pope Francis says.

As Catholics, we all have a shared responsibility to support our Church's work. And although we cannot all be a missionary; we can fulfill our obligation through prayers and generous support of our Missions. Your support makes a difference in the lives of our brothers and sisters.

ANNUAL MISSION APPEAL

This year our annual mission appeal will be from Fr. Subi's Order, The Missionary Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament. Fr. Subi's long time friend, Fr. Bobby will be speaking at our parishes on behalf of the Order.

The Missionary Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament (MCBC) is a religious congregation of men in the Catholic Church committed to the service of God and their brethren. It was founded on 7 May 1933 in Kerala, India. Since its founding, the Congregation has extended its mission territories to different parts of India and abroad.

We began our mission in Tanzania, Africa in 2009, at present we have 22 priests and 26 nuns working in this mission. We are engaged mainly in pastoral, education, health care and social work activities. We have 8 large parishes and 82 outstations, and around 65,000 people benefit from our mission work in Tanzania.

Ministries (projects) that the Order is working on are: Pastoral Ministry, Clean Drinking Water, Agriculture, Assistance for Women and Children, Food Supply for the Elderly, Homes for the Homeless and Tution Programs.

Fr. Bobby will be preaching at all the Masses at St. Peter Claver this weekend July 16 & 17, to explain the work of the Missionary Congregation of the Blessed Sacrament.

We will accept donations for the Mission Appeal through the end of July. Donations can be dropped in the Sunday collection at all three parishes or brought to the Parish Office.

Franciscan Peacemakers is the parish outreach charity for July. Franciscan Peacemakers offers help to women in 4 principal ways:

Connection: Five mornings a week, Franciscan Peacemakers bring bag lunches, hygiene products, warm clothes, and empathetic presence to women on the street. The Hospitality Center also provides respite and peer support for women.

Employment: Survivors are provided living wage jobs in their Social Enterprise which manufactures and sells all natural bath and body products. (You are welcome to view and purchase these products on their website www.franciscanpeacemakers.org

Housing: Clean and sober living community provides two years of free housing and holistic support for women in recovery from sexual exploitation and substance addiction.

Advocacy: Staff and board provide education to parishes, schools, and community groups to raise awareness about human trafficking.

COMMISSION AND COMMITTEE SPOTLIGHT

The Spiritual Life and Worship (SLW) Commission is a Tri-Parish commission composed of both Tri-Parish staff and lay members. The Staff members include a Priest member, currently Fr. Subi, our two Deacons, the Directors of Music from each of the three Parishes, and the Sacristans. Current lay members are Judy Hittman, Ralph Maffongelli, and Jim Harriman, Chair. New co-chairs as of June 2022 are Chuck Yurk and Jerry Hittman

SLW is charged with planning various Liturgies, including the major Feasts, such as Christmas, Easter, Pentecost, as well as other seasonal Liturgies. Decisions involve which optional readings will be used, processions, incense, number of Masses and their times.

One of our main goals is to try to make our Liturgies as meaningful as possible for our parishioners and guests. We are always looking for new members, or in hearing from all of you in how we can enhance our Liturgical celebrations.

STEWARDSHIP THOUGHTS

Be Ready for God to "Stop By"

In my experience, most people can be divided into two groups: those who are old enough to remember when you kept food on hand for company, and those who aren't.

For those of you in the latter group, let me explain. Before text messaging and social media made us all unconditionally, mercilessly reachable, people would do this thing called "stopping by." They would be passing by a friend's house, maybe on the way home from work or shopping, and they would just ... stop. With no warning. No notice whatsoever. "I was just in the neighborhood," they would say. I remember my mother and I would do this on many a Saturday. It wasn't an everyday occurrence, but it was common enough that you had to be ready.

"Crazy," you might exclaim. "People just appeared on your doorstep? How did you cope with the uncertainty?" Well, most of us had moms who kept a little something on hand to eat or drink that was extra nice, just in case anyone stopped by. That way, we were always ready.

Today's readings are about a lot of things: prayer, hope, redemptive suffering. They're about what it means to be a Christian, and not just what it means to do Christian things. Most of all, though, they're about readiness. If God showed up at your door, would you be ready for Him? Would you be ready for what He gives you, or what He takes away? Would you be ready for Him to interrupt the plans you have for yourself? To disrupt the idea you carry in your mind of what a servant or a steward is supposed to be?

Read your Bible. Say your rosary. Go to Mass. Get to Confession. Talk to God — every day, not just when you think you need Him. That way, you are always ready.




