



Pastor's Corner by Fr. Joe Noonan

The Gospel of Matthew introduces us to the Magi most often depicted as three kings in Catholic art and decoration. However, scripture does not set a number for the Magi. Often the number of Magi is said to be three for their three gifts offered to Jesus: gold, frankincense and myrrh. The term "Magi" describes an ancient caste of Persian priests educated in the natural sciences. The common reference of "wise men" is from their training and study of natural science including astronomy. In their regular pursuit of astral observances they saw a star like none other. They felt this tremendous star indicated the birth of a new king and spurred them on to follow where it led. Through this star's appearance God revealed Jesus as a new born king. The supernatural knowledge of Jesus' birth came to the Magi from the Holy Spirit.


The Magi were gentiles indicating God reaching to both Jews and gentiles to discover the messiah. They understood Jesus is more than an earthly king as they "fall down and worship" him. Prostrating is an act reserved for the worship of God. The Magi were the first gentiles to believe in the Jewish messiah as God and the Savior of all people. This universality of salvation was addressed by St. Paul in our second reading today (Ephesians 3:2-6).

The Magi may or may not have been "kings". This title or role appears to have been a later addition to the tradition surrounding them. However, the notion that kings came to acknowledge that Jesus is the Savior of all humanity and depict that all kingdoms and kings submit to Jesus who is the King of Kings and the Lord or Lords. In Jesus, God enters into his own creation in order to welcome every people and nation to pursue a loving relationship with Him.

The Magi are a threefold example for us to follow. First, the Magi accepted God's invitation to discover Jesus. Seek God's invitation to you this year to pursue Jesus daily. Second, the Magi were open to God's guidance and pursued with courage and hope where God directed them. Pray to the Holy Spirit for guidance. Then listen and have the courage to follow the right path even when it is hard. The Magi did! Third, the Magi worshipped Jesus. Worship is the highest form of prayer. Worship opens our souls to the presence of God like nothing else. The Magi were initially inspired to pursue God by observing nature, the stars. They left their star gazing once they discovered God in the person of Jesus Christ. We might be inspired by the beauty of nature. Like the Magi, let nature inspire you to discover the Creator, the author of life. Nature is incredible to behold but a mere reflection of God's beauty.

The Magi returned by another route to safeguard Jesus, Mary and Joseph. A spiritual reading of this indicates they were changed by their meeting with Jesus. No longer could they walk the same path or go back to their old way of life. They had new meaning and a new direction to follow. Not only our souls but the soul of our nation seemingly is in need for this redirection toward Christ. Many prayers are needed for those who have rejected Jesus or His Church to fill the infinite hunger for their creator with finite things or causes.

The Magi embody our human longing for God and innate need to worship him. In this new year rediscover Jesus Christ in the spirit of the Magi. Plan intentionally to spend the time to travel and journey interiorly in daily prayer, worship at daily and Sunday Mass or get away from the noise as the Magi did and go on a retreat or day of reflection. You too might then end the year by taking a different route or path in a life changed, faith deepened guided not by a star but by the very light of Christ.

"Rising very early before dawn, he left and went off to a deserted place, where he prayed." Mark 1:35


Jesus often went off by Himself to pray. We know that after Jesus was baptized by John He went into the desert for forty days to fast and pray before beginning His public ministry. We also see how that prayer strengthened Him against the temptations of the devil (Luke 4:1-13).

Luke 5:16 simply states, "He often retired to deserted places and prayed." Before Jesus chose the twelve apostles, he prayed. "Then He went out to the mountain to pray, spending the night in communion with God. At daybreak he called his disciples and selected twelve of them to be his apostles."

Even though He was God, He needed to converse with His Father. Jesus came to this world to show us how to live, and how to pray. Jesus drew strength from prayer. We can too. How much more do we need to come to God with our questions, concerns and gratitude?

Perhaps we can each try to be more like Jesus in the coming year by carving out a space for prayer in our busy schedules - *daily*. Don't set yourself up for failure by trying to pray the rosary every day if you are currently not a daily pray-er. Start small. Prayer Vigil for the Legal Protection of the Unborn

The Supreme Court decisions in *Roe v Wade* and *Doe v Bolton* legalized abortion in every state on January 22, 1973. Previously, abortion law had been a State issue. The Supreme Court is once again considering abortion law in the ongoing legal case of Dobbs v Jackson Health in Mississippi. A decision is not expected until June 2022. Until then, Christians across the nation are uniting in prayer for the legal protection of the Unborn.

Chicago's March for Life Saturday, January 8, 2022 The Largest Pro-Life Event in the Midwest


