Pastor's Corner by Fr. Joe Noonan

This weekend marks the sad anniversary of the Supreme Court decision, Roe vs. Wade, which along with Doe v Bolton, legalized abortion in all 50 states on January 22, 1973. Previously, abortion law had been a state issue. Since then, millions of unborn children have been aborted in the USA; while over a million Americans wait on lists to adopt babies, and others seek adoption outside the country.

Our Christian response to this act of violence is non-violence and love. Our parish staff member, Connie Swidergal, is among the 400,000 to 500,000 Christians gathered in Washington D.C. this weekend to peacefully march and pray. Major networks will ignore or down play the Pro-Life march. Your prayers, joined with Connie's and those in Washington D.C., are needed now more than ever. Currently, the Supreme Court is once again considering abortion law in the ongoing legal case of Dobbs v Jackson Health in Mississippi. A decision is not expected until June 2022, but the time to pray is now. Christians across the nation are uniting in prayer for the legal protection of the Unborn.

Do you have uncertainties about changing the current abortion laws? Questions? Please visit our parish website and choose the menu "PRAYING FOR LIFE." There are many links to helpful websites and resources exploring the issue of abortion. Information on the Dobbs case and the Catholic Bishops' statement on abortion can also be found there. Printed materials outlining the Dobbs case and the Catholic Bishops' statement on Roe v Wade can be found in the information rack in our church narthex.

Thank you to everyone who participated in the Pro-Life Prayer Novena of Rosaries this past week and Saturday's Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of the Unborn. Please continue to pray and offer sacrifices for the unborn and their moms.

Prayer and local action can greatly help women in need, too. Consider helping pregnant women in need by volunteering at or donating to a pregnancy help center. The Women's Center has a location at 9730 S. Western Avenue, Evergreen Park. You can learn more about them and the assistance they offer moms in

need at their website: abortionchoices.com for ways to help women in need. Aid for Women, another excellent pregnancy support center, is highlighted in this bulletin on pg. 8.

Love is also the ultimate response for those adversely harmed by abortion. God loves them. God is always there for them. God desires to heal and forgive. Every year the love, grace and healing of God is offered through Project Rachel to help women and men victimized by abortion. Please encourage those harmed by abortion to contact one of the compassionate counselors at Project Rachel by calling 312-337-1962 or 888-456-HOPE. God loves all his children. No child is an accident but a singular miracle of God. Likewise, when we commit grave mistakes such as abortion, God never stops loving us and desires to heal, forgive and strengthen. Women and men who have made a mistake are not to be discarded either. Seek the Lord as he is seeking you.

God's love and grace is also needed to heal our culture and country. In the USA, there has been a complete breakdown of sexual morality. Our youth and adults are saturated daily by pornography, immorality of all kinds and the degradation of the human person, often reducing him to nothing more than a disposable object of lust. These factors are major contributors to unplanned and unwanted pregnancies that often lead to abortion. Our youth need to hear the counter cultural Christian message that their sexuality is a great and precious gift best nourished and strengthened by chastity and modesty. We must teach that virginity should be cherished as a gift to offer your spouse on your wedding night. These are radical words for youth to hear; and they may categorize us with 19th century Puritans or the Amish, *(Article continued on next page)*

but Catholics empowered by the Holy Spirit should readily speak these truths to help our youth live their best lives.

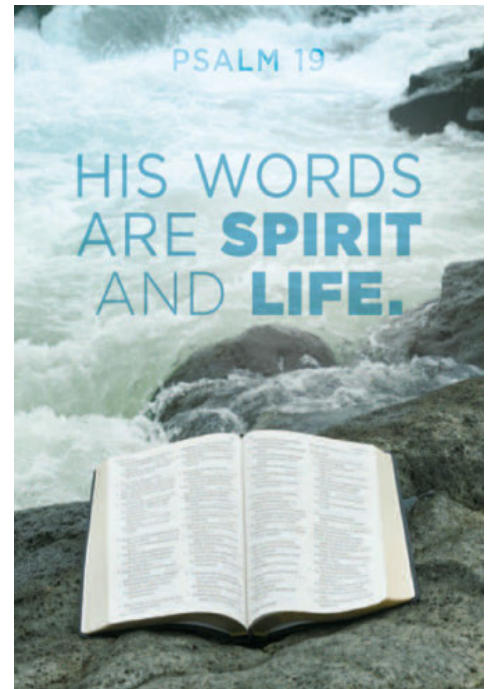

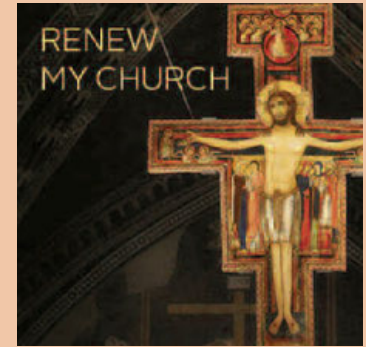
HOW TO USE THE NEW GATHER IV HYMNAL AND LECTIONARY

The following is an overview of our new **Gather IV Hymnal and Lectionary**.

- The **inside front right cover** of the Hymnal contains the **Gloria and Nicene Creed** followed by the responses of our liturgy after the Creed.
- **Table of Contents** overview:
 - The **Psalms** begin at # 28 and run through # 105
 - There are ten complete **Mass Settings** - # 224 through # 443.
 - There are a total of 644 Hymns and Songs in Liturgical Categories beginning with the Season of Advent, followed by Christmas, Lent, Easter, Ordinary Time and Special Feasts.
 - Gather IV hymnal contains the melody line and text for every musical item plus the Scripture readings for the **entire three-year Lectionary and Liturgical Cycle**.
 - Also included is the Order of Mass, the Rites of the Church, and forms of daily prayer.
 - The number to find the Readings for Mass will be displayed on the **TOP LINE** of the Hymn Board located in the choir loft.

The Gather IV Edition is intentionally designed to be GIA's most relevant Catholic hymnal to date. The musical contents represent the contemporary Catholic Church, featuring a diverse roster of composers and a wider breadth of musical styles. St. Damian has invested in 450 copies of the Gather IV Hymnal and Lectionary. These hymnals will be used for many years to come.

Ladies, St. Damian has a hidden gem whereby you can expand your knowledge, grow in your crafting ability, socialize and have a lot of fun. It's called the St. Damian Women's Club.

The Women's Club formerly began as the Mother's Club in the 60's. Most moms were not employed outside the home, and those who were needed an evening away to be with other women who shared similar interests and needs. Many of the members had children in school and it was an opportunity to meet new people and form new friendships.

In the beginning there were many members. This was a time when families ate dinner together every night and there wasn't the constant driving the kids to after school activities every day. Dad came home after work and Mom usually helped with the kid's homework. There was also one TV, one remote and the family gathered in the living room together to watch one program.

The Women's Club today has less members. Some have children and grandchildren in school, some do not. Some work and some are retired and the age range varies. While life has changed over time, what they all have in common is their need to learn, grow and have fun. Arlene Newman has been a member for many years and currently is the treasurer. She says "we laugh a lot and it's a great way to spend a night out."

There is a theme for every meeting and the topics are suggested and chosen by the members. The topics have a wide range of interests, for example: women in the bible, crafts, chair exercises, exorcism, line dancing, etc. "While we are a small group, we all get along together. And when new people join us, we welcome them and they fit right in," says their president, Jeanne Coy.

Before Covid, the members would volunteer at the Manteno Veterans Home every November. They would escort the vets from their rooms to the large hall to play Bingo. They also hosted an annual fundraiser in October that featured entertainment and dinner.

Fr. Joe Noonan attends their monthly meeting says "This is one of the most welcoming groups I have been blessed to be a chaplain of. Fun women of faith. I believe many women in our parish would love being a part of the Women's Club if they experienced the joy, laughter and community that I have over the years I have witnessed the group."

Serving Moms in Need: Living the Gospel of Life

On March 25, 2020, the Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord, the Church celebrated the 25th anniversary of the papal encyclical *Evangelium vitae* (*The Gospel of Life*). This prophetic document, written by Pope St. John Paul II, reaffirmed the Church's constant teaching on the value and inviolability of every human life.

In this encyclical, the Holy Father explains that the *The Gospel of Life* is at the heart of Jesus' saving message to the world. Through the Incarnation of Christ, God reveals to us the dignity of all human life. Each of us is made in the image and likeness of God, reflecting his glory and his imprint. We are therefore called to "respect, defend and promote the dignity of every human person, at every moment and in every condition of that person's life."

The Gospel of Life highlights the special and particular role of women in bearing the gift of life to the world. St. John Paul II offers heartfelt thanks to these "heroic mothers," who, placing their trust in God, "devote themselves to their own family without reserve, who suffer in giving birth to their children and who are ready to make any effort, to face any sacrifice, in order to pass on to them the best of themselves."

St. John Paul II also outlines the many challenges that expectant mothers may face, including lack of support from the father, financial strains, concerns about her own health or that of her child, and pressures from family and friends. The Holy Father recognized that an "unborn child is totally entrusted to the protection and care of the woman carrying him or her in the womb." For this reason, it is particularly important that the Church come alongside mothers, offering them encouragement, assistance, and support.

In honor of *The Gospel of Life's* 25th anniversary and in answer to St. John Paul II's call, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops Committee on Pro-Life Activities launched a nationwide effort beginning March 25, 2020 entitled: "**Walking with Moms in Need: A Year of Service.**" Parishes, through the support of their bishops and pastors, are invited to join this effort to increase the Church's outreach and support to pregnant women facing difficult or challenging pregnancies. This special anniversary year provides the Church with an opportunity to assess, expand, and better communicate resources to pregnant moms and families in need.

Pregnant and parenting moms in need are in our parishes and our neighborhoods, but in desperation, they are turning to other places for help. We know the needs and challenges can be immense for women in difficult

pregnancies, especially women in poverty, and the sources for help may not be apparent to those most needing support. Women facing challenging pregnancies should see the Church as a place where they can find help, especially with its extensive social services dedicated to meeting the needs of people in crisis.

Through the *Year of Service* the Church is being asked to respond to St. John Paul II's call and honestly assess the pastoral and practical assistance that it currently provides to pregnant moms and families in need and how effective it is in communicating such help.

He said we need to bring this message "to the heart of every man and woman and to make it penetrate every part of society." By reaching out to lovingly support and care for pregnant women and their children, we witness to the sanctity of every human person, in every stage and every circumstance.

We need then to 'show care' for all life and for the life of everyone." St. John Paul II highlights the incredible history of service and charity that the Church has provided throughout the centuries to those abandoned and forgotten by society. He urges that "every Christian community, with a renewed sense of responsibility, must continue to write this history."

It is our responsibility to care for and protect human life, especially the lives of the most vulnerable among us. *The Gospel of Life* teaches us that "the task of accepting and serving life involves everyone; and this task must be fulfilled above all towards life when it is at its weakest." The Gospel of Jesus *is* the Gospel of Life, and to love Jesus is to love and serve life. As followers of Christ, may we strive to continually respond to the needs of the poor and vulnerable entrusted to us by God.

For this Year of Service, the USCCB Secretariat of Pro-Life Activities is providing educational, pastoral, and action-oriented resources to help parishes go to the peripheries and bring hope and help to mothers in need. Through the combined efforts of parishes nationwide, we hope to move closer to the day when every pregnant mother in need knows where to turn for help, and abortion is simply unthinkable.
