

STATIONS of the CROSS

In lieu of the weekly message from the Priests, the staff of the Family of Four Parishes are sharing personal reflections on the 14 Stations of the Cross throughout the six weeks of Lent. We hope that these reflections are a prayerful way for our parish community to collectively walk alongside each other to follow Jesus during his last steps on earth. With each station, we challenge each other to respond to Christ's call to encounter Him and others in a different way this Lent and every day of our lives.

Seventh Station: Jesus Falls the Second Time

"See you next time!" the smiling second grader sang as she skipped out the church doors. She had just received Jesus' gift of the sacrament of penance for the first time. The burden of doing a hard thing had been lifted off of her, and she was light as a feather as she bounded out into the world! I have no doubt her joy radiated into the lives of the people she encountered that day.

Jesus, disfigured and bloodied by our sins, fell under the weight of the cross a second time. But he did not stay down under the cross. He rose with determination to finish his journey, to fulfill the New Covenant he would establish in his death and resurrection. As we continue to draw closer to Jesus on the cross this Lent, we remember that God never tires of forgiving and pouring his endless mercy upon his children. As we rise up, taking up our own crosses once again to follow him, we can leave our burdens with Jesus. Then we too can go out into the world, freer to share God's love and mercy with the world.

Come Holy Spirit, stir in me so that I may see how my sins bind and imprison me time and again. Free me from the bondage of these sins with your everlasting love, that I may better love others by feeding the hungry, giving water to the thirsty, clothing the naked, sheltering the homeless, visiting the sick and imprisoned, and doing your good works while seeing Christ in every person.

Eighth Station: Jesus Meets the Women of Jerusalem

It's not been my experience that mothers need to be instructed to weep for their children, to live in their children's suffering as well as their own, or to worry about their children's futures. It happens quite naturally. Yet this is what Jesus counsels the women of Jerusalem to do when he encounters them weeping and lamenting as he makes his way wearily through the crowd. Jesus did not wallow in self-pity; rather, he trusted in his Father's plan of salvation for a sinful, broken world. It was this trust that gave him the strength to rise up and carry on each time he fell under the weight of the cross.

I have lost count of how many times I have been in a Beacon Moms group and a woman reveals a recent worry, stress, loss or deep suffering within her family, and another woman (sometimes a near-stranger) responds by drawing near and tenderly sitting in her suffering with her. Sometimes there is a relatable experience shared between the women, and oftentimes there is silently (or tearfully) shared compassion within the group. Time and time again, I see this shared suffering strengthen relationships of mothers merely because others put their own needs aside and lift up one another's when they most need support. Reflecting on this station along Jesus' way, I wonder if perhaps the compassion that the women showed Jesus strengthened him to continue in the same way I have so often seen compassion flowing in Beacon Moms groups.

How can I extend myself to be with others in their suffering?
How can I offer my own suffering to Christ so that I can do the work he needs me to do in the world?

Lenten Observances

Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. The norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding from age 14 onwards. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily his Resurrection.



Grief Work Series

During this past year, I found myself praying for individuals who have lost a loved one. In the case of death, when our good-bye is painfully final, we are left with the sorrow of separation for the rest of our lives. Grief alone is difficult, then adding the emotional layers of a pandemic makes grief feel even heavier. God has been nudging me to write a few reflections to get us to a point where we can safely gather in person to resume our Bereavement Support Group. Technology is wonderful, but not the right fit for this area of deep healing.

What I have learned about grieving, and I pray it can help you.

Mourning is each individual's adaptation to the loss of a loved one. There are no rigid step-by-step ways to grieve, no timetable to keep, no right or wrong ways to begin or end the process. But there are the four fundamental tasks we need to work through after the death of a loved one:

To accept the reality of loss.

Facing the reality of our loss, going through it (there is no going around it) and accepting it as an unchangeable fact is essential for good emotional and physical health, even though it is painful and difficult. It is a process, not a one-time act. The tasks of grieving do not necessarily follow in a specific order, and we may find ourselves returning again and again to come to terms with the fact that the loss has happened. Somehow we need to face, head on, the reality that reunion with our loved one in this world is impossible.

To experience the pain of grief.

The pain of separation after a loss is usually a very intense experience, and our feelings at such a time can overwhelm us. While working through the second task of grieving, it is important to name and face all our emotions, not flee from them. Although we may not be used to expressing these feelings, we can come to understand that they are a part of the mourning process that represent a normal, healthy reaction to grief, as painful as they may be.

To adjust to an environment in which the deceased is absent.

The loss of a loved one forever changes our world. We find ourselves in a new environment, both personally and socially. An ending has occurred that demands a new beginning. Before this can happen, though, a period of transition has to take place. While working through the third task of mourning, we need to examine closely what has been lost and what has been gained as a consequence of our loss. What experiences, roles, expectations, values, opportunities and dreams are to be abandoned? What new ones are to be assumed?

To emotionally relocate the deceased and move on with life.

Rearranging and re-creating cherished memories of the person who has died is the focus of the fourth task. As we do that, we gradually move toward finding a new place in our hearts for the deceased loved one. In time we repossess the energy that we once put into that relationship and reinvest it in our present life and new relationships, even while holding on to our special memories of the one who has died.

Focus for next week: Where were you, God?

Over the past two months, children in UPLIFT Families, our religious formation program, were preparing for their first sacrament of Reconciliation. In the first sacrament preparation class we read the story about the Lost Sheep, and talked about the ways that Jesus is our Good Shepherd. We also watched a short YouTube video of a man pulling a sheep out of a deep and hidden hole in the ground. The children were amazed as the man unrelentingly reached down into the ground to find the sheep's legs, and a sheep suddenly emerged from the grass. Though the children found amusement in the scene, they could very easily empathize with the sheep and could imagine how it felt to be very scared and alone in the dark hole in the ground. We talked about how the sheep couldn't get out of the hole by itself and maybe when it tried to save itself, it just fell deeper into the hole and made things worse. The sheep needed to be rescued by the shepherd and when it was finally freed, it bounded out and ran away with a newfound freedom.

So often we think that we can save ourselves if we are smart enough or work hard enough. But that will never be enough. The sacrament of Reconciliation gives us the freedom to live our lives in fullness with God's grace and love. It was beautiful to watch the children receive the sacrament of God's mercy and forgiveness for the first time, to see their little worried and nervous faces turn into smiles and celebrations. What a gift that our Good Shepherd has given them and all of us.


