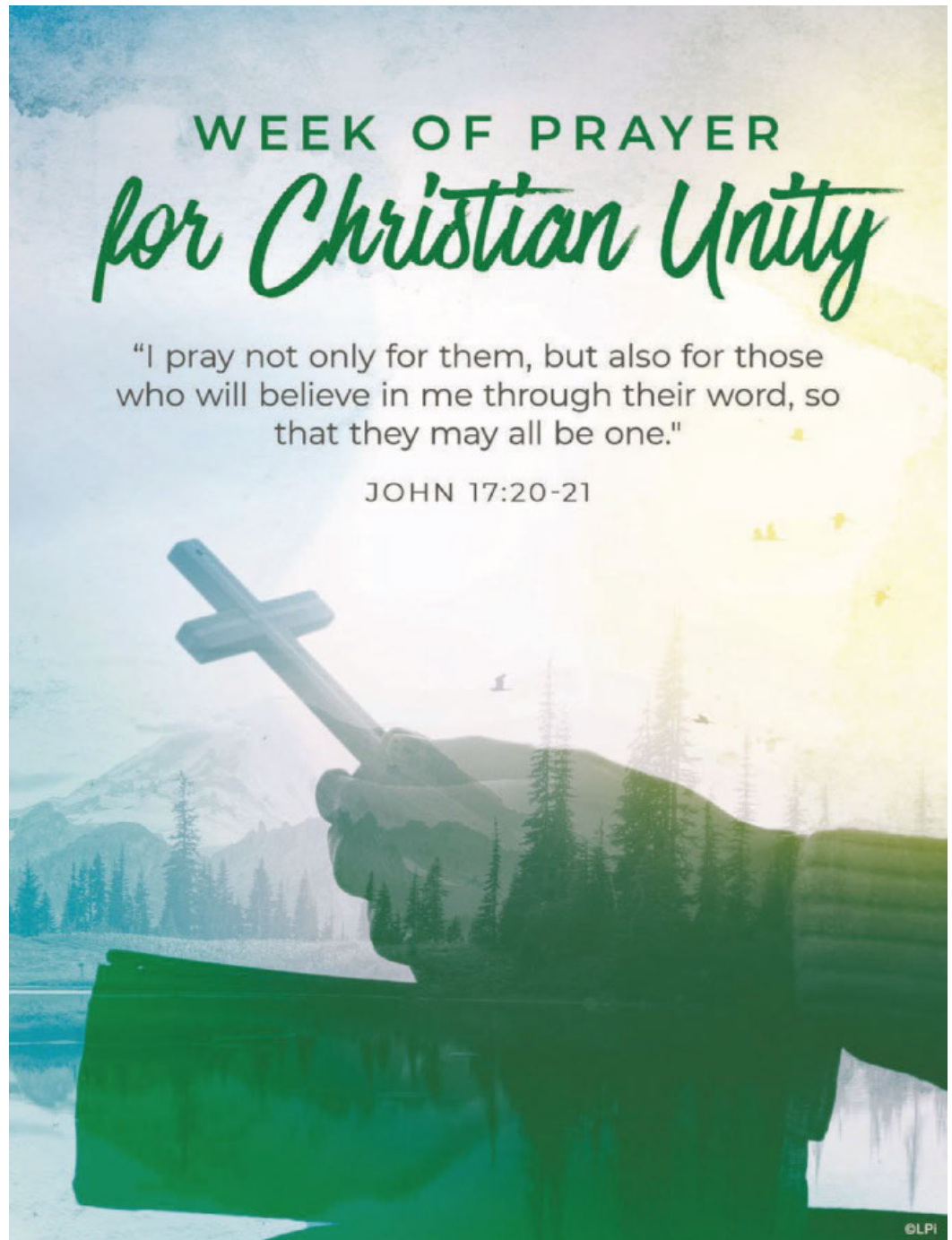

Dear Friends,

Having celebrated the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, we finish the Christmas season and head into Ordinary Time, knowing that Christ's Baptism is both an affirmation of our human dignity and a challenge to bring that dignity to our faulty and fallen world.

We have so much work to do, and in the exhaustion of a pandemic our efforts seem anemic at times. We can never do enough, and what little we do accomplish to make the world a just, more compassionate, more peaceful and healthy place of dignity for all seems rather flat. I find the devil loves to make us seem inadequate, and at fault.

This Sunday's Gospel about the wedding feast at Cana is one of my favorites. Mary our Mother is the heroine—convincing her Son that at this beginning of His public ministry he does not have to get the major work done. The Crucifixion is chapters away. Mary, in her consistent and insightful intuition seems to be saying just do something kind for this poor couple in an embarrassing moment of ill-planning. (They should have checked the wine order!)

Start small with kindness in small ways and the big accomplishments will come. The important thing is do something. As St. Paul notes in the second reading, everyone has something to offer. Do it now. The chance to change the world could come in one small act, much like the miracle at Cana eventually leads to the Cross, and the blood that flows like wine becomes our lifeblood for the sake of the world.

Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day is observed every year on the third Monday of January. This Monday, January 17, we commemorate the life and legacy of this great American, a clergyman who became the most prominent leader in the civil rights movement from 1955 until his assassination in 1968 (at age 39). Rev. King is famous for preaching love and nonviolence along with civil disobedience to overcome racial injustice. One of his famous quotes is, "Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that." In the spirit of Rev. Martin Luther King, Jr., where could we shine our light (or show love and compassion) to help improve our community?



Wisconsin Catholic Charities

Catholic Charities agencies continue to mobilize personnel, volunteers and resources at Fort McCoy to provide Afghan refugees with a welcoming atmosphere, a break from the confines of temporary housing and relief from their difficult journey. Among the services provided are social engagement for women and children (including learning centers) and on-base legal assistance. The women's centers provide a quiet and clean place for mothers to bond and play with their children and develop friendships. The children's area is a place for children to gather and create arts and craft projects, build puzzles, play games and be sociable. Volunteers are crucial to keep the centers running smoothly and safely.

The USCCB and Catholic Charities are seeking more volunteers to aid in this mission "to welcome the stranger". Volunteers will spend time at one of the three Women and Children Centers, two Sewing Centers or Learning Centers. Each of the centers requires between 6-10 volunteers to operate. Individuals must be able to commit to at least a week of volunteering, though longer commitments are preferred. 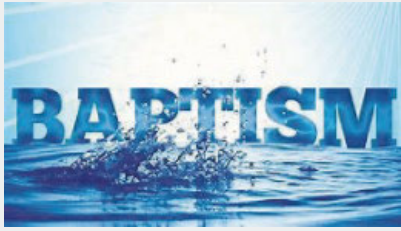


Director of Human Concerns

Nova Night – Next on January 23!

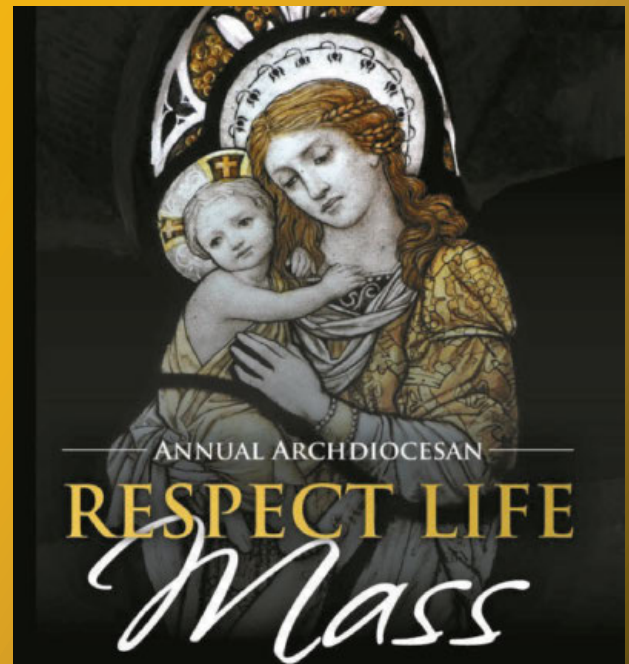
