*The Spirit of the Lord is upon me...  
He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives  
and recovery of sight to the blind,  
to let the oppressed go free.*

*- Lk 4:18*



Dear Friends,  
 Praised be Jesus Christ!  
 As we gather to worship this weekend, we do so with heavy hearts, remembering as we do that the Church in the United States commemorates this Saturday, January 22 as *the Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn Children* and remembers all those children whose lives have been ended by abortion.

In so doing, we also beg God for an end to this most painful reality and pray for the conversion and healing of all those wounded by the abortion industry, and a flourishing in America of a culture of life.

As Saint Paul reminds the Church in our Second Reading proclaimed at Mass this weekend:

“But God has so constructed the body as to give greater honor to a part that is without it, so that there may be no division in the body, but that the parts may have the same concern for one another. If one part suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if one part is honored, all the parts share its joy.”

As our country marks yet another tragic anniversary of *Roe vs. Wade*, we pray this weekend both for a **greater protection** for human life, from conception to natural death, and a **greater love** for human life, especially for those children who remain most vulnerable and without any legal protection.

At Old St. Mary, we are blessed to have received a new statue this past fall that makes manifest this most remarkable truth: The Son of God took on flesh **within the womb** of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Placed outside in front of the Rectory of Old St. Mary, this statue of Our Lady has been crafted with a *clear womb*, inviting us to gaze upon the Child that was conceived within the sanctuary of her womb.

If the littlest part suffers, *then we suffer too* and thus recommit ourselves to building up a culture of life! If the littlest part is honored, *if life is cherished, loved and protected*, then we share in this greatest gift of joy!

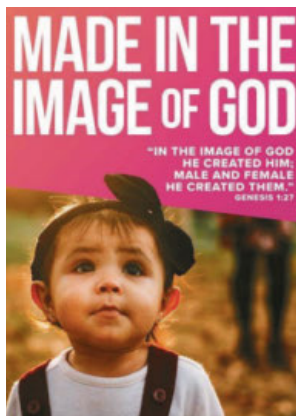

“May we all have a deep conversion to the love and practice of the universal moral law which God has written upon the human heart. **The flourishing of the common good, the spiritual health of our society and our very future as a country depend on it.**”

## God Equips Us for the Challenge

*Jesus said to me, “My grace is sufficient for you, for My power is made perfect in weakness. “Therefore, I will boast all the more gladly of my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may rest upon me.”* 2 Corinthians 12:9

When I first became a caregiver (28 years ago), I was a young mom, pleading with God that He had the wrong person. I didn't think I was up for the challenge of caring for my sick child. Sticking to a more rigid routine was a challenge for me. I was impatient if I had to sit and wait at appointments, because I liked to be in control! *No, God, I am not equipped to be a patient, calm caregiver.*

The reality is that God not only uses flawed vessels, but it's part of His plan and He has faith in our ability. Sacred scripture reminds us. Abraham was old. Moses stuttered. Gideon was afraid. The disciples fell asleep while praying. Naomi had a bad attitude. Martha worried!

God asks us to remember whenever we doubt our abilities that He will never ask us to do anything for which He has not first equipped us. We can *trust* Him on that! We can step out, fully confident, knowing that He will make us capable. He is faithful to His promise!

St. Paul reminds us that our problems and weaknesses show our need for God. With no burdens or problems, we would have no need for a Savior. Through our caregiving challenges, we remember the pain and suffering Jesus Christ endured to give us access to the Father and to heaven. His presence equips us as we walk through our caregiving season.

God's grace—always sufficient!

## Love Thy Neighbor

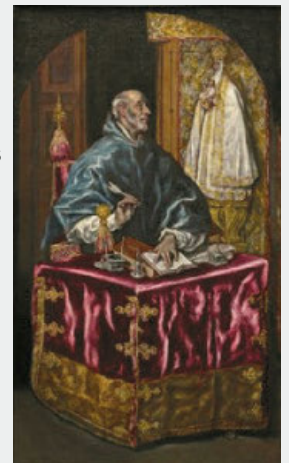
St. Ildefonso, pray for us.

Many of you know SS Peter & Paul Parish's sister parish in Mexico simply as "Chiapas". In actuality, the name of the parish, which is located in the city of Tenejapa in the southern Mexican state of Chiapas, is San Ildefonso Parish. January 23 is the feast day of St. Ildefonso, a former bishop of Toledo, Spain, who was born in 607 AD. He is a hugely popular saint in Spain, second only to his mentor, St. Isidore of Seville, and large celebrations are held in his honor each year.

He started his religious life as a monk, founded a monastery of nuns and, according to legend, was presented with a priestly vestment by the Blessed Virgin who appeared to him. Little remains of his writings, but he is known for his deep devotion to the Virgin Mary, his comprehensive knowledge about Baptism and his advocacy for frequent reception of Holy Communion.

Variants of his name, which means "battle ready", include Alfonso, Lonnie and Alphonse. In solidarity with our sisters and brothers of San Ildefonso Parish, we pray St. Ildefonso guides us in readiness for the challenges that come our way.

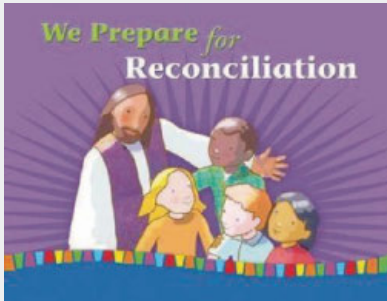




**"Uniting People Living in Faith and Truth"**

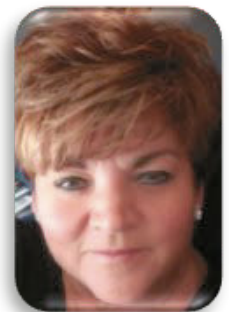
