Pastor's Corner



The story of the merciful Father and the prodigal son (found in the Gospel of Luke chapter 15) is quite compelling.

In the story, we learn about forgiveness and communal reconciliation.

After the Prodigal son returns home and is forgiven, the Father justifies his son in front of others by

inviting everyone to celebrate his return home.

Forgiveness is a joy to be shared.

When we are hurt, it is natural that we want to share about it with others to receive support. Everyone in the father's house can see what the son is doing to his Father. The Father does not hide it.

It must have been painful to watch the Father looking out through the window every morning, waiting patiently for his son's return. Perhaps some even dared to approach the Father and say, "He (your son) does not deserve your love."

And yet, when the son returns, the Father invites everyone to forgive as well and to celebrate that he is home.

It is good that we forgive, and it is Christian to invite those who heard our story to forgive as well and to rejoice.

I believe in heaven we will all know that we are forgiven and loved, and it will fill us with joy to know that others are too.

May you experience the joy of love and forgiveness in your life this week.

Companionship, True Hope and the Way Forward

Terri Balash, Director of Pastoral Care

Companionship, reflection and connection are vital parts of surviving grief. We need each other. Grief is already a lonely experience. It rearranges your address book: people you thought would stay beside you through anything have either disappeared or they have behaved so badly, you cut them out yourself. Even those who truly love you, who want more than anything to stay beside you, fall short of joining you here. It can feel like you lost the entire world right along with the person who died. Many grieving people feel like they are on another planet or wish they could go to one. Somewhere there are others like them. People who understand.

We all need a place where we can tell the truth about how hard this is. We all need a place where we can share what is really going on, without feeling corrected or talked out of our feelings. While some friends and family can do this well, I have found that it is the community of fellow grievers who understand the best.

Bereavement Support Group

This five-session program will begin on Monday, September 26, and meet in the Old St. Mary Parish Office (835 N Milwaukee St). We will meet for five consecutive Monday evenings from 6:00-7:30 pm, from September 26 – October 24.



The program will touch on many different topics, such as Different Stages of Grief, Understanding Anger, Depression and Unfinished Business. You will have the opportunity to share your memories and feelings with others who are walking the same journey. In a Bereavement Support Group, grievers can hear testimony from those who have "been there." They will discover that others have suffered similar pains, fear, sadness and anger. It is critical for a griever to know that it is okay to feel lonely, depressed or isolated, and to know with certainty that someday they will feel better.

What is SPRED?

SPRED (Special Religious Development) is a small faith community that includes children or young adults with special needs and catechists. SPRED integrates people with developmental disabilities (SPRED friends) more fully into the mainstream parish life. It offers faith formation, gives volunteer parishioners



(catechists) an inviting place and opportunity to connect with persons with disabilities and offers ways to more fully include persons with disabilities into the liturgy. The SPRED method creates an awareness of God through symbolic catechesis relevant to the life experiences of the SPRED friends. The catechesis leads each person to develop a sense of the sacred, a sense of the Church and a sense of Christ all through the friendships formed in the SPRED community.

We need SPRED Catechists!

We have SPRED groups at Our Lady of Divine Providence, SS Peter & Paul and Three Holy Women. All three groups are in need of a few individuals to serve as catechists for our SPRED friends. A catechist is paired with the same SPRED friend for the entire time to develop a bond of friendship and community. 


