
My prayer is that we accept that LOVE in a new way and live that LOVE in new and merciful ways in a world which, as the song says, is a world "in sin and error, pining."

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given and his name will be called Wonderful, Counselor, the Mighty God, the Everlasting Father, the Prince of Peace.










Young Adults New Years Eve Mass & Party






