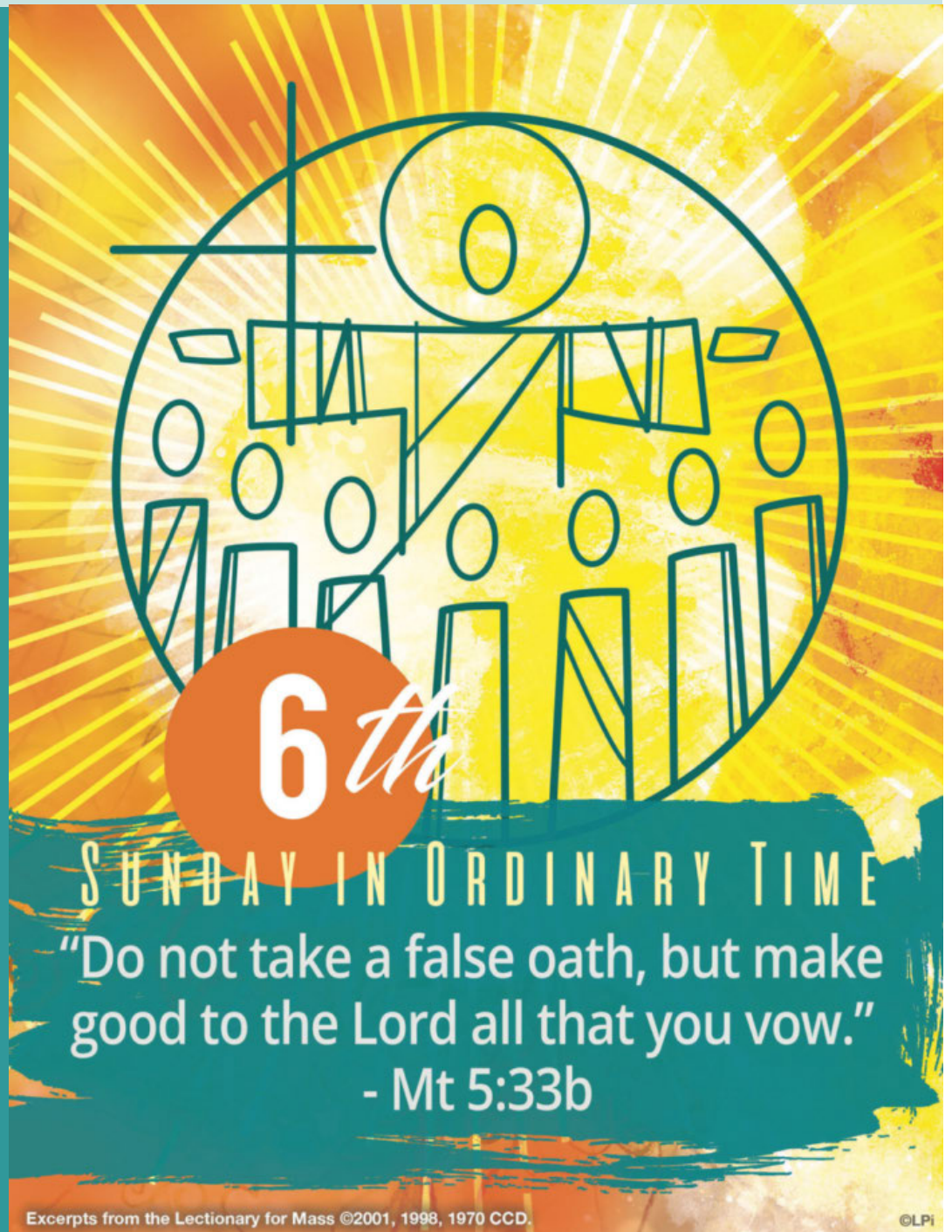

Dear Friends,

Last February 2 was not only the feast day of the Presentation of the Lord, but also the World Day for Consecrated Life. Here at the Family of Four, we are blessed to have a number of religious sisters who join us at Mass and serve our parishioners in diverse ways. These sisters and their communities are also part of the history of our parishes in important ways, all of them helping educate our children and nurturing the faith of our parish communities.

Last week at our monthly staff lunch meeting, I sat across from sister Marie Louise Balistreri from St Rita's. I call Sister Balistreri *Sorella* (Italian for "sister"). I asked Sister Marie Louise how long it has been since she made her vows, and she told me that next year (2024) it will be 60 years! I also asked her if she would do it again. Sister said she would do it all over again if she had the choice. Finally, I asked Sister, "Sorella, and who is Jesus to you?" and Sister Balistreri immediately answered, "Jesus is my spouse of 60 years!" My heart melted.

This time, I'd like to invite us to appreciate all the more the gift of all religious sisters and brothers, especially our sisters at the Family of Four. Although they do their ministry and work in humility and silence, I kindly ask that we thank them for their witness to love and to the faith.

On a different note, Fr. Tim and I announced a few weeks ago our participation in the Love One Another (LOA) capital campaign. Right now, Fr. Tim and I, together with the campaign chairs and volunteers, are reaching out to our parishioners (as time and other commitments allow), asking them to consider making a pledge. We are grateful beyond words for your interest in learning about the campaign and willingness to join our efforts.

Even though the LOA campaign is currently happening at the Family of Four, Fr. Tim and I are very grateful for your kindness in maintaining your contributions to the other regular annual appeals. Every year around this time, we also have the Catholic Stewardship Appeal from the Archbishop that helps him sustain the different Catholic ministries in the diocese. On a more personal note, I will be away from the parishes February 10-17. I will be attending the ordination of a friend to the Priesthood and will also be on a silent retreat starting on the 13th through the 17th, both events out of state. I have only been with the Family of Four a little over seven months, but I am grateful that I can now bring before the Lord many of your stories, needs and loved ones who I have had the privilege to meet and learn about in the past seven months.

As women we have special relationships, that sometimes can weigh us down as daughter, sister, bride and mother. We need space to renew ourselves, and God has given us permission to set ourselves free and know the truth of our feminine identity. You matter. Your story matters. Your life matters.

Do you desire to dive deeper into the freedom that you were created for? During this three-day retreat, held in parish communities around the US, you will be immersed in truth and transformation as the knots of Eve in us are undone by Mary's example of radical receptivity. Through a series of talks, teachings and prayer experiences, you will be invited to become Undone in God's presence while deeply receiving the truth of your authentic feminine identity. The weekend includes Adoration, time for prayer, worship, small group discussion, interactive and guided meditations and much more.

A Reflection on the Pandemic and Congregational Singing at Mass

Sing to the Lord, a 2008 US Bishops' document regarding music in liturgy has some powerful words to share about music in liturgy. "Music is a way for God to lead us to the realm of higher things.... Music is a sign of God's love for us and of our love for him.... Indeed, God, the giver of song, is present whenever his people sing his praises."

As I think back to March, 2020, I am just beginning to realize what an impact that had on our music at Sunday Mass. At the beginning, we were told not to sing; it was **dangerous** and people were getting sick when they did. For awhile people found a way to have virtual choirs and choirs singing in parking lots and balconies and driveways. But it wasn't the same. We watched Mass without singing or participating. We weren't with our larger faith community in the same room, singing and praying together. It got us through the pandemic, but is that the way we want to continue? I hope not. Remember – we are not an audience at Mass. The church tells us that we are the **primary** music makers. It's called 'congregational' singing for a reason. We are ALL expected to sing our praises to God. Not just the cantor, not just the choir, but ALL of us! Now, everyone has their role – the cantor is the psalmist and also an animator of sung prayer, **leading** us in song but not singing **for** us. The choir is there to enhance and support our congregational singing, but **not to replace us**. Music had a way of figuring out how to make it through the pandemic in whatever way it could, but now it's time to return to full-throated, enthusiastic singing at Mass. I am challenging each of us to commit ourselves to learning the songs anew and letting them touch our hearts. Don't worry how good your voice is; don't worry if you make a mistake here or there. It doesn't matter. Let us look and listen and hear God's love for us by singing his praises loud and strong at Sunday Mass. You'll be glad you did!

Love Thy Neighbor

Black History Month celebrates the achievements and contributions that Blacks have made to American culture and society, and recognizes the integral and complex role they played in American history. Black History Week started in 1926 to expand the knowledge

of Black history beyond the story of enslavement. In 1976 President Gerald Ford recognized February as Black History Month, asking Americans to "seize the opportunity to honor the too often neglected accomplishments in every area of endeavor throughout our history." Many of us remain unaware of the depth, breadth and relevance of Black history and the long struggle toward racial equity that continues to this day. Use February to read a Black author, watch a documentary about the Black experience, research a Black inventor, musician, scholar or activist, study issues that have a disproportionate impact on Black communities and advocate for change or add a Black creator to your social media feed. A crucial step in seeking racial justice is to understand the past, and this month is a great time to explore that connection.

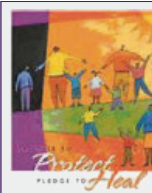

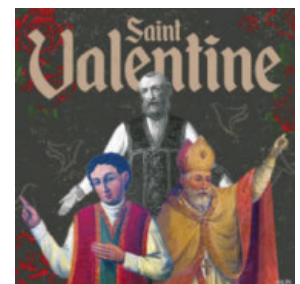
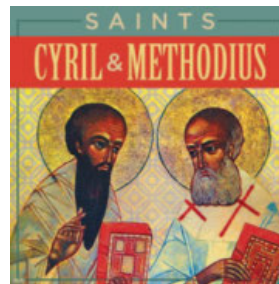

Prison Greeting Card Ministry

"I was in prison, and you came to visit me"
Matthew 25:34

If you're not a family member or friend of the incarcerated, you likely have never visited the imprisoned. Well, here's a chance to support those members of our community. Since prisoners often can't buy greeting cards, envelopes and postage stamps to send to their mothers on Mother's Day or family on their birthdays, we are conducting a drive for any unused greeting cards (birthday, Mother's Day, sympathy, wedding, blank, thinking of you, etc.), envelopes (white only), writing paper (white only), pens and pencils (black only, not colored and no markers), and postage stamps.
