

Reading Reflections

Lent 2023: Facing Temptations

Genesis 2:7-9, 3:1-7 Romans 5:12-19

This weekend, we listen to two stories of temptation: the temptation of Adam and Eve in the garden and the temptation of Jesus in the desert.

The first reading tells us the all too human story of temptation: not trusting that God is going to give them what they need to be happy, Adam and Eve reach out and grab what they think is going to bring them happiness apart from God.

In the Gospel, Jesus faces the same temptation: the devil offers Jesus the same things her offers us: pleasure, possessions, power and prestige.

Sometimes we respond like Adam and Eve, believing that we need something more than what God offers us in order to be happy. Sometimes, like Jesus, we are able to overcome these temptations and are able to trust that our fullest happiness comes when we say "Yes" to God and to God's invitation to love.

How can our Lenten prayer, fasting and almsgiving help us to overcome these temptations to seek our ultimate happiness in pleasure, possessions, power and prestige apart from God?





Observing Lent with Your Family

I will give them a heart to know that I am the Lord and they shall return to me with their whole heart.

-Jeremiah 24:7

Lent is a time for your family to prepare your hearts for the graces of the Easter celebration. Lent can be a catalyst for spiritual renewal and an increase in love for God and others. As Jesus prayed, fasted, and resisted temptation in the desert for forty days, our Lenten season is marked with three Lenten practices: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. As a family, make a Lenten Plan and discuss what each family member can do by focusing on each Lenten practice. Here are simple ways to begin this season of Lent with your family. In the back of all churches, you can find a list of family-friendly ways to pray, fast, and give alms.

Prayer: Jesus told his followers "to pray always without becoming weary" (Luke 18:1). Ask yourself and your child, how can we make time each day to pray as a family? It can be reading from the Children's Bible every night, reading about the lives of Saints, or praying for a different person each day.

Fasting: Fasting can help us exercise self-control and discipline ourselves. It can be food, habits, or anything that can distract us from our relationship with God and others. What can your family eliminate or take out of your daily life so that you can better live for God and others?

Almsgiving: Serving others is an important way to help children live out their faith and to see Christ in others. What can your family give or do to help others in need? Encourage your child to donate part of their allowance to help the St. Vincent de Paul Society or other organizations that help others.

The most important thing to remember about Lent is that it is a time for families to slow down, reflect on Jesus' sacrifice for all of us, and give thanks for the hope and eternal glory that it opened for us.






