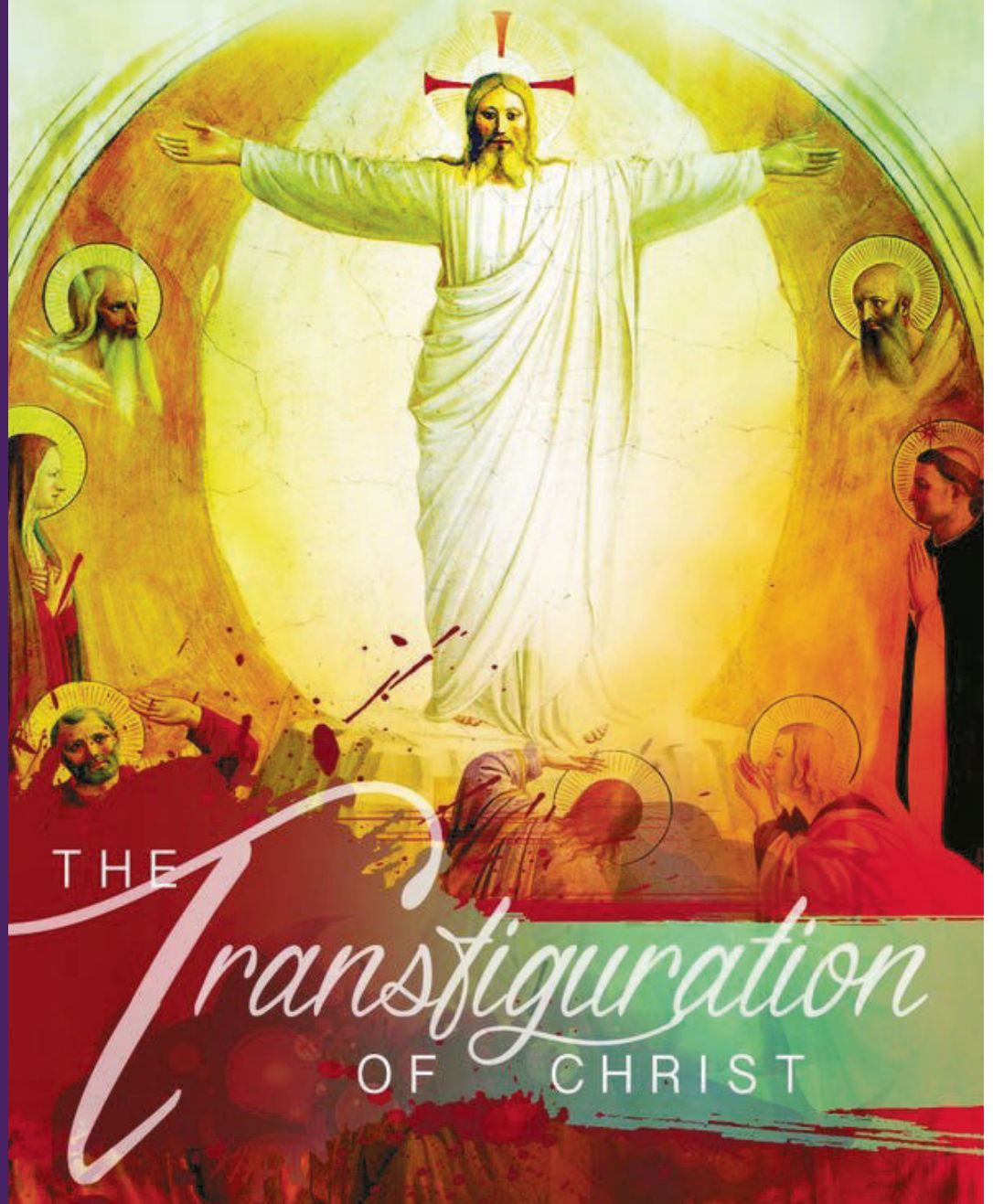

As we hear the story of the Transfiguration in which Jesus is brilliantly manifested in his conversation with Moses and Elijah as the culmination of God's loving plan of salvation for this rather crazy, broken humanity, it strikes me that not only does he not want the shrine his follower Peter proposes to build to the event, but he doesn't even want them to talk about it until after the Resurrection. Why the hesitation? If it were me, I would say, let's get it done. This is so cool. Let's take it public and get on with things.

Well, thank God it is not good old impatient me! ## Staff Lenten Reflection

### Second Sunday of Lent

This weekend we hear in the Gospel about Jesus's Transfiguration. In this story we hear the voice of God say, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." This closely resembles the voice of God at Jesus's baptism in the Jordan.

This Lent we are called to dig up the things that cause us to sin and to redirect ourselves towards God through prayer, fasting and almsgiving. It becomes a sort of baptism in the sense that we are being made new through Christ, and we must listen to Him to learn how to live for God alone.

As we prepare our hearts to receive Jesus on Easter and renew our baptismal vows, this Gospel reading begs us to ask the question, "Where is God calling us to transform our lives and our hearts so we may exit this Lenten period transfigured through Christ?"

*Gracious Savior, you've heard my complaining words, frustrated sighs and fits of anger. Make sure they never replace or drown out your shouts of encouragement, whispers of wisdom, songs of grace and faith-strengthening words of life.*

*I'm not looking for gratitude or glory. Rather, my prayer is that you always receive my gratitude and the glory you deserve. At the same time, I'm grateful for all the ways you encourage me, bless me and refresh my being. Your grace overwhelms me. To you be all glory and praise. Amen.*

## Love Thy Neighbor

Women's History Month is a good time to consider the women religious who have served within the Catholic Church throughout history. These nuns and sisters currently number about 45,000 in the US, which is down 75% from a 1965 peak, but with 100 new, younger women still professing vows each year. The number of women religious is projected to decline but not to extinction. Compared to decades ago, new sisters in the US are more racially diverse, with Black women having grown to 3% of the total. This may be due, in part, to the history of white religious orders not accepting Black women until the WWII era. Milwaukee's Sr. Patricia Rogers, a Sinsinawa Dominican who led the Dominican Center in the Amani neighborhood for 10 years, said, "Because I had not seen a Black nun, I didn't know if the Church accepted African American women or not.... If we, especially Black children, can't see ourselves in these positions, then we never will even think about the possibility of them for ourselves." Interested women should know that various religious communities still exist in Wisconsin and across the US, welcoming women of all backgrounds and hues to help build a truly "catholic" church. The Christian Women Society invites you to experience this Italian tradition through which Three Holy Women Parish honors St. Joseph. The intent of this communal celebration is to help those in need. Legend tells us that during a time of drought and famine in Sicily, people prayed to St. Joseph for his intercession. When the rains came, crops were planted, and people were able to rise up and thrive again. From their crops, they prepared a grand feast and, with their neighbors in need, they feasted together in thanksgiving to St. Joseph.

In keeping with this Italian tradition, the parish prepares a table or altar, a display of food and faith celebrating St. Joseph on his March 19 feast day. Occurring during Lent, this beautifully adorned table is filled with donated **meatless** dishes, traditional foods, sculpted breads and sweets. After a blessing, the food is sold to attendees. Participants receive a complimentary bread roll and a bowl of pasta con sarde, a favorite Lenten pasta with fish sauce, also served without the fish sauce. A specially prepared cake is cut and shared with those present. A raffle is held with a wonderful variety of prizes, including restaurant certificates, tickets to sporting events, gift baskets and cash prizes! Proceeds from the food sales, raffle and free will offerings are donated to the parish's social justice ministry, as well as other organizations or projects in the community that provide services to people needing help. Admission is free.

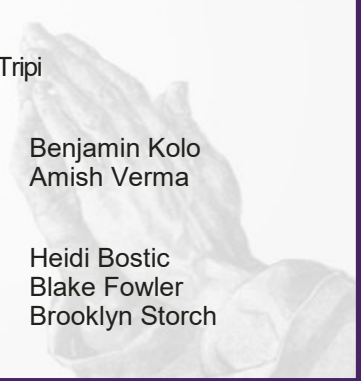
