

Dear friends,

Happy Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord!

Jesus, after having lived amongst us for about 33 years, and especially after having died and been raised from the dead, now goes back to God the Father. I can imagine what it was like for God the Father to welcome Jesus in heaven and to sit him at his right hand. Jesus for sure looked different; it was the first time a

human body (now glorified) entered the realms of heaven! Jesus also had kept the marks of his passion in his hands and his side. It was not just a glorified human body but also a divine person who had loved humanity to the end and had given up his life for us!

As Jesus ascended into heaven, He also went back to a realm outside of time and space; now his glorified body was not subjected to the limitations of time and space anymore, so now he could become present anywhere and anytime! As for the disciples that stayed on this earth, at first, I can imagine there was a sense of loss. Jesus had just "left!" I wonder what our reaction would have been if we got the news that Jesus had left the world? Would we miss him? Would we feel freed from the burden of his

commandments? Would we just move on, or would we somehow try to keep his memory alive? Later, the disciples understood that Jesus had not left them, but that he had now entered a way of existence whereby he could be present to all time and space, including here in Milwaukee in the year 2023.

Next week, May 28, six of our adult parishioners will receive the sacrament of Confirmation. Now in their adult age, they have chosen to believe that Jesus has not left but that he lives and is present and active in their lives today. We pray for these six adult candidates as they prepare for a special outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

On that same date, May 28, I will also give thanks to God for life as I turn 32.

May our hearts stay always young, capable of falling in love with the Lord every day, certain that he is here, today.

The Promise of Love

"...as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight." Acts 1:9

The Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord is a scene, not unlike that of a family gathering around the bedside of a dying loved one to say a final goodbye. If our loved one is the least bit alert, we wait for some final message or gesture that we can carry in our memory to last us a lifetime. In those last hours or days, we often struggle with mixed feelings—we want him or her to be free and at peace, yet we cling to the life and love we have known in our earthly relationship. At that moment, our hearts often carry a mixture of sorrow and hope.

Twenty-one years ago, my best friend/sister-in-law, Penny was on her journey home to our Lord; a day etched in my heart. As a family, we gathered at her bedside, struggling to say our farewells to a young woman full of life as we stood, in shock, fumbling with what to do. It was my son Ryan, at the time only seven years old, who loved his Godmother dearly. He showed us, by dropping to his knees, and surrendered to God. One-by-one, we all fell to our knees. We offered prayers of gratitude, in hopes that God would give us the strength to say our good-byes and carry on. We wept for months (years). As time went on, each of us in our own way, have honored Penny in the way we live out our faith.

The disciples must have had similar feelings as they stood there, saying farewell to Jesus. His message was a hopeful one, assuring them that they would not be abandoned. He promised that the power of the Spirit would be with them as they could carry on his work. It was a loving message—he believed they were capable and ready to continue what he had begun. So too, with us. The love we have known in the life of someone who dies can be carried on in our life. It is this love that makes our difficult farewells endurable and our grief consolable.

Compassionate God, comfort those who are grieving. Give them a sense of hope like that given to the disciples. Let them know that their loved one can live on through their lives. Amen!

Spiritual Adoption Month 2:

"I'm dancing!" The baby is making rapid progress developing all her external and internal organs. During the second month, baby teeth form and her fingers and toes are developing. Ears, nose, lips and tongue can now be clearly seen. Even her brain waves can now be recorded. The skeleton changes from cartilage to bone. The central nervous system is now functioning and so forty muscle sets begin their first exercises. By 8 weeks all body systems are present and the baby is called a "fetus", a Latin word meaning "little one" or "young one". Ultrasound reveals that this little one can now spring and jump - her first dance steps!


