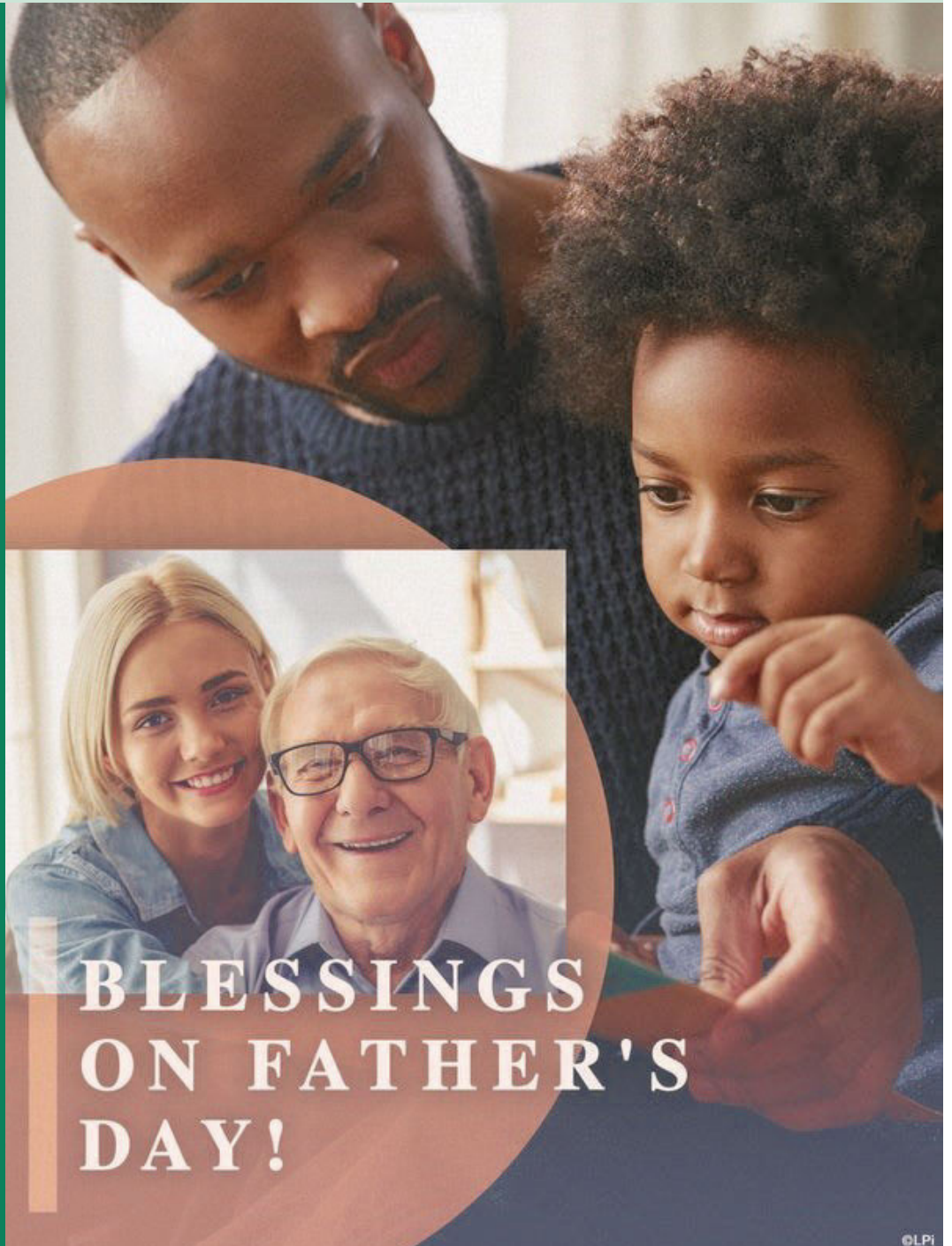

Pastor's Corner



Dear friends,

Last Friday we celebrated the solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. As I begin my fourth year of Priesthood, I continue to be amazed at the beauty of this vocation in life.

In the gospel from Matthew that we hear this weekend at Mass, Jesus tells his disciples after looking at the crowds following him:

“Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give.”

The reason why Jesus sent out his disciples to do all these things in his name was because he saw the need for it and his heart was moved with compassion.

As a newly ordained priest three years ago, I didn't know how much the priest shares in Jesus' own heart, including his feelings. Three years later, I can honestly describe ordination to the Priesthood as getting a heart transplant, whereby the priest is given the heart of the Lord.

In my conversations and encounters with the joyful and the sad, the suffering and the hopeful, I can tell I have a heart that is not mine because I am able to sympathize as well as feel compassion and empathy in such a new and profound way. It feels like it is the Lord looking at the crowds once again, this time using my eyes and feeling compassion for them with my own guts.

As we welcome Fr. Joseph into our parishes this week, let us give thanks to Jesus for another “icon” of his in our midst and for an extra pair of eyes and hands to continue his work of redemption and healing.

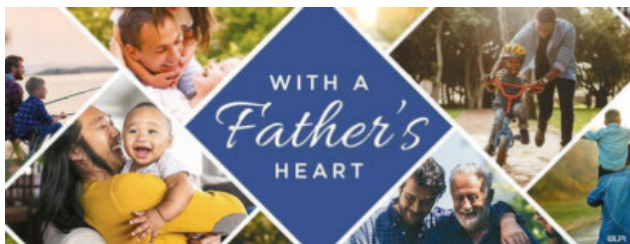

Love Thy Neighbor

“There you saw how the Lord your God carried you, as a father carries his son, all the way until you reached a safe place” (Deuteronomy 1:30)



On this Father's Day we celebrate fathers' vital roles in their children's lives. In Milwaukee, however, too many fathers are absent, including those who are incarcerated. The US has the highest incarceration rate in the world, and Wisconsin has the highest incarceration rate of Black men in the nation. In his 15 years of prison ministry, Fr. Richard Rohr identified a widespread “father hunger...the profound, but usually unconscious longing for affirmation and limits from male authority figures.” In other words, men in prison longed for their father's blessing and guidance, which then also affected the next generation. Research shows that children with an incarcerated or otherwise absent father have twice the likelihood of developing problems such as behavioral and academic difficulties, truancy, and poor mental, physical, and emotional health.

To address this issue, the Milwaukee Fatherhood Initiative, open to all fathers, promotes positive involvement of fathers in their families and has connected more than 12,000 men to resources to help them meet the needs of their families. Services include parenting, child support, interest debt relief, driver's license recovery, employment, education, health, and more (found on milwaukee.city.gov website). The St. Michael and St. Rose Literacy Program teaches English language skills with people from multi-cultural backgrounds which include Burmese refugees, Hispanic immigrants and other cultural groups. 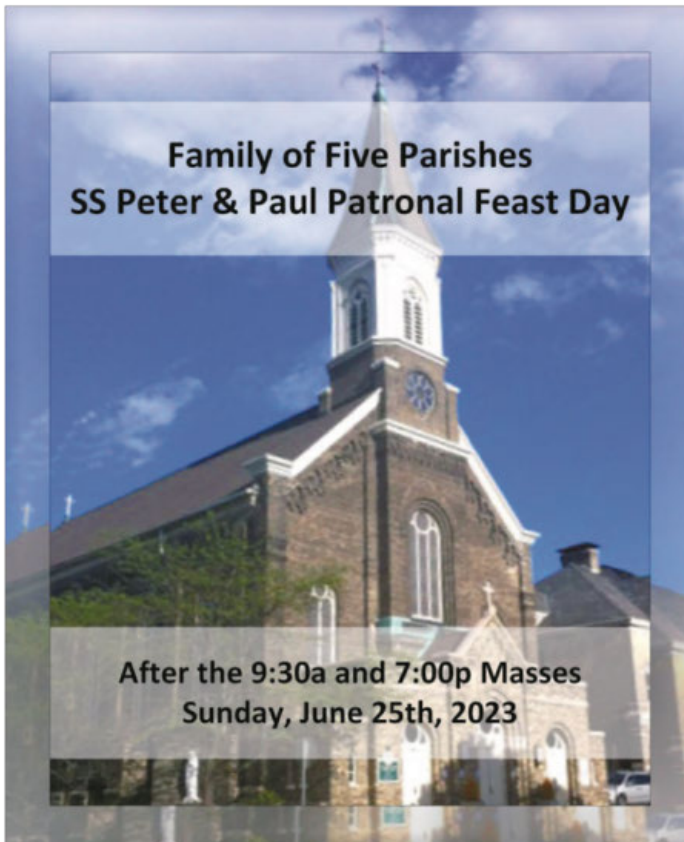

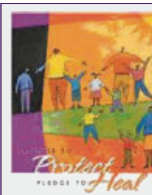

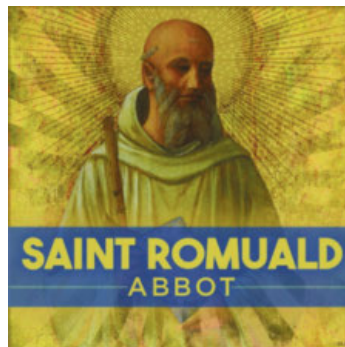
