"Being the manager for the Open Door Cafe is not like any job I've had before. It's not a job at all. It's a living, breathing family. The guests, the volunteers and the staff are all my new family. Without any of these three key components this ministry would not exist. I appreciate all of you and thank you for this blessing and for your support."

The Open Door Café is the predominant outreach program of the Cathedral of St. John the Evangelist. The mission of the Open Door Café states in part, "empowered by the life and teachings of Jesus Christ, we recognize Christ in all our guests, volunteers, and staff." Beyond meeting the needs of hunger, the Café strives to meet the needs of the whole individual. We offer a nutritious lunch in a safe environment to all those who show up at our door.
