Never Underestimate the Ministry of Presence

One of the most basic concepts that I learned in pastoral care is the ministry of presence. When faced with an individual in crisis, ministers are often tempted to fill the aching silence with answers, sympathy, or assurances that things will turn out all right. Yet, many times, the best thing one can do is simply be with the person. Show up. Sit there. Be in the room with that individual. Listen. Use less words. Give silent affirmation that they are not alone. This is the ministry of presence.

Several years ago, a dear friend of mine lost her son unexpectedly. We hadn't seen each other in many years, and we were now separated by ten states. The funeral was scheduled, and I paused. Should I book a flight, take off work, and put other obligations on hold to attend this funeral? The answer was "yes," but the distance and life stage I was in made me question it, embarrassed as I am to admit it.

I made the right decision; I went to the funeral. Seeing the familiar faces of her family and friends instantly proved to me that it was the right decision. We wept together, reflected together, and in our grief, we didn't feel so alone. This was the net result of showing up with my body, not a condolence card.

The generosity of many parishioners and external members is vital to our daily operations. Without their support, Open Door could not persist. In addition to offering midday meals six days a week, services extend to hosting Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners with gifts, providing hygiene kits, clothing, bus tickets, and more.

For volunteers, Open Door is not merely about lending a hand; it is a place to connect with others who share our values, regardless of origin or faith. This program deeply impacts lives by uniting people for a common cause.

Love Thy Neighbor

In recognition of Women's History Month in March, we recall the history of women voting rights in the U.S. The 19th Constitutional Amendment granted women the right to vote in 1920. What did this mean for Black women? It depended – some could vote, but many states passed laws that discriminated against Blacks and denied them the vote. It was not until the Voting Rights Act of 1965 that racial discrimination in voting practices was banned.

Almost 60 years later, voting rights of women within the Catholic Church also underwent an historic change within the "Synod on Synodality" (2021-24), when the 364 voting members included 54 women for the first time. This group included lay and religious women, two of whom were appointed to leadership positions, and some were women of color. A "synod" is a Vatican advisory assembly of church leaders from all over the world. It had previously been exclusively attended by religious men. The inclusion of women more fully embodies the Greek roots of the word "synod," which are "journeying together."

"What unites us is greater than what divides us. For in common we have 'one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all, who is over all, among all and in all.' (Eph. 4:5-6)" – USCCB, A Synodal Church in Mission, Synthesis Report, 2023

La Tavolata di San Giuseppe The Saint Joseph Table Sunday, March 17, 2024

The Christian Women Society invites you to experience this Italian tradition through which Three Holy Women Parish honors St. Joseph. The intent of this communal celebration is to help those in need.

Legend tells us that during a time of drought and famine in Sicily, people prayed to St. Joseph for his intercession. When the rains came, crops were planted, and people were able to rise up and thrive again. From their crops, they prepared a grand fest and with their neighbors in need, they feasted together in thanksgiving to St. Joseph.

In keeping with this Italian tradition, the parish prepares a table, a display of food and faith, celebrating St. Joseph near his feast day. Occurring during Lent, this beautifully adorned table is filled with donated **meatless** dishes, traditional foods, sculpted breads, and sweets. After a blessing, the food is sold to attendees.

Participants receive a complimentary bread roll and a bowl of pasta con sarde, a favorite Lenten pasta with fish sauce (also served without the fish sauce.) A specially prepared cake is cut and shared with those present.

There will also be a raffle, with a wonderful variety of prizes, including restaurant certificates, tickets to events, gift baskets, and cash prizes! Proceeds from the food sales, raffle, and free will offerings are donated to the parish's social justice ministry and other organizations or projects in the community that provide services to people needing help. Admission is free.
