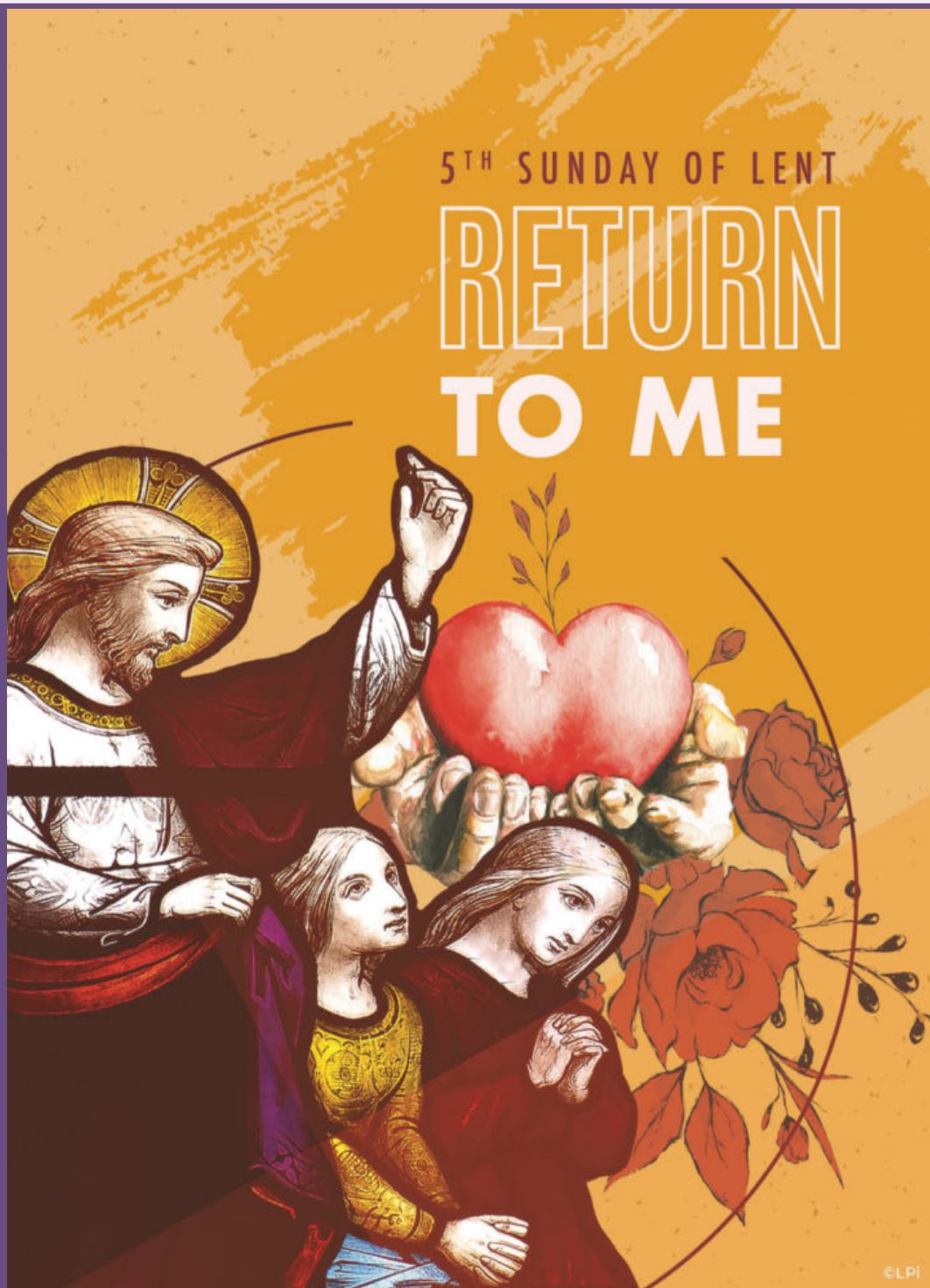

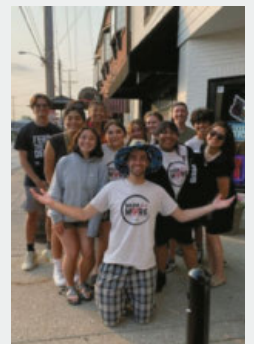


High School Mission Trip!

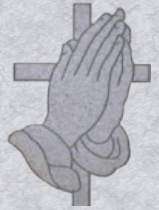

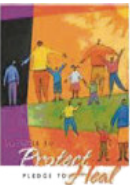
