Dear friends,

We begin Holy Week with the celebration of Palm Sunday today.

As the Lord enters Jerusalem, he prepares to face all that is dark about us and this world: cruelty, deep institutional injustice that victimizes, denial of friends, betrayal, excruciating pain on the cross, etc.

God reaches these places of suffering to transform them. If the light of the world, Jesus Christ, visits the depths of human darkness, darkness loses its power and is not as dark anymore.

At times, we face difficult challenges. Yet as Christians, we believe and know that we are not alone in doing so: Christ is there with us. He knows what it feels like to be in deep pain.

We also begin to live the mysteries of Holy Week with much anticipated joy: we know how it all ends. As Christians, we proclaim Christ's victory over death as the definitive trait of our faith, a conviction that changes our perspective on life itself. It does not matter how dark it gets at times, we are loved through thick and thin by the One who assures us, "I am with you always until the end of the world" (Matthew 28:20.)

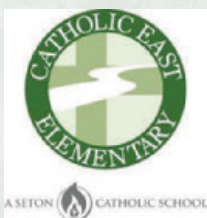

There are so many take-aways from volunteering at the Café for six years. Here are two of them:

#1. We all have the same human needs.

We want to be treated with dignity and respect.
We want to be seen as having value.

One day while we were serving at the Café, we introduced ourselves to a guest we had seen a few times. Not all guests socialize easily with others. We asked if he would like to share his name with us so we could call him by his name when we saw him again. Tears welled in his eyes. He told us that his name is David and that no one had called him by his name in a very long time.

Many of the guests feel invisible. Interactions at the Café can change that. Working in the Café, you will routinely hear staff and volunteers asking guests' names and calling them by name from week to week. The guests seem so excited by it initially. It becomes routine over the weeks and months. It is such a simple thing, but so invaluable.



#2. Just our circumstances are different.

Just like we are all human beings, we all have our stuff.
We all have things to complain about, things that hurt.

As children and adults alike, we value campfires because they bring together family and friends with great times, laughter, s'mores, etc. While serving at the Café on a frigid January day recently, we detected a pungent aroma, smelling like a campfire.

We were surprised and wondered where it was coming from. As a group of guests moved around the serving line, an individual huddled in a blanket ended up standing in front of us. It was obvious because of the pungent odor that he was the source of the smell. As he moved away, we looked at each other and realized that it meant that he had spent the freezing cold night, outside, huddled in his blanket, in front of a fire. It is safe to say, any thoughts of campfires in the future will remind us of the experience with this gentleman.

No matter what our situation, when we serve the guests at the café, we leave realizing that there are challenges that people face that are far greater than ours.

"Every year, we read the Passion...because it happens still. Abandonment, betrayal, injustice, denial, voicelessness, violence, abusive speech and disrespect for the sacredness of life are the very evils which extend the suffering of Christ to our day and time.

And so, we will continue to proclaim the Passion until we are so moved by its power and poignant message to transform our world." (Bishop Jeffrey Haines)

This quote from Bishop Jeff came in response to the question: "Why do we read the passion story every year on this Sunday before Easter?" Each of us is invited to find our own story within this story of Christ's self-emptying love. Each of us is invited to encounter this divine love which is poured out for us so that we might receive that love and allow it to transform us so that we might share it with the world.

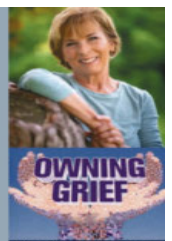

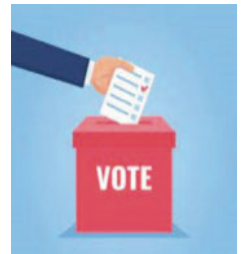

In an era when voting rights are making the news on a regular basis, fewer Americans take advantage of this right and privilege, as evidenced by data from the Milwaukee Elections Commission noting that about 31,000 votes out of about 270,000 registered voters (under 12%) were cast in the 2024 Spring Primaries.



We, as Catholics, have a special obligation to participate in elections, as stated by the USCCB "responsible citizenship is a virtue, and participation in political life is a moral obligation."

We are called by our Baptism to participate in the process by voting with an informed conscience, and to base our decisions on one thing: a desire to serve God and neighbor in co-responsibility for the common good. The right to vote comes with a duty to vote, and to do so in the most informed way possible.

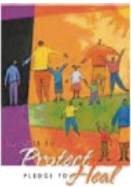

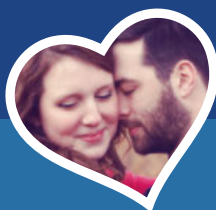
