

Divine Mercy Sunday

"Be kind to one another, compassionate, and mutually forgiving, just as God has forgiven you in Christ. Be imitators of God as his dear children. Follow the way of love, even as Christ loved you. He gave himself for us as an offering to God, a gift of pleasing fragrance."

(Ephesians 4:32-5:2)

Happy Easter, everyone! Like a party that doesn't end for fifty days, we continue to marvel at the love of God which transforms death into life, despair into hope, limited into possibility.

The last line of this quote from St. Paul reminds us that the stench of violence and death, which summarizes Good Friday, can never defeat what our tradition calls "the odor of sanctity." It is the pleasing fragrance of a life lived in virtue and the call to permeate the earth with the scent of kindness and mercy.

In our Liturgical rituals this past weekend, we smelled a lot of incense and the beeswax of the Easter Candle. We absorbed the scent of Chrism oil, newly minted by our Archbishop for our use, and then spread around in the baptism and confirmation of our newly-commissioned believers in Jesus. The scents send us to the invigorating fresh air of kindness and sacrificial service to others that far overpowers a stale culture and the staggered wheezes of wasted chances for peace and justice.

We all are called to this, and thanks be to God for new members, who took the chance, like many of us did so long ago, to breath a new air and let our breath be the breath of the Risen Christ, bringing a new fragrance to our world so in need of it!

Emotions and Their Triggers

You've probably noticed that your emotions erupt at the oddest of times and places. Many times, memories pop up unexpectedly, perhaps triggered by something as simple as seeing a favorite breakfast cereal in your grocery store, driving past a particular highway exit, or being seated at the same restaurant table where you and your loved one once shared a meal.

Our Lord created and gifted all of us with emotions. Suppressing them or allowing them to overpower you can harm you physically, mentally, and spiritually. Try not to stifle those feelings. Embrace the joyful memories. Keep them alive and allow God to use them in your healing. Joining a Grief Support Group can help you learn why emotions are healthy. Our group is a safe place to share your feelings and learn ways to cope with all the different emotions.

Support group – Small group discussion about the weekly video content.

Workbook – Journaling and personal study exercises that reinforce the weekly session topics.




