

St. Vincent de Paul – Six Saints Love Story

Our home visits are all different and interesting. My partner and I recently visited Nicole and her fiancé, Adrian. They are in their twenties, young and full of hope for the future. After discussing Nicole and Adrian's household needs, we asked how they were doing personally. We soon realized how much these two were carrying emotionally at such a young age.

Adrian told us that he was trying to find work; how hard it was to acquire a good job. Nicole said that the two of them were struggling with relationship problems. They both were dealing with the recent news of a cousin who was confined to a wheelchair for the rest of his life because of a fight in a bar. It was clear that this couple's material needs were far less important than their spiritual needs.

We gave Nicole and Adrian the small booklet, "Our Daily Bread," as something they could use for daily prayer. After asking them for their prayer requests, we stood in a small circle holding hands and prayed with them. These few moments of quiet visibly moved them and they spoke of joining a church.

As Vincentians, we know that the reason for the home visit is to offer help with household needs, but even more importantly, to offer encouragement, prayer, relationship. I feel that this is our most powerful purpose. Our meeting ended with smiles, hugs and friendship.

Love Thy Neighbor

In honor of Earth Day, we celebrate environmental justice through the eyes of an apostolic exhortation, "Laudate Deum," published by Pope Francis in October 2023, in which the Holy Father states that "our responses (to care for our common home) have not been adequate." He also explains that he chose *Laudate Deum* ("Praise God") as the title "for when human beings claim to take God's place, they become their own worst enemies." In other words, the whole world is held in God's hands.

"Laudate Deum" is addressed "To all people of good will on the climate crisis." What does it mean to be people of good will? Is it individually making active decisions for the common good? Is it shaking up our collective conscience to take a more serious look at the impacts we make on our earthly home? Is it making sacrifices so that the poor and oppressed do not suffer? Please join in praying this prayer offered by the USCCB, which reads in part "We pray, O God, that you may stir in us a reverent awareness of our invisible link with the entire created world."

“The Mother’s Saint”

Gerard Majella (1726-1755) is known today as “The Mothers’ Saint.”

Though it may seem odd that a male religious is a patron saint for mothers, mothers-to-be, and those wanting to become mothers. The origin comes from an incident that happened in the last months of his short life.



Once, as St. Gerard was leaving the home of his friends, one of their daughters called after him because he had forgotten his handkerchief. In a moment of holy insight, he said “Keep it. It will be useful to you some day.” The handkerchief was treasured as a precious gift from Gerard. Years later, the girl who received the handkerchief was in danger of death during childbirth. She remembered the words of Gerard and called for the handkerchief. Almost immediately, the danger passed and she delivered a healthy child.

This wonderful story was the beginning of a devotion to and belief in the miraculous powers of St. Gerard’s intercessions for women who are soon-to-become mothers, long to be mothers or are already mothers.

In the back of Three Holy Women - St. Hedwig Church, we have a **St. Gerard Chapel which is open every Sunday, 15 minutes before the 8:30 Mass begins, and during Three Holy Women Parish Office hours by appointment.** Everyone is welcome to pray in the St. Gerard Chapel for special intentions.




