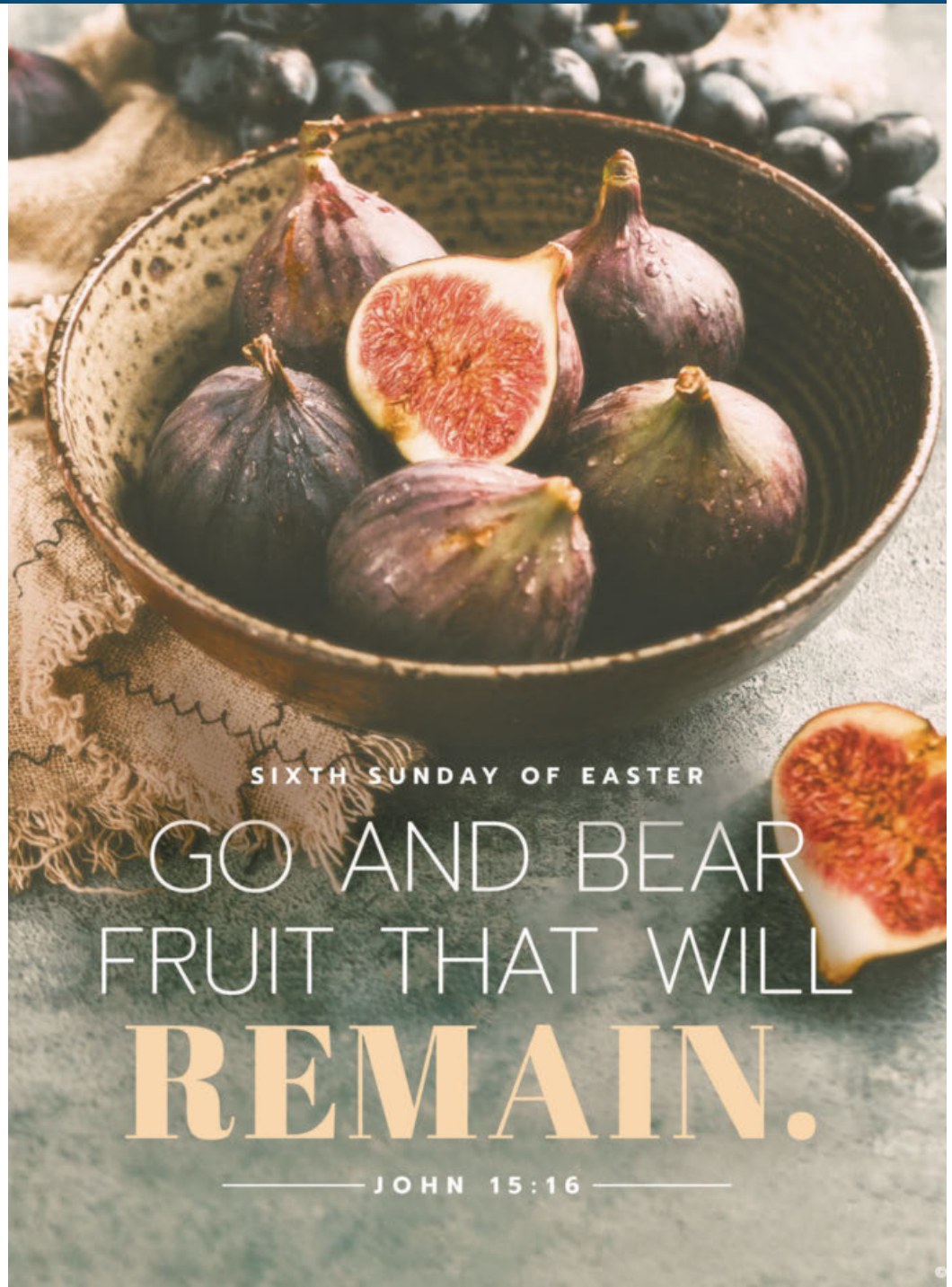

Social Justice and Outreach

Love Thy Neighbor

Catholic tradition designates a devotion for the month of May to Mary, our Blessed Mother. One kind of devotion to Mary that is unfamiliar to some is related to Marian apparitions, which is when Mary supernaturally appears to a person or group of people to convey a particular message. The most famous examples occurred in Lourdes (France), Fatima (Portugal), and Guadalupe (Mexico). Of the tens of thousands of apparitions reported all over the world, only 25 have been approved by local bishops and only 16 of those 25 have been approved by the Vatican.

The most recent of the fully approved apparitions occurred from 1981-1989 in Kibeho, Rwanda, in Africa to three schoolgirls. "Our Lady of Kibeho" warned of terrible suffering in Rwanda, which came about in the Rwandan genocide of nearly 1 million people during 100 days between April-July in 1994.

One of the visionaries spoke of Mary's messages, "The Holy Virgin insisted on the need for prayer... She asked us to obey the Church, to love God in truth, and to love our neighbor in humility and simplicity..."

St. Vincent de Paul Society of Milwaukee

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul is the largest Lay Catholic organization in the world with about one million members and volunteers in 155 countries around the world. As the primary founder and leader of the earliest Conferences, Frederic Ozanam left a very large legacy. In his life he sought "to become better, and to do a little good." Frederic accomplished great things not by setting out to accomplish great things, but by setting out to make himself better by growing closer to Christ and sharing the good news with others. This was his vision for the Society, "a community of faith and works erasing little by little the old divisions" made up of members resolved "to better themselves in order to make others happier."

The Society's purpose is not service delivery, but charity - LOVE. Our success is not measured by the quantity of material things we distribute, but by the quality of the relationships we form. Frederic explained that "at-home assistance is one of the best rendered charities and one that produces the best results." Pope Francis explains that we set aside our own wishes and desires in serving the vulnerable. "Service always looks to their faces, touches their flesh, senses their closeness and even, in some cases, 'suffers' that closeness and tries to help them. We do not serve ideas; we serve people."

Since January of this year we have been able to bring the love of God to families in need by assisting 136 families, providing beds, appliances, bedding and household items. Thank you for your financial and household donations.

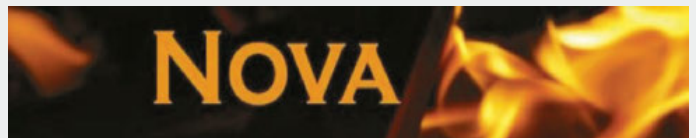
Two Become One Newlywed
