Dear Sisters and Brothers,
 In the first reading for this Sunday, we hear the prophet Elijah make a heartfelt prayer to the Lord when he says, "This is enough, O Lord! Take my life for I am no better than my fathers." The prophet must have been in a very painful place in his life when he uttered this prayer.

How many times have we not found ourselves in a similar place, maybe not praying to God for death but certainly feeling like it has been enough!?

The Good News from the Word of God this weekend is that God hears us when we cry out to him, especially when we pray from a place of struggle. In answer to his prayer, God sent Elijah an angel to encourage him in the journey and to give him the strength to continue walking.

I am certain that God sends angels to us every time he knows the journey is hard for us.

Last week, I came across the story of the current bishop of Lincoln, NE, Bishop James Conley. In his letter, "A Future with Hope," he shares about his own mental health journey and struggles dealing with depression, and how he even had to ask for a leave of absence from his ministry to heal.

Like Elijah the prophet, Bishop Conley came to a point of honesty in his life in which he acknowledged how hard the journey had become. God, of course, listened to his heartfelt prayers by encouraging him to begin a journey of hope.

I invite you to read bishop Conley's letter which can be found on his diocesan website, www.lincolndiocese.org. I also invite us to pay attention to the many angels God sends into our lives every day, in bigger or smaller shapes, to offer us healing and strength for the journey.

Saint Vincent de Paul Love Story

For as long as I can remember, I have always considered it a privilege to act as a conduit for our parishioners' compassion and generosity toward our neighbors in need. Recently, I reflected on our last couple of visits to two young families, and I wanted to share these experiences with you.

Both families we visited were young, with children still in the early stages of their lives. What struck me most was how much I had in common with the mothers of these families. Like me, they disciplined their kids, worried about their well-being, and were deeply interested in reading to them. They provided meals and strove to create a home environment conducive to raising children who are curious about books and thrilled by the simple joy of crayons and coloring books.

Despite the challenges they faced, both moms were pleasant and grateful for our deliveries. They enjoyed their children and worked hard to maintain a sense of normalcy for their kids. One of the moms had a particularly poignant story. She had grown up in foster care and was taken care of by an abusive aunt. Yet, she exuded confidence and an unwavering love for her children. She was determined to make a difference in their lives. By asking for help from St. Vincent de Paul, she hoped to create a sense of equality and normalcy for her children that she never had.

However, what was painfully obvious in these homes was the lack of basic necessities, such as beds. One of the homes was in a state of disrepair, with an oven that smoked when turned on high. The mom had alerted the landlord, but he remained unresponsive. We offered some resources that could help her address these issues, hoping to make a small but significant difference in their lives.

In another visit, we met a mom of a 14-year-old daughter. As mothers raising children, we had much in common. However, this mom faced the additional challenge of raising her daughter in a neighborhood that made it difficult to keep her safe and find activities to occupy her summer. They had grown accustomed to sleeping on the floor, a stark reminder of the challenges they faced daily.

Through these visits, I was reminded of the resilience and strength of these mothers. Despite their circumstances, they continued to strive for a better life for their children, showing an incredible amount of love and dedication. It reinforced my belief in the importance of our work and the impact we can have by extending a helping hand to those in need.

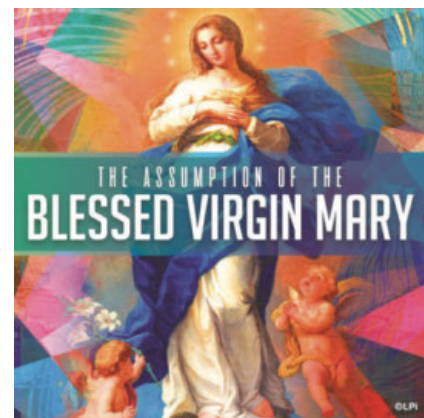

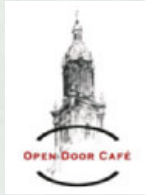

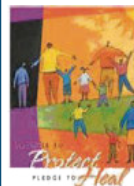
