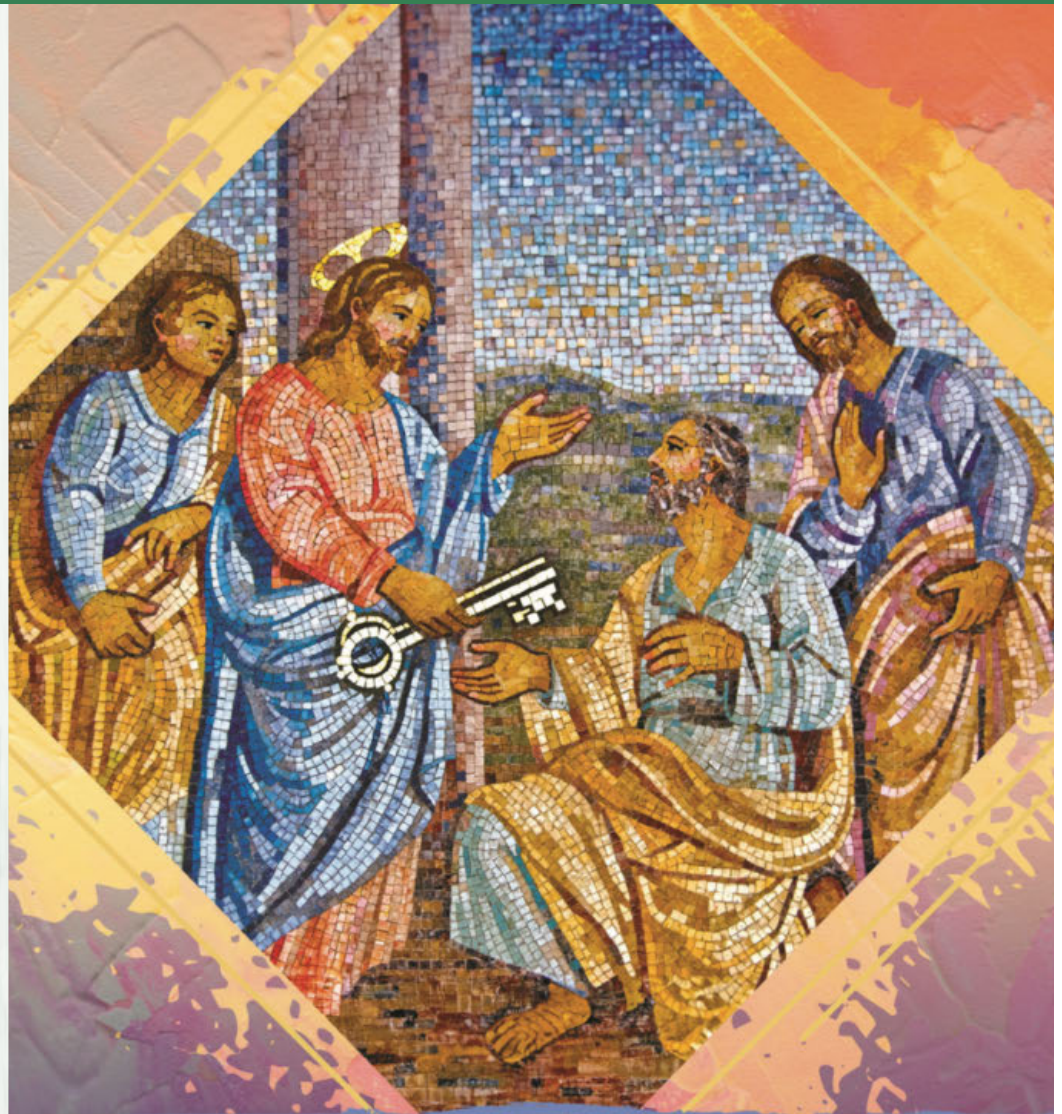

Outreach

Six Saints Saint Vincent de Paul

One of the central tenets of Vincentian spirituality is trust in Divine Providence. We are called to trust that God will provide what is needed for things to work out for the best. This sounds quite simple because we know that God is good and that HE loves us. In practice, though, we slowly come to realize that our trust is needed not because of what we know, but because of what we do not know.

Every Vincentian Conference has a story about a time when, just as they offered assistance when funds were low, an entirely unexpected donation arrives. It happens often enough that we can hardly call it "unexpected" anymore. These stories offer reassurance for our trust in Providence. God, after all, has so often provided what is needed 'to do our works of charity'. As a Conference this is our biggest worry especially as our number of families requesting help increases. However, we are called to trust not only that God will provide what is needed, but that he alone knows the best way for things to work out.

In July, we helped twenty-eight families, provided forty-four beds and nine appliances. Many of our families in the last months needed many household items due to a fire, coming out of a shelter, or leaving a domestic violence situation with little besides clothing. We were also able to provide baby items to six families, providing Pack and Plays, diapers, strollers and other baby items.

We are always in need of sheets and blankets, because when we give a bed we provide a set of sheets, a blanket and a pillow. 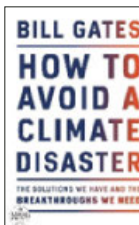

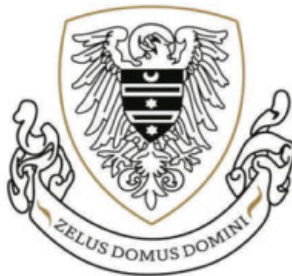

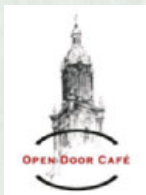
